Guernsey Open @ Peninsula Hotel, 3rd May 2009

The 2nd Guernsey Open sponsored by Hamilton Trustees Limited was held Sunday 3rd May 2009. **Graham Bisson** took the spoils with a win over World Champion **Trevor Gallienne** in the final. Graham's win is even more impressive due to the fact he was quite ill in the lead up to the tournament. He had a great win over England's number 1 Kevin Tunstall in the quarter finals and overcame Sussex's Dave Hampton in the semis.



Trevor Gallienne's loss in the final was his second in a row in the Guernsey Open, but his form has been incredible of late with 2 World Championship wins in the last 2 years. His run included wins over Steven Sheard and last year's winner Nigel Senior. He is also at number 8 in the rankings—incredible for a Channel Island player.

Chris Tupper won the plate from Robert Chapple. Robert's dad, Bob Chapple, took the high break prize with a 13,750 effort. The ladies break went to Jean Brackenridge making 3,330 in round 1. Jim Millward won the Sussex Open held at the Roffey Club, Horsham. Jim,

(pictured right with last years winner Gary Johnson) overcame being very much a part time player nowadays and in his words he is 'too old' to make the big breaks, he hit top form to win this coveted title. Jim beat Phil Collins in the final who was playing superb in what amazingly was only his first open appearance this year.

An incredible **108 players** took part so 12 tables had to be found to complete the day at a reasonable time. Two amazing games worth mentioning was firstly between old



rivals **Keith Sheard** and **Kevin Tunstall**. Keith was asked to play first and was up to 23k+, looking on for over 25k when he missed a ball, scant consolation will be the **21,370** highest break which he did keep in an earlier match. One round later Kevin Tunstall lost to team mate **Kevin Hall** who chased down 18,840 with a 20,080 break. What a time to do your first 20k!

The plate was won by **Pete Sainsbury**, beating **Jean Brackenridge** in the final who did a great job running the event. **Chris Toner** took the high ladies break with a **3,810** effort.
