The bar billiards which last year started with a disappointment as the men's International was cancelled, began this year with a bang, with a thrilling international in Jersey. It all went down to the wire, and quite often in these circumstances it can come down to players not experienced in the pressure situations of big tournament finals, like **Simon Coleman** a couple of years ago, and **Chris Newson** four years ago. This is time the match came down to **Martin Cole**, a player on debut, who was 8k down but made a magnificent 13k to win his match and clinch the match for England. It showed true bottle to make that break, and that bottle will surely see him win a first national title soon.

Jersey v England @ Sarum Hotel, 7th February 2015

After last years cancellation, there was doubt over the future of this fixture. However, the **Jersey** home match provided another thrilling finish proving this match would be much missed on the calendar,

It was a strong **Jersey** side and they made a good start leading **2-1**, then **4-2** after the first two series. **Ash Malorey** made a notable **10,260** score in his first leg against World Champion **Dave Ingram**. **England** (side pictured right) fought back hard (led by **Kevin Tunstall** with a **10,500** score) to take 3 of the next 5 legs to ensure they were not out of it at half time and were just **6-5** behind.



Curt Driver (England) & Nigel Ryall (Jersey) assumed control of their games, which left the match's destiny down to England debutant Martin Cole. It was his break, but he was 8k down against Mick Eouzan. First objective was to get the leg for the match draw, but an aggregate win would secure them match for England. Martin showed incredible bottle to stay on for 13k, captain Curt could have called him off but showed great courage to go for the win. So the final score was 17-15 England—but both sides played their part in a great match!

Upcoming Events in March & April

7/8th Mar - British Pairs (Bournemouth) - The 33rd British Pairs will take place at the Queens Hotel, Bournemouth. Curt Driver & Mark Brewster are the 2014 champs—they won the title for the first time together last year.

7th Mar - England v Guernsey (Bournemouth) - The 11th meeting between the two sides will now take place on the Bournemouth weekend. Last year England won 47-19 on Guernsey soil, so **Guersney** will not be expecting an easy ride on English tables this year.

21st Mar - 3rd East Anglian 4-pin Open - The 3rd East Anglian 4-pin Open will take place at the Grover & Allen pub, Sudbury. There will be a contingent of 3 pin players and many local 4 pin players.
