Over 50's @ PO Club, Reading, 27th Oct 2013

The Over 50's title was decided Reading PO Club in October. **Gerry Fitzjohn** won his first title by beating **Chris Newson**, himself a former winner of this title in 2007. Gerry's win in the final was convincing **16,650-470**.



25 players turned out for the competition and Gerry beat **Bill Kerr** in a close first match **9,520-8,300**. Comfortable wins over **Dave Constable** and **Ros Appleby** followed. He met last years runner up **Dave Ingram** in the semi and beat him after being **13,420** down with a **14,430** score in leg 2. **Chris Newson** beat **Phil Hawkins** and **Jason Wadsworth** before recording a fine win over the current over 60's champion **Ian Lelliott** to make the final.

Over 60's @ PO Club, Reading, 24th Nov 2013

The Over 60's title was won by 2010 runner up **Geoff Pitt** (pictured right). He beat the man he lost to that day, **Tony Martin**, in the final. Geoff was 6k down but made a 13k score to take the title **18,020-10,500**.



There were 12 entries, so the players were split into 4 groups of 3, group winners making the semi finals. Geoff and Tony were both unbeaten in their groups and they were joined by **Chris Saville** and the reigning champ **Ian Lelliott**. Geoff beat Chris **15,630-7,650** and Tony beat Ian after a pegged 8k break by Ian in leg 2. Ian did make the days high break with **14,420**.

AEBBA Newsletter Editorial

We have come to the end of the bar billiards year and it has again been a great year for bar billiards and the AEBBA would like to congratulate all the winners. The year's highlight was without doubt the World Championships in Jersey, where Mark Trafford won his first world title.

Mark won two titles this year and also made two other finals in a real breakthrough year form him and finishes the year 7th in the rankings. Phil Collins has dropped to 8 in the rankings but only because he doesn't play all the events—he was also a double winner this year winning the first (Oxon Open) and last (Grand Prix) events of the year and good luck to him becoming a dad at the end of the year!. Another double winner was Curt Driver who won the 1st 4 pin open and followed that with a Surrey Open win. Steven Sheard was the other player to win 2 titles— the AE Singles and Alternative Rules, although a tough season in open events saw him fail to make the Grand Prix. Other winners were Leon Beer (1st Off the Spot), Paul Sainsbury (retaining the Kent), Keith Sheard (Berks plus 3 runners up), Mark James (Bucks). And lets not 84th ranked forget Stephen Coleman who won the Sussex in an extraordinary tournament. Two players that didn't win this year were current number 1 Kevin Tunstall and provisional number 1 Nigel Senior. Next year the race for the number 1 spot should be exciting the top 8 players below have only 50 points between them on the 2 year list!

In the ladies game Pauline Withey continues to be a long way in front at number 1, but 3 other ladies took titles this year—Denise Wills (AE ladies) Dawn Jordan (Special Ladies) & Jean Brackenridge (Ladies Grand Prix).

World Championships @ Merton Hotel, Jersey, 8th/9th/10th Nov 2013

Mark Trafford (pictured far right) won his 1st World Championships title in Jersey to add to his success in the Guernsey Open earlier this year. Mark beat Nigel Senior (pictured near right) in the final. It was a nervy affair as both players were playing in their first World Championship final (only once in the last 15 years have two non champions have been in the final, that was Phil Collins v Paul Sainsbury in 2009). Nigel broke down on around 500 and Mark made 3k in reply. Nigel got the balls back only to lose a 1k break and Mark made around 6k before Nigel cleared the table to be down 1,680-10,250 after leg 1. Mark broke off with around 3k giving Nigel a small opening but after a further 5 minutes neither could retrieve the balls and it was time for Nigel to concede defeat and shakes Mark's hand.



