## British Pairs @ Queens Hotel, Bournemouth, 10th/11th March 2012

The first weekend in March always sees the bar billiards community travel to Bournemouth for the British Pairs. 54 pairs entered this years event, and the 2009 World Pairs Champions **Phil Collins & Leon Beer** (pictured right) won the British pairs together for the first time. The final was against last years runners-up Oxon's **Tony Willis & Jon Bamsey**. The first two legs were shared with Tony & Jon leading by 15,590—10,810, but in leg 3 Phil pulled out the tournaments highest break of **20,340**, to leave a 15,560 target for Tony. Although Tony started well he broke down to consign him and Jon to their 3rd runnersup spot in this tournament.

Phil & Leon were not troubled in the first 3 rounds on the Saturday, and started Sunday with a comfortable win over Ernie Jordan & Terry Isard. A 3-1 win over **Kevin Tunstall & Kevin Hall** booked their place in the final. Jon & Tony's highlight was a quarter final win over 2003 & 2004 winners **Bernie McCluskey and Paul** 



Sainsbury, followed by a 24,730-22,420 semi final win over Dave Alder & Terry Alder.

In the plate Nigel Senior & Gareth Lloyd beat the 2003 runners-up, Buck's Andy Haines & Dino Clark.

#### European Bar Billiards

Different versions of the game can be found across Europe. Italian bar billiards (pictured right)



seems to have just 2 pegs and 4 holes.



Swiss bar billiards (pictured left) has the 2 wide holes set nearest the table and only 3 holes instead

of the usual 5 at the back.

Slovakian bar billiards (pictured below) has a different arrangement with the hole a the back being 10-20-100-20-10, with the wide holes

being worth 50 and the middle hole being 200. Only 2 pegs though!

## Virtual Bar Billiards

Bar Billiards has appeared in digital form. The first was on the ZX Spectrum 16K in the 1983 release entitled "**Bar Billiards**" (pictured right).



Many years later bar billiards reappeared on the Xbox and Playstation2 in the "World Championship 2005" (pictured left) game by SEGA. It was bar billiards

but not quite as we know it! There are a couple of online games, one based on the comedy **Two Pints of Lager and a packet of Crisps**—sort of a mix between crazy golf and bar billiards and another called "Blast Bar Billiards" which you have to avoid the bombs!

The best version of our game (pictured right) has to be the one written by one of our own—bar billiards player **Martin Leach**. It is the most playable and realistic—and you can play either 3 or 4 pin. It is downloadable for free at http:// barbilliards.awardspace.com/index.html. My best is **15,360** in a 10 minute game beat that!

#### British Ladies, Salfords Club near Horley, 15th April 2012

Pauline Withey (pictured right) won the British Ladies title for the 4th time, to put her one behind the record held by Sue Mariner. She beat Sussex's and reigning champion Sandra Race in the final by a score of 10,650-5,890. Pauline took out 2 time winner Bella Stoner in round 2, then Oxon teammate Jenny Florey, followed by a win over Colleen Park in the semi final. Sandra beat the future mother in law and 2009 champ, Lorraine Hall, in a repeat of last years final at the quarter final stage. In the semi final she beat Surrey's Debz Pearce. Sandra also took the highest break with a terrific 10,550 in round 2. In a family encounter Genette Nicholls beat Sho Nicholls in the plate final.

This interesting question was asked on the Bar Billiards forum by Clive Thompson. Below is what he has unearthed as the leagues that are currently still going with estimates of teams and players.

- 1. Reading (Berkshire) 11 teams/75 players
- 2. High Wycombe (Bucks) 8 teams/40 players
- 3. Cambridge (Cambs) 8 teams/40 players
- 4. Porstmouth (Hants) 11 teams/74 players
- 5. Dover & Deal (Kent) 11 teams/61 players
- 6. Medway (Kent) 10 teams/55 players
- 7. Maidstone (Kent) 4 teams/24 players
- 8. Tunbridge Wells (Kent) 6 teams/36 players
- 9. Northampton (Northants) 10 teams/50 players
- 10. Eynsham (Oxon) 6 teams/30 players
- 11. Wallingford (Oxon) 8 teams/55 players
- 12. Witney (Oxon) 8 teams/55 players
- 13. Oxford (Oxon) 13 teams/105 players

There are also three 4 pin leagues that are active that we know of—Norwich (Norfolk) 5 teams (30 players), Wellingborough (Northants) 8 teams (50 players) and Sudbury (Suffolk) 13 teams (100 players). Some findings from this is that there are 250+ teams in the UK, and at least 1,500 active players (some players play more than 1 league).

Leagues that have disappeared over the years include—Crawley (Sussex), Portslade (Sussex), Newbury (Berks), Wokingham (Berks), Coutry House (Berks), Andover (Hants), Southampton (Hants), Winchester (Hants), Canterbury (Kent), Faversham (Kent). Watford (Herts), Doncaster (South Yorks), Loughborough (Leicestershire), Portishead (Somerset), Pewsey (Wiltshire). Indeed Hertfordshire, Leicestershire, Somerset and Wiltshire used to send county sides to the County Championships. In feat our number I player Kevin Tunetall represented Hertfordshire, when he won
