Over 50's and Over 60's @ PO Club, Reading, 28th Oct 2012

The Over 50's and 60's competitions were decided concurrently at the Reading PO Club in October. The move of date seem to help for a better turnout with 31 over 50's and 21 over 60's. It has to be said the standard was exceptional for an age resticted competition. **Chris Saville** (pictured right) won this title for the



3rd time beating Sussex's **Dave Ingram** in a cracking final. Chris ran the table out for 15,390 in leg 1. Dave broke off 15,230 only to miss leaving Chris to make a decisive 300 to win by just 460.

Chris played some great matches to get to the final. In the quarter he beat reigning champion **Tony Martin** from 9k down, and he was 12k down against **Bill Kerr** in the semi. **Terry Molloy** made the highest break of **16,560** in round 1, before being defeated by Dave Ingram in the quarters. **Dave Constable** was Dave semi final victim.

The over 60's was won the Berks Open champ Ian Lelliott (pictured right) who beat Stuart Florey in the final. Ian made some great breaks including the tournament high break of 19,560 which he needed to



chase down **Tony Martin**'s **17,950**. the other losing semi finalist was **Ernie Jordan** who succumbed to Stuart.

AEBBA Newsletter Editorial

We have come to the end of the bar billiards year and it has again been a great year for bar billiards and the AEBBA would like to congratulate all the winners. The year's highlight was without doubt the World Championships in Jersey, where Kevin Tunstall won his record 5th title.

Kevin also took the Grand Prix title (his 8th) to win his 2nd title of the year and move him to 64 national titles and he is still well clear in the rankings. The titles were shared around though, Phil Collins winning 2 (including his 2nd AE Singles), Keith Sheard won back to back opens in the middle of the year, Steven Sheard broke his run of losing finals by winning the Bucks and Paul Sainsbury won his 10th national title at the Kent. The highlight for me was seeing Ian Lelliott win his first open at the Berks, after 3 previous runner-ups – proof to us all that we should all keep trying. Also Trevor Gallienne won his home open for the first time—after 3 runners-up in that tournament.



The ladies game has been dominated by Pauline Withey, winning 3 of the four ladies events and she is well clear in the rankings. She couldn't complete the clean sweep, however, a resurgence from former Ladies number 1, Jean Brackenridge saw her take the Ladies Grand Prix title. Spare a though for two players who have not quite got over the line nationally—Mark Brewster (7 times a runner-up) and Denise Wills (5 times a runner-up). Both a great players who must surely achieve their goal of becoming a national winner soon.

World Championships @ Merton Hotel, Jersey, 9th/10th/11th Nov 2012

Kevin Tunstall (pictured right) won his 5th title at the World Championships in Jersey to hold the record on his own. It is surprisingly his first title of the year after being runner up in this years Surrey and Kent Opens. Kevin beat **Paul Sainsbury** in the final. It was a great match where Paul was put in first to record 15,440, leaving Kevin time to make just 320. Kevin broke off with 17,620, his only real moment came on about 3k where a whipped 100 split went down the 30. Paul immediately conceded to lose his 2nd final in four years.




146 players entered the tournament and the first round was again played in groups of 4. There were some exciting groups, and the big casualty was 1998 winner **Keith Sheard**, who only won 1 out of 3 matches to make his runner up spot not enough to progress. As last year the 2 eventual finalists both lost a game in

their group matches, but won through as a best runner up. Also there was the first ever 20k break recorded in the World Championships—Phil Collins knocked in an incredible 20,990 against Gareth Lloyd! Many of the top players qualified from the groups and there was a live draw for the last 64. This threw up a some big matches, perhaps the biggest Ian Lelliott v Steve Mariner, with Ian coming out an easy winner. Sunday morning saw the last 32 round played, and one past winner went out here—Graeme Le Monnier and another got a shock—Chris Oakley narrowly losing to Phil Collins 9,320-9,770. By the time the field was whittled down to 16, 9 UK mainland, 6 Jersey, and 1 Guernsey player were left in, with 7 past champions present. Some great matches here—Graham Bisson chased down Ian Lelliott to win 14,520-13,560, Nigel Senior hung on to beat 3 time winner Trevor Gallienne 17,920-10,060, Paul Sainsbury beat Phil Collins 19,310-15,880. Past champions Jim Millward, Kevin Tunstall, Dennis Helleur and

Bernie McCluskey also survived this round. In the quarters only Bob King of the Jersey contingent survived in a repeat of the 2000 final as he knocked out Bernie McCluskey, Kevin Tunstall beat Dennis Helleur, Paul Sainsbury knocked out 4 time champ Jim Millward and Nigel Senior beat Graham Bisson. Bob King was 4k up in his semi against Kevin Tunstall but it wasn't enough, and Nigel Senior couldn't chase down a 12k lead from Paul Sainsbury.

The World Championship Doubles was won by **Richard Wooton & Gareth Lloyd** (pictured right) They beat 2009 champs **Phil Collins & Leon Beer** in what can be best described as a tense final! **Brian Richards** won the plate title beating **Pete Sainsbury**—2 brothers losing 2 finals! There was some Jersey success—**Amber Hopwood** won the junior title beating **Jaz Mariner**.

Jean was 2,770 down after leg 1 of the final but eventually came through 10,570-7,670. Jean also made the high break of 8,960. Grand Prix @ Post Office Club, Reading, 25th Nov 2012

Kevin Tunstall (pictured bottom row 3rd from the left) completed the year in style by winning his 8th Grand Prix title. He beat Phil Collins in a terrific final where Phil broke off with 19,860 and Kevin beat that by 380 with a 20,240 break. Phil did make the days high break of 22,380 (in 16 mins 15 sec!!)

The top 16 performers (pictured right) on the open circuit this year were seeded and placed into 4 groups—winners progressing to the semi finals. Top seed Kevin Tunstall won a tough Group A beating Rich-



ard Wooton (seeded 8), Curt Driver (seeded 9) and Jim Greensted (seeded 16). He could have easily lost two of those games, Jim got the break back and was 17,800 up from leg 1 but missed letting Kevin back in to win by just 40, and Curt broke down on 14k chasing just over 18k. Steven Sheard (seeded 2) & Phil Collins (seeded 3) won Groups B and C unbeaten, Phil hitting an incredible 13,323 per leg in his 3 matches. Group D was won by surprise package Henry Brooks (seeded 13) with wins over Keith Sheard (seeded 4), Paul Sainsbury (seeded 5) and Tom Oliver (seeded 12). Henry was to lose to Kevin in the semi, and Phil beat Steven. Good to see the 2 Guernsey boys Trevor Gallienne and Tom Oliver who qualified.
