Berkshire Open @ Berinsfield Club, Oxford, 14th September 2014

Mark Trafford

(pictured far right) won the Berkshire Open beating Dave Ingram in the final. This is Mark's 3rd national title. Both play-



ers had chances in the final but Mark ran out winner 12,780-11,090.

Mark made swift progress to the quarter finals where he comfortably beat Jon Bamsey. He met Gerry Fitzjohn in the semi final where he won a close match **9,620-7,160**. Dave had a close run in round 2 winning by just 380 points from Mike Daw. He would go on to beat Mark Brewster in the quarters and Geoff Mace who was appearing in his first semi final. Dave also made the highest break of 18,700.

The plate was won by Pauline Withey (pictured above) who beat Jenny Florey in an all female final. Dawn Jordan made the high ladies break of 2,140. Michelle Baden was the furthest lady making the last 16.

AEBBA Newsletter Editorial

A very busy couple of months in the Bar Billiards calendar has seen Berkshire A retaining the county championship. Again not the best team on paper but they had a lot of experience—which showed in the end. Surrey were desperately close to winning their first title but fell away at the last.

Mark Trafford continued his fine year as World Champion and he won the Berkshire Open. He also ran it as he stepped in at the last minute and held it at the Berinsfield Club in Oxford, many thanks go to him for doing this to make sure the tournament took place. Kevin Tunstall won the All England Singles for the 8th time and helped his team win the team champs. Nigel Senior took the Alternative Rules title, which gives him the unique achievement of holding both the 4 pin and Alternative Rules titles—the only two tournaments with rules far removed from the normal standard game.

In the ladies game, Sussex A won the county champs again. Pauline Withey took her 8th Special Ladies title. And finally Jean Brackenridge won her 3rd All England Ladies title.

County Champs Div 1 @ Didcot Con Club, 21st Sept 2014

Berks A (pictured right) won the county championship title—their 3rd win in 5 years and 11th overall. The winning side was Terry Vallis, Dave Alder, Adam Cox, Paul Sainsbury,



win over their Hants. Surrey also started well with a great 5-2 win over Oxon A. In series 2 Berks A really made their move with a 5-2 win over Kent A. Sussex A beat Oxon A 5-2 to move in contention and Surrey continued their good start with a 4-3 win over Hants. This shockingly left Oxon A in real danger of relegation as they were bottom at this stage.

In series 3 Berks A slipped up losing 4-3 to Oxon A. Sussex A met Surrey, Surrey coming out on top 4-3 to take the overall lead. Kent A moved into safety beating Hants 5-2. Series 4 would normally be where the alcohol catches up with the Surrey boys but they remained in control with a big 5-2 win over Kent A. Berks A got a crucial win over Sussex A 4-3 to make it a two horse race with one series remaining. The bottom 2 met at this stage and $\mathbf{O}\mathbf{xon}\,\mathbf{A}$ looked like they finally pulled clear to safety with a 5-2 win over Hants. So with one series left, Surrey led Berks A by a point, Sussex A were 3 behind and Hants looked

certain to be relegated 3 points behind Kent A at the bottom. Surrey needed to beat Berks A in the final series to take their first ever county championship. No players won all 5matches, although nine won 4 out of 5. Sussex's Kevin Tunstall had the best average of these with 8.990. Steven Sheard had a 9,292 average winning 3 matches, he also had the best break of 14,520.

(pictured right) won the Special Ladies for the 8th time. Pauline beat Jenny Florey in her



4th Special Ladies final. Pauline made the highest break of the day of 6,280 to take a commanding lead into leg 2 and Jenny never recovered.

Only 8 entries turned out and instead of the usual knockout format the players were drawn into groups of 4. Pauline went through unbeaten in her group but Jenny made harder work of hers as she lost to reigning champ Dawn Jordan in her first match before winning her last 2 to come through on aggregate. Myra Hawkins won the plate against Colleen Park for the two group runners up.

All England Ladies, 21st Sept 2014

Jean Brackenridge (pictured right) won the All England Ladies title for the 3rd time to add to the titles she won in 1983 & 2007. Only five county champions showed up, but it was a strong field. The favourites would be the only previous champions Jean and Pauline Withey (Oxon). They both won their opening matches, but



Anita Blackman (Surrey) beat Pauline to put her in contention. Jean and Anita met in their 3rd match and were both unbeaten, and Jean came back from 5k down to take a vital win. Anita's chances disappeared when she lost her last game to **Carla Jolly** (Berkshire) and Carla made the days high break here of **7,610**. This left Jean to play Pauline in their last game. Jean could afford to lose but not by more than

Ladies County Champs @ Didcot Con Club, 28th September 2014

Sussex A (pictured right) retained the ladies county championship. It was their 12th win out of the last 14 years. Only five teams showed for the event-2 from Sussex & Oxon and one from Berkshire, so sadly only 3 counties represented. Everyone played everyone, 2 leg matches and there was no division 2 this year. Sussex A led from the start with a 9.5-0.5 win over their B side. Oxon A beat Oxon B 7-3, which seemed to make it a 2 horse race from the start as expected. In series 2 Sussex A took their bye, and Oxon A managed a 6-4 win over Berks. In



series 3 Oxon A sat out and Sussex A took a 4.5 point lead with an 8-2 win over Oxon B. In series 4 Sussex A manage a 7-3 win over \mathbf{Berks} , but a great 9-1 win for \mathbf{Oxon} A over \mathbf{Sussex} \mathbf{B} meant they would be 2.5 \mathbf{points} \mathbf{behind} going into

Kevin won his group, winning all 3 matches, Paul Sainsbury (Berkshire) had a big chance against Kevin, 17k up and got let in when KT missed early but failed to capitalise and KT won by just 160 points. Geoff came back after losing his first match to Ray Hussey (Bucks), but won his last 2 matches, and with other results going his way topped the group. In the final Geoff was off early and Kevin took a 12k lead in to leg 2. A 5k opener was enough to take the

title. World champion Mark Trafford (Oxon) had a disappointing day but made the days high break with 18,820.

This is a unique event where 6 white balls are placed in a triangle at the back of the table to start the game. Everytime the balls are cleared the triangle is reformed. A disappointing entry of 28 were split into groups of 4, so 7 progressed plus the best runner up.



Nigel made it through his group with 3 wins and the highest leg average of 2,507 and the days high break of

1,460. Curt Driver, Barry Radford and reigning champ Steven Sheard also made it through with 2k+ averages.

In the quarter finals Nigel beat Tony Webster, and then had a close match against Barry Radford. With the scores close and one ball behind the 10 hole left and one ball in hand, Barry tried to use the 20 pocket to get it, missed, Nigel screwed off the side and both balls went in to win the matchone of them in the 200! Nigel beat Mark Trafford in the final to gain a small revenge for their World Championship final 10 months earlier. The plate was won by Lee Radford against Tony Woolvin,
