





2 Opens have taken place over the last two months and we had 2 new winners. Bob Chapple took his first title in Guernsey, and now joins Trevor Gallienne as Guernsey's only open winners. Richard Wooton won the Sussex Open held in June, to end his long wait for an open win.



So 4 different winners in the four 3 pin events so far this year—and 3 new ones, giving players plenty of encouragement.

Denise Wills won the British Ladies to add to the All England Ladies title she won last year. Now she has broken her duck winning national titles has become a bit easier for her!

We also had the annual England v Guernsey match—a strong **England** side winning for the 10th time out of 10, with a 47-19 win. But Guernsey should be applauded for keeping this fixture well and truly alive. Also well done to Curt Driver, who made his winning debut as captain, especially after the disappointment of the cancelled Jersey fixture.

Guernsey Pairs & Open @ Les Rocquettes Hotel, 3rd—4th May 2014

Bob Chapple (pictured right) won the 7th Guernsey Open to win his first national title. Bob beat **Bob King** in the final. The final was a fascinating contest with Bob C splitting and Bob K potting to try and take the title. Vital breaks were lost but it was Bob C who made a 7k break during the second leg to seal the title.



Bob Chapple made a good start with wins over Jon Bamsey, Terry Kenny and Geoff Pitt to make the semi finals. There he took on Matt Ogier, another Guernsey player. He

was a convincing winner her scoring 21,120-1,800. Bob King, the 2000 world championship runner-up, beat Dave Carliel before a big win against Paul Sainsbury in round 2. He followed that with wins over 3 Guernsey players-Roy Le Page, Nick Ogier & Ian Champion to make the final. It was a great event for Guernsey players with 3 of the 4 semi finalist. UK mainland players did not fare well-Dave Ingram and Chris Newson the only UK players to make the last 8 and they both went out there. Dave did get the high break however,

Chris Saville won an all Kent plate final with a win over Craig Carlson. Chrissie Newson made the highest ladies break of 1,680.

The day before the pairs was played and we had more local success when Ian Champion & Gary Naftal (pictured right) beat Trevor Gallienne & Barry Osborne in the final. The pairs plate was won by Mark Trafford & Keith Hollis against Dave Ingram & Ian Lelliott.

land (pictured below) match took place. The match was made up of 6 doubles and 12 singles matches.



Sussex Open @ Roffey Club, Horsham, 8th June 2014

Richard Wooton (pictured right) won the his 1st National Open title by winning the Sussex Open at the Roffey Club, Horsham. Richard beat **Curt Driver** in the final. An early mistake by Curt let Richard in for an 8k lead, and a 5k opener took the title.

Richard certainly won the title the hard way. He knocked out the current World Champion, **Mark Trafford**, in round 3 and he followed that with a win over the England number 1, **Kevin Tunstall**. **Mark Brewster** was his quarter final victim setting him up for a clash against **Phil Collins**. Although Richard was 17k up he saw his lead eroded away, but Phil missed only 1k behind and Richard sunk a few balls to just make his way into the final. Phil could console himself with the days high break of **22,700**.



Curt was nearly shocked in round 3 when **Bryan Stevens** had chances to win, but Curt made it through by just **620**. He then beat Guernsey Open champ **Bob Chapple** followed by a win over **Nigel Senior** in the quarter finals. Then he faced up and coming Sussex player **Mike Daw** in the semis defeating him quite comfortably **18,340–2,330**.

In the plate **Keith Sheard** beat **Denise Wills**. Denise made a **10,510** break in the plate, but the highest ladies break award went to **Lorraine Hall** who made **5,660** in the main competition. Lorraine along with **Ros Appleby** were the furthest ladies, both making the last 32.

Other Cue Sports

Most people will have played other cue games than bar billiards. **Snooker** and **Pool** will have been heard of by everyone but there are some more unusual ones played across the world.

Three Cushion Billiards is played across Europe, The object of the game is to <u>carom</u> the <u>cue</u> <u>ball</u> off both <u>object balls</u> and contact the <u>rail cushions</u> at least 3 times before the last object ball. A point is scored for each successful carom. There are some great Youtube clips of the game it's hard, average breaks are around 2 the top break ever is 28.

Five-Pin Billiards— The goal of the game is to earn a required number of points, before one's opponent does, by using one's cue ball to cause the opponent's cue ball to knock over pins. The table (pictured right) is pocketless and heated, and the pins aren't like bar billiards ones as they are just 25mm tall.



Russian Pyramid— Played in countries that made up the former Soviet Union. The goal of the game is to earn a required number of points, either by pocketing any of the 15 white balls or by potting the red cue ball. The tough part here is that

the pockets are only 5mm wider than the balls, so it requires great precision just to pot a ball.
