A very busy couple of months in the Bar Billiards calendar has seen Berkshire crowned the new county champions for the first time since 1996. We had the All England singles played in October where Paul Sainsbury added to his county team's success by winning his 3rd All England Individual title. Pauline Withey won her 3rd All England ladies title in a very competitive tournament and cemented her position as the ladies number one. In the open rankings Nigel Senior took over the number one spot after the winning the Berkshire Open. Kevin Tunstall finished October strongly with his 4th title of the year by taking the Alternative Rules but was unable to wrestle the number 1 position from Nigel but is now just 1.3 points behind. Phil Collins is close as ever to these two now 28.0 points behind Nigel and a repeat of his 2009 exploits in Jersey could see him number 1 at the end of the year. Speaking of Jersey, if you play bar billiards and have never been, you really must give it a go one day—it's a great weekend. See you in Jersey!

# County Champs @ Post Office Club, Reading, 19th Sept/17th Oct 2010



Berkshire A (pictured left) won the county championship title—it has been the first time since 1996 they have won the title. Tony Walsh, Paul Sainsbury, Bernie McCluskey and Phil Hawkins were present in both the 1996 and 2010 winning sides. Berkshire won all 4 matches and started with an impressive 5-2 win over Sussex A. They followed that with a 4-3 win over Oxon



A. 4-3 and 5-2 wins over **Hampshire** and **Kent** A respectively was enough to seal the title. **Tony Walsh** was unbeaten along with Sussex's **Kevin Tunstall** who also had the days high break of **16,840**. **Oxon** B (**pictured right**) gained promotion in Division 1 by pipping **Surrey** A to the Division 2 title, Oxon B crucially beat Surrey A 5-2 when they matched up and they won all their matches to win by 1 leg. Three Oxon B players went unbeaten, **Terry Cook, Geoff Powell** and **Kevin Godfrey** and they were joined by **Geoff Jukes** and **Gary Powell** who were unbeaten for Surrey A. # All England Individuals @ Post Office Club, Reading, 3rd October 2010

Paul Sainsbury (pictured right) won his 3rd All England title adding to his 1986 & 1999 wins. He joins Kevin Tunstall (7 wins), Bernie McCluskey (4), John Burrows (3) as the only other 3 time winners since the tournament started in 1975. Paul was the only former winner present and he was drawn into the group of 5 county champions. A loss to Northants Simon Coleman was not an ideal start, but Paul scored heavily and beat Curt Driver, Cliff Slade and Phil Buckle and with other results going his way he ensured his passage to the final. Surrey's Gary Powell joined him there with 3 wins out of 3 in the group of 4 with wins over Barry Radford, Mick Jones and Richard Wooton. In the final, Paul led by 3,600 with his break



to come and although Gary had chances in the 2nd leg the table was tricky and he was unable to overcome the deficit and Paul sealed his 3rd crown.

Kevin Tunstall has won his 7th Alternative Rules title—his 5th under the current "triangle" format. Kevin beat Oxon's Mark Trafford in the final. Kevin also overcome ranking rival Nigel Senior in a close semi final. 49 players turned out for the unique event where 6 white balls are placed in a triangle at the back of the table to start the game. Everytime the balls are cleared the triangle is reformed. This results on lower scores than we usually see - Curt Driver made the day's highest break of 1,850, the high



ladies break was made by Chris Toner with 1,060. The plate was won by **Steven Sheard** who beat **Tony Woolvin** in the final.
