Berkshire Open @ Post Office Club, Reading, 8th September 2013

Keith Sheard (pictured far right) won the Berkshire Open beating Mark Trafford (pictured near

right) in the



final. This is Keith's **16th** national title moving to him to 2nd in the all time list on his own. Keith has been unlucky this year reaching 3 finals without winning one. In the final Mark made a 14k opener but Keith ran the table out for **15,170** (despite having some nervous moments!)

In round 1 Keith had a 34k aggregate against Sussex Champ **Stephen Coleman**. He followed that with wins over **Geoff Powell**, **Dave Alder** (with highest break of the day of **22,540**), **Richard Wooton** & **Mark James**. Mark beat **Colleen Park**, **Lee & Barry Radford** and then **Nigel Senior** making **20,180** from **19,410** down.

The reigning champ, **Ian Lelliot** won the plate beating **Chris Saville. Janet Burns** made the high ladies break of **4,100.**

A very busy couple of months in the Bar Billiards calendar has seen **Berkshire A** crowned the new county champions. Not the favourites at the start of the day but they had a lot of experience—which showed, especially from **Bernie McCluskey** who was unbeaten all day to show he is still a great player even though we don't see him much on the circuit these days.

Keith Sheard finally took a title this year—the Berkshire Open. He has lost 3 finals this year and been in great from. It is his 16th title moving him one clear of **John Burrows** into 2nd on the all time list (he needs another 48 to catch Kevin though!!). Keith's son **Steven** hadn't had a great year thus far, but won the All England Singles and the Alternative Rules to make it 6 titles for him (only 10 to catch dad!).

In the ladies game, **Sussex A** won the county champs again. **Dawn Jordan** took her 2nd Special Ladies title (the first being in 2003). And finally **Denise Wills** won her first national title after having had 5 runner-up before. So special well done to her—but to the (much) disappointment of the men present she didn't to carry out her promise of a naked run round the hall when she finally won one!

Berks A won the county championship title—their 2nd win in 4 years and 10th overall. The winning side was Jon Scoones, Dave Alder, Adam Cox. Paul Sainsbury, Bernie McCluskey, Phil Hawkins & Keith Lewendon. Berks A were not favourites before the start, reigning champs Oxon A and Sussex A were expected to be front runners, but Berks A had a lot of experience and also Kent A were dark horses with a strong team present. In series 1 Oxon A started strongly with a



6-1 win over their B side. Sussex A and Kent A started with 4-3 wins over Hants & Berks A respectively. In series 2 Berks A really made their move with a 7-0 win over Oxon B. Sussex A beat Kent A 4-3 and Oxon A held onto 2nd despite losing to Hants 4-3. In series 3 Berks A continued their strong performance with a 5-2 win over Hants. Sussex A stayed 2 points adrift with a very good 5-2 win over Oxon A. Kent A surprisingly lost to Oxon B 4-3 which seemed to put them out of the running. In series 4 Berks A and Sussex A met, the winner of which would have one hand on the trophy. Sussex A started well with wins for Gareth Lloyd & Dave Ingram and when Nigel Senior beat Adam Cox 9,820-9,420 against the break it put them in command 3-1 up. But Berks A hit back and wins from Bernie McCluskey, Phil Hawkins and John Scoones sealing a 4-3 win and a 3 point lead going into the last series.

Denise Wills (pictured right) won the All England Ladies title to finally break her duck by winning her first national final. Denise was certainly emotional after the win, she has had 5 runners up in major finals, but showed great determination to finally come back and win her first.



Five county champions showed up, but it was a strong field with the 3 top ladies in the ranking competing. Carla Jolly (Berkshire) shocked number 1 lady Pauline Withey in the first match and Denise made the perfect start beating Jean

Brackenridge (Sussex) & Janie Macoy (Kent). Jean then beat Pauline to effectively end the defending champs chances. Pauline though did beat Denise to make things interesting in the last series. Denise, Jean and Carla were all tied on 4 points with one match left. Jean beat Janie and when Denise beat

Ladies County Champs @ Post Office Club, Reading, 29th September 2013

Sussex A retained the ladies county championship. It was their 11th win out of the last 13 years. Six teams showed for the event—2 from Sussex & Oxon and one from Berkshire & Surrey. Everyone played everyone, with \mathbf{Berks} and $\mathbf{Sussex} \ \mathbf{B}$ competing for the division 2 title. $\mathbf{Sussex} \ \mathbf{A}$ led from the start with a 3-2 win over their B side. A 5-0 win over Oxon B followed. In series 3 they came up against main rivals Oxon A. A 3-2 win over them put Sussex A 3 points clear of Oxon A with two matches left, with Surrey 5 points behind. In series 4 Sussex A beat Surrey 3-2 to put them out of the running, Oxon A stayed in with a chance with a 3-2 win over Berks. In the last series Sussex A had a disaster—they lost 4-1 to Berks. This opened the door for Oxon A, but Sussex B came to their A side's

rescue with a 3-2 win. This left Sussex A on 15 points 2 clear of Oxon A. Surrey got a 5-0 win in the last series to also finish on 13 points but were classified 3rd after count back. In fact their finishing total of 15 points would have seen them runners up in division 1 only losing on aggregate scores to Sussex A. Sussex B finished 2nd in division 2 and were only 1 point behind Oxon A and Surrey. Berkshire's Carla Jolly was the only player to stay unbeaten recording 5 victories from 5 games. Janet Burns, also from Berkshire, made the high break of 8,810. The winning team for Sussex A were Jean Brackenridge, Bella Stoner, Lorraine Hall, Jan Bithell & Sandra Hall

Steven Sheard (pictured left of table) won his 1st All England title beating Berkshire's Paul Sainsbury (pictured right of table) . Steven convincingly won his group, only Mark Brewster (Kent) came close to beating him missing on 700 down with time left chasing Steven's 19,800 (the days highest break). Paul, who has won this 3 times before, found himself in a shoot out with 7 time champ Kevin Tunstall (Sussex). Paul made no mistake when Kevin broke down on just over 2k. In the final Steven ran out a tricky table for 16,050. Paul was making a great reply but broke down on just over 12k and Steven used time up



to take the title.

Ye Olde Black Horse (pictured left) won AEBBA team champs title. This is mainly the same team that won the title for the Brewery Tap back in 2008. This year there were late drop outs from teams from Berkshire (Caversham WMC -the reigning champs!) and Kent. This meant the 6 teams played a round robin, most legs won being decisive. Ye Olde Black Horse got off to a bad start with a 3-2 loss to the Kennington SC (Oxon), but followed with wins three 4-1 wins over Totteridge CC (Bucks), The Fox (Northants) & South Park CC (Surrey).

Kennington stayed unbeaten but dropped one point behind their Sussex rivals before the last series. If level on points Kennington would be champions but going to the last series Ye Olde