144 players entered the tournament and the first round was again played in groups of 4. There were some exciting groups, and the big casualties were 2 times winner Bernie McCluskey and 4 times champ Jim Millward. Not surprisingly one of them won the plate! Many of the top players qualified from the groups and there was a live draw for the last 64. This threw up a some big matches (now played Sunday morning), perhaps the biggest was reigning champ Kevin Tunstall v Nigel Ryall (a two time runner up), with Kevin coming out an easy winner. Then the last 32 round was played, and the big shock was the reigning champion went out to Kent's Pete Sainsbury. The 2011 runner-up, Steven Sheard, was another big name to go out against an in form Ian Lelliott. By the time the field was whittled down to 16, 9 UK mainland, 4 Jersey, and 3 Guernsey players were left in (great effort from the Guernsey contingent), with only 3 past champions present. Some great matches here—Kevin Hall beat Keith Vibert with a last ball 200 (both feet were off the ground when it went in!) Harry Barbet hung to beat Ian Champion in a high scoring game 13,110-10,670. Former champs Terry Race & Trevor Gallienne progressed but 1998 champ Keith Sheard went out to Curt Driver at this stage. Into the quarters and there were some cracking games—Mark Trafford beat Terry Race 15,110-13,850 (Terry 13,400 up from leg 1), Ian Lelliott played well to beat Harry Barbet, Nigel Senior set Curt Driver a 17,700 target which was too much for him. The match of the round was Kevin Hall v Trevor Gallienne. Trevor missed early and Key took a 6k lead into leg 2. Key touched up on 4.8k (he admitted to "bottling it" as



it was certainly not safe especially against a man with Trevor's scoring power). Trevor got level with an 11k break only to miss letting Kev in for a memorable clearance (with a swerve round the black peg if I remember rightly!) So no former champs left in the last 4—this is where Kev's run ended, beaten by Mark (perhaps the last two games had been too much for him!) Nigel beat Ian in a good semi final, Ian making a 10k start but Nigel finished leg 1 with 4k and a 13k opener saw him through to the final.

The World Championship Doubles was won by Marc Chipman & Nigel Senior (pictured left) - a consolation for Nigel for losing the singles. They beat first time (2006) champs Trevor Gallienne & Bob Le Moignan in the final. And it was Jim Millward who won the plate title beating Guernsey's Gary Naftal. There was some Jersey success— Tia Hopwood wining the junior title beating Libby

Ladies Grand Prix, 24th Nov 2013

Jean Brackenridge (pictured front row, left) retained her 2nd Ladies Grand Prix title (and winning her 3rd overall) beating arch rival Pauline Withey (pictured front row, right). This is their 7th meeting in a major final, Jean reducing Pauline's overall lead to 4-3 with this win.



It was a close final but Jean always had an advantage and won through 11,240-6,180.

Jean came through her group unbeaten scoring an impressive 7,165 a leg with victories over Michelle Baden (seeded 7), Dawn Jordan (seeded 3) (with days highest break 10,750) and Janet Burns (seeded 6). Pauline lost to AE ladies champ Denise Wills (seeded 8)

Grand Prix @ Post Office Club, Reading, 24th Nov 2013

Phil Collins (pictured top row 3rd from the left) completed the year in style by winning his 2nd Grand Prix title. He beat Curt Driver (pictured bottom row far left) in the final. Curt made 15,290 to start but Phil scored 1,390 to finish leg 1. Phil then went off with 17,530 to make the game safe. Phil also make the days high break of 21,880, in fact Phil was in amazing form (having not seen him for 3 months and knocked in six 17k+ breaks in his 5 matches played.

The top 16 performers (pictured right) on the open circuit this year were seeded and placed into 4 groups—winners progressing to the semi finals. Top seed and new world



champion Mark Trafford could only finish 3rd in Group A. Simon Coleman (seeded 16) won the group by beating Mark and then he beat his son Stephen Coleman (seeded 8) by only 710 points. Pete Sainsbury (seeded 9) then needed to beat Simon by 9,680 to progress. He won but by only 5,960. Group C was tight, England number 1, Kevin Tunstall (seeded 14), looked to be cruising with wins over Mark James (seeded 3) and Leon Beer (seeded 6) but lost to Tony Martin (seeded 11) in his last game. This let in both Leon and Mark, who needed to win but get enough on aggregate. 18k would have been enough for Leon and 21k enough for Mark, Incredibly the match ended 15,250-15,220 to Leon which sent Kevin through. Phil Collins (seeded 7) & Curt Driver (seeded 5) won Groups B and D unbeaten, Phil hitting an incredible 14,333 per leg in his 3 matches. Curt beat Nigel Senior (seeded 4) after they both won their first two games to progress from his group. The semi finals were great games—Curt coming back from 15k down to beat Simon, Phil came back from 14.5k to beat


