AEBBA Newsletter Editorial

We have come to the end of the bar billiards year and it has again been a great year for bar billiards and the AEBBA would like to congratulate all the winners. The year's highlight was without doubt the World Championships in Jersey, where Dave Ingram won his first world title.



Nov/Dec 2014

Dave won two titles this year plus the mixed pairs in a real breakthrough year for him and finishes the year 7th in the rankings. Another double winner was Richard Wooton who won back to back opens with the Sussex and Kent titles. Nigel Senior completed a rather unique double winning the 4 pin open and followed that by winning

the Alternative Rules. Mark Trafford completed a strong year as the World Champion by winning the Berkshire Open and going up to number 3 in the rankings. Phil Collins has dropped to 9 in the rankings but only because he doesn't play all the events but he finished the year by winning the Grand Prix—and in some style. Mark Brewster finally ended his duck by winning the off the spot title, after 7 previous runners up in opens. But it was Kevin Tunstall who ended the year number 1, winning 3 titles the Surrey and Bucks Opens, and the All England Singles for a record 8th time. He came up against inspired players Dave Ingram and Phil Collins in the 2 other big events otherwise it would have been a clean sweep of the major titles. Next year promises to be a close race for the number 1 spot, Kevin Tunstall will start there but Mark Trafford is the provisional number 1 on the 2 vear list. But a good year for Nigel Senior, Curt Driver or Dave Ingram could all see them take the top spot.

In the ladies game Pauline Withey continues to be a long way in front at number 1 and took two titles (Special Ladies & Ladies Grand Prix), and the other 2 top other ladies in the rankings took the other titles this year-Denise Wills (British ladies) & Jean Brackenridge (All England Ladies).

World Championships @ Merton Hotel, Jersey, 7th/8th/9th Nov 2014

Dave Ingram (pictured right at the moment he won) won his 1st World Championships title in Jersey to add to his success in the Oxon Open earlier this year. Dave beat Kevin Tunstall in the final. It was a nervy start to the final as both players had an early opportunity as Kevin missed both balls on his first split and Dave missed on 980 after getting the balls back. Kevin then racked up a big break to lead 15.530–980 at half time. Dave now decided his only option was to solit, even though he had not done this all tournament! But he made a terrific 15.820 break which made him the new World Champion. It rounded off a great year for Dave who won his first open earlier in the year and now he had won the BIG one.



132 players entered the tournament and the first round was again played in groups of 4. There were some exciting groups, and the big casualties were former winner Dennis Helleur and

last years runner up Nigel Senior. Nigel made a mess of his last 2 games after opening with the highest group stage break of 16,710. Many of the top players qualified from the groups and there was a live draw for the last 64. This threw up a some big matches (now played Sunday morning), perhaps the biggest was reigning champ Kevin Tunstall (a five time winner) v Bernie McCluskey (a two time winner), with Kevin coming out on top despite being 7k down after leg 1. Then the last 32 round was played, and the reigning champion Mark Trafford went out to Kent's Gerry Fitzjohn, Gerry coming back from 11k down. Lorraine Hall also went out at this stage but this made her the furthest lady player. By the time the field was whittled down to 16, 13 UK mainland, 2 Jersey, and 1 Guernsey player were left in, with only 3 past champions present. Some great matches here—Dave Ingram beat teammate Tony Jenner by 420 points in a match which was a fitting tribute to their ream mate the late Bill Kerr. Chris Saville rolled back the years to beat 3 time winner Trevor Gallienne who had been looking unstoppable. Gerry Fitzjohn made a valiant effort against Kevin Tunstall only losing by 1,550 after being 14,630 down after leg 1. Also Martin Smith beat former champ Alan Le Blond leaving KT as the only former winner left in by the quarters. Indeed by the quarters there were a few surprise names there — Sussex's Mike Daw defeated Andy Burns 6,400-2,190. Dave Ingram defeated Martin Cole at this stage. Curt Driver beat Martin Smith and Kevin Tunstall ended Chris Saville's good run. Dave ended Mike Daw's great run in the first semi and Curt had a big chance 6k down to Kevin with his break to come but was unable to take advantage and Kevin booked his 9th final appearance.



The World Championship Doubles was won by **Jim Millward & Trevor Gallienne** (pictured left) - only 7 world singles titles between them! and they beat Mark Trafford & Keith Hollis in the final. Nigel Senior took his frustration out in the plate knocking 35k past Chris Newson in the semi and then beating Bob Hall in the final. There was some Jersey success- Joshua Gardner winning the junior title beating Tia Hopwood.

A fabulous weekend—come on lets get the numbers up next year!

beat Kevin Tunstall (pictured top row 5th from left) in the final. Phil made a fantastic 23,210 in leg 1 and try as might Kevin could not beat Phil's score but nonetheless made a terrific 21,370 in reply, Phil also make the days high break of 23,470, in fact Phil was in amazing form (having not seen him for 5 months) and averaged 11,124 in the legs he played

Grand Prix @ Post Office Club, Reading, 23rd Nov 2014



The top 16 performers (pictured right) on the open circuit this year were seeded and placed into 4 groups-winners progressing to the semi finals. Top seed and new world champion Dave Ingram finished runner up to Nigel Senior (seeded 8) in Group A. Kevin Tunstall (seeded 2) won Group B winning all 3 matches despite having a big scare against Phil Osborne (seeded 15) in his first match. Last years runner up Curt Driver (seeded 3) went through his group unbeaten and won last match shootout against fellow Kent player Gerry Fitzjohn (seeded 6). Group D was the top scoring group—Phil Collins (seeded 4) went through unbeaten, Mark Brewster (seeded 4) was runner up but was the only other player than the two finalists to make a 20k+ break with 21,620 against Martin Smith (seeded 12).

In the semi finals Phil punished Nigel by not missing after Nigel's opening 8k break. Kevin's 19,030 run out was too many for Curt. Ominously for the other players Phil said he may play more next year and on this form he will be tough to beat! Group B
