The men's International kicked off the bar billiards year in February. It was an incredible match as England won 19-14 over Jersey with no fewer than 6 players making their first appearance against Jersey.

The first open was held in Oxon, it was won by Phil Collins who retained his title beating Keith Sheard in the final.

We have a lot to look forward to in the coming months—in March we have the British Pairs in Bournemouth, which I am sure will be a fantastic weekend as it always is. We also have the 1st East Anglian Open. The big difference here is that we will be playing 4 pin—so the pegs will be in different positions (2 whites in front of the 50, one in front of the 100 and the black in front of the 200). Jersey Men v England Men @ Sarum Hotel, 2nd February 2013

The 32nd meeting between the **England** (pictured right) and **Jersey** Men's teams was held at the Sarum Hotel in Jersey in February.

It is fair to say England didn't have their strongest side due to dropouts and had 6 players making their first appearance against Jersey. Jersey were looking for first win since 2009. Jersey made a good start leading **2-1** then **3-2**, but England showed they had turned up to play by leveling at **4-4** and

then taking a **6-5** lead into the interval. The highlight in the first series were a **12,670** run out by **Nigel Ryall** against **Paul Sainsbury**.

There was still plenty to play for in the 2nd half of the match as the bonus point for the aggregate kicked in. Jersey took control by winning 5 of the next 6 points available to lead 10-7 with **Bob King** and **Fred Jeanne** completing 3-0 wins, **Dave Ingram** taking the aggregate point for England. In series 2, England fought back with **Lorin Clough** and captain **Kevin Tunstall** taking the next 4 points to put England in the lead 11-10. **Chris Saville** and **Nigel Senior** went on in the next series to complete 3-0 wins but Jersey kept themselves in the match as **Nigel Ryall** took a win 3-0 to make the score 15-12 with 3 matches left to play. The task looked tough for Jersey but with around 5 minutes left **Harry Barbet**, **James Jeanne** and **Sean Le Beuvant** looked set to take all 6 points for Jersey. These matches can swing so quickly though, and **Geoff Jukes** got the balls back to take both points off James, Sean Le Beuvant lost a 7k opener to hand the aggregate to **Pete Sainsbury** and finally **Simon Coleman** managed to beat Harry Barbet by 10 points on aggregate with Harry losing a 2k break at the death. So the final score 19-14 to England, but what a close and exciting match!

A few more stats for you—below is a table of how many high break trophies players have won. I have 202 recorded high break trophies won—in some instances the highest break trophy would not be awarded to someone who made the final to share around the prizes but in those cases I have given the nod to the person who made the day's highest break

Keith Sheard unsurprisingly heads this list as he has great scoring power and very often goes for the big breaks. Kevin Tunstall is 2nd and has picked up a lot of these trophies because he is deceptively quick. Another very fast player, Phil Collins is the only other player with over 10 with 15 high breaks. Mark Brewster has 6 high breaks but no national titles. Every player who has 2 break trophies has made a national final, perhaps proving you can't succeed without being able to make big breaks!

Oxfordshire Open @ Didcot Con Club, 9th February 2013

Phil Collins (pictured right) won the first national open of the year by winning the 2013 Oxfordshire Open. Phil retained the title he won last year, and has in fact been involved in the last 4 Oxfordshire Open finals.

Phil started with a win over Nigel Senior, responding to a 16,540 run out with one of his own of 18,420. An incredible 24,110 (highest of the day) break saw him past Tony Willis in round 3. He was 14k down against **Tony Woolvin** in the last 16 but made 17k in reply. Jon Bamsey was his quarter final victim. It must be worth mentioning Jon's game against number 1 Kevin **Tunstall** in the previous round, where he replied with **21,090** to



beat Kevin's **20,990** break by just 100—easily the match of the day! Phil then faced Martin Cole in the semi final. Martin had a golden chance to make his first national final being 7k up and an early miss by Phil gave Martin an opportunity to get the balls back. He didn't and Phil made the final to play Keith Sheard. Keith led by 18,930 going into leg 2 and had a chance when Phil missed early, but again Phil got the balls back first a recorded another 20k+ break to seal the title.

Keith also made good progress to the final with good wins over Ian Lelliott and Paul Sainsbury. He beat Simon Coleman in the semi final, who along with Martin Cole had great runs to be losing semi finalists.

The plate was won by Sussex's Kevin Hall who made a 19,300 break in the final to beat Lorin Clough. His wife Sandra Hall made the highest ladies break with a 3,620 effort. Tables were superb with four 20k breaks and twenty-four 15k breaks. Thanks to Tony Willis and Pete Ewins for organising the day.

Scoring should be much lower than we see in the 3 pin format of the game with pegs in front of the two 50 pockets, 100 pocket and 200 pocket.

14th Apr - Surrey Open - The 5th Surrey Open will take place at St Nicholas School, Merstham. Keith Sheard won the title last year beating England number 1 Kevin Tunstall in the final.

The Indoor League

Bar Billiards biggest appearance on television was on the Indoor League presented by the late Fred Trueman (pictured right) in the 1970's. Pub games were featured, from darts, shove h'penny, bar skittles, cheese skittles, arm wrestling, table football, American pool and bar billiards.





"Taffy" John (the Pontefract school headmaster and reigning Yorkshire television champion) and Malcolm Rider. "Taffy" took the spoils 2,820-1,450, and one of his breaks of 420 was described as `magnificent" - how times have changed!



Volume 2 shows the 1973/74 indoor league season. John Baker (pictured left) from Tunbridge Wells is shown playing against 'Taffy" John in an early match. John knocks out the champion with a final ball down the 200. It seems here that the games are 10 minutes long, and players are limited to 45 second breaks. John makes his way to the final beating Jim Hornibrooke also from

Kent. In the final John plays Peter Wells from Oxon. John makes a 490 break at the end to win the final by a score of 2,400-1,440. Fred interviews John afterwards and has a double take when John says his highest break is 15,000! A cracking couple of DVD's and a great chance to have a nostalgic look at our game.
