<u>British Pairs @ Queens Hotel, Bournemouth, 7th/8th March 2009</u> 2009

The first weekend in March always sees the bar billiards community travel to Bourne-mouth for the British Pairs. 67 pairs entered this years event, and **Chris Reeves & Nigel Senior** (pictured below) won the pairs for the first time. They came through a tough section—beating team mates **Richard Wooton & Gareth Lloyd** in the 1st Round, **Keith Sheard & Mark Trafford** in the quarter finals and **Kevin Tunstall & Kevin Hall** in a very tight 4 leg semi final. The final was a bit more one sided with Reeves & Senior amass-

ing a 31k lead after 3 legs against **Dennis Atkins** (Oxon) & Geoff Jukes (Surrey).

Last years runners up Maxi McDonnell & Paul Lawson won the plate beating Richard Wooton & Gareth Lloyd. Phil Collins made the highest break of 21,360, Nigel Senior also made three 20k breaks of his own. Joyce Mannell made the ladies high break of 4,880.

Portsmouth Open @ Moneyfields S&S Club, 19th April 2009

Kevin Tunstall (pictured right) won his 6th Portsmouth Open overcoming Sussex's Dave Ingram in the final. It is a bit of a milestone for Kevin as it is his 50th individual national title (John Burrows being next up on 15). Kevin beat England teammates Gareth Lloyd, Jim Millward and Geoff Jukes before meeting Dave in his first final. **Dave Ingram** had a great run to add to his Oxon Open quarter final success with a win over Kent's Mark Brewster in the semi final being the highlight.



Lady player Chris Toner also had a great day reaching the quarter finals before losing to Dave but was the furthest lady. She also made the high ladies break of 4,030. Her other half Chris Newson won the plate from Sussex player Peter Edwards. Steven Sheard made a 20,230 break to secure the highest break prize. Upcoming Events in May & June

3rd May - Guernsey Open - The 2nd Guernsey Open sponsored by Hamilton Trustees will take place at the Peninsula Hotel, Sunday 3rd May. Nigel Senior will be defending the title he captured last year defeating current World Champ Trevor Gallienne in the final.

10th May - 1st Surrey Open - A week after Guernsey we go to Surrey for a welcome addition to the Open circuit. The venue is St Nicholas' School, Merstham. Well done to the Redhill League for getting this off the ground.

6th June - England v Guernsey - The night before the Sussex Open, England take on Guernsey at the Roffey Club, Horsham. England have won all 4 matches since the first in 2005, 40-12 being the result last year in Guernsey and will be looking to get back on the winning trail after the loss to Jersey in February.

7th June - Sussex Open - The 16th Sussex Open finds a new home at the Roffey Club, Horsham. The new venue has not deterred entries with the competition already over subscribed and the organisers trying to accommodate 108 entries. An emotional Gary Johnson won last year dedicating his victory to the much missed Ray Sturgess.
