Over 50's and Over 60's @ PO Club, Reading, 24th July 2011

The Over 50's and 60's competitions were decided concurrently at the Reading PO Club in July. It has to be said a slightly disappointing turnout of 16 over 50's and

12 over 60's started the competitions. **Tony Martin** (pictured right) completed the double for the first time. It is his 2nd over 50's title and 4th over 60's win.

In the over 50's he beat **Pauline Withey** and **Keith**

Lewendon, before overcoming a 12k deficit to beat **Phil Hawkins** in the semi final. In the final he met 2008 runner up **Ian Lelliott** who beat **Chris Plant**, **Bill Kerr** and **Dave Ingram** to get there. Tony ran out a **16,460—6,010** winner and Ian had to console himself with the high break of **12,960**.

With low entries there was time to run a plate competition which was won by **Gerry Fitzjohn** who beat **Dave Tooke** in the final.

In the over 60's Tony beat **Keith Lewendon** and **Geoff Powell** to meet **Phil Hawkins** for the 2nd time that day in the final. It was another close game between the two with Tony winning **15,940** – **15,160**. Tony also made the high break of **17,780**.

We have had two opens in the last two months. Kevin Tunstall cemented his number 1 position with his 4th win this year in the Bucks Open. He failed however, to improve on his own record of individual matches won in a row when he lost in the 3rd round of the Kent Classic, fittingly to Steven Sheard, who Kevin beat in the Surrey and Sussex Open finals already this year. Kevin had just equaled his record of 21 match wins in a row and must have felt good with a 22,350 break in leg 1 against Steven. Steven came back with an amazing 23,240 to win the match and end Kevin's win run. In this newsletter I have had a look at some of the great matches in opens and looked at where this match compares as it was undoubtedly one of the finest matches seen at any open. Kevin's defeat did open the door for Tony Woolvin to win his



Kent Classic @ Six in One Club, Tonbridge, 10th July 2011

biggest title (he did win the 2004 Alternative Rules) - this win being well overdue for a

terrific yet sometimes under rated player—well done Tony!

Tony Woolvin (pictured right) won his biggest title to date with victory in the Kent Classic held in Tonbridge. He had win the 2004 Alternative Rules but this is easily his biggest win. He has had a few near misses in opens before—2 finals plus a All England Singles runner up in 1998 to John Burrows. Tony made swift progress to the quarter finals knocking out both Clive and Margo Thompson on the way. A big win over Hampshire team mate Barry Radford set up a semi final clash against (Mr) Chris Newson. Chris was still hampered by injury and made an amazing effort to make the semis (beating in form Steven Sheard in the quarters). This was a match too far for Chris and Tony won comfortably to set up a final against Northant's Lorin Clough. Lorin opened with 9,020, but Tony



This was Lorin's first appearance in a open final, his highlights being a win over British number 2 **Nigel Senior** in the quarter finals and then **Martin Smith** in the semi final. Martin, a very much improved player of late, did take a massive win in Round 3 against British number 6 **Curt Driver** coming back from 17,460 down with a 17,840 break.

The plate was won by **Richard Wooton** beating **Ian Gordon** in the final. Ian looked set to win after being 5k down form leg 1, he lost a 10k break in leg 2 all but handing the title to Richard. In a day of high scores, with the tables being exceptional, there were four 20k breaks, the highest being **Nigel Senior's 23,750** effort in round 4. The highest Ladies break was **7,640** by **Pauline Withey** in a round 1 match she unfortunately lost to **Mark Trafford**.

Under 25's, 24th July 2011

Martin Cole (pictured right) retained the Under 25's title. Martin beat Cambridgeshire's Johnny George (the first Cambrigde player in a national final since Peter Rich won the AE off the spot in 1983!) It was a close final but a 7,560 break by Martin helped him win 10,360—9,400.



11 players entered and were split into 3 groups and the top 8 went through to the quarter finals. **Mel Standbridge** had a great day making the semi finals losing out to Martin. **Craig Mace** was the other losing semi finalist, but consoled himself with the days high break making **13,980**.

Bucks Open @ Riseborough Golf Club, 7th August 2011

The lovely setting of the Riseborough Golf Club was the scene of world champion **Kevin Tunstall's** (pictured right) fourth national open title win this year. Kevin was not troubled on his way to the quarter finals, where he met **Ian Lelliott**. Ian has a good record against Kevin, but he lost his opening break which ultimately proved costly. Kevin beat ex pairs partner **Tony Martin** in the semi final, to meet team mate **Rick Dewdney** in the final. Kev lead by 2k after leg 1, but scored 17k in the 2nd leg to seal a comfortable win.



Ricky was playing in his first final, and has been in good form this year after reaching the Oxon Open semis. He had arguably a tougher route than Kevin, as he had great wins over **Paul Sainsbury**, **Ernie Jordan** and then **Keith Sheard** in the semi final.

The plate was won by Gerry Fitzjohn beating Maurice Izzard in the final. Kevin Tunstall also took the high break with the days only 20k break with 20,340 in round 4. Pauline Withey made a 4.160 for the highest ladies break.

Greatest matches in National Tournaments

The 3rd Round of this years Kent Classic saw an incredible match between **Kevin Tunstall** and **Steven Sheard**. Kevin was attempting to win a record 22nd consecutive match in national tournaments and opened with **22,350**. Steven came back with a magnificent **23,240**. I have had a look back at matches where both players contributed a **21k score**.
