Paul Sainsbury won the Sussex title in June. This was the first time he has won this one—one he said he has always wanted to win as he likes the trophy—to be fair it is a nice one!



The AEBBA Mixed Pairs found a new home at the Salfords Club in Surrey. It was a bit disappointing to have only 16 entries but the field was strong. So it is fair to say it was nice to see surprise winners in **Jim Greensted & Ros Appleby**—definitely the biggest title either of them of one—many have tried and failed partnering Ros (me included!) but will Ros hang on to this partner??

Guernsey Open @ Les Rocquettes Hotel, 3rd May 2015

Ian Lelliott (pictured near right) won the 8th Guernsey Open to win his 2nd national title. Ian beat Chris Saville in the final. The final was a hard fought affair as both players struggled to get to grips with the table. Ian had a valuable 2k lead to take into leg 2, and looked to settle but pegged a 3k break with what he admitted to being "one of the worst shots of his life". This gave Chris a chance but again the table caught him out. The final scores how how tough the table was—7,910-6,040, in Ian's favour.



Ian made a good start with wins over local players **Andy Rundle & Paul Mason**. He then came up against **Martin Cole**—a good 8k score in leg 2 seeing him through. In the quarters he faced **Kevin Tunstall**. Ian has a good record against Kevin (well better than most) and a 12k lead

proved enough as Kevin missed on 9k in a very good game. Ian then beat the last local player left in, **Terry Kenny** in the semi finals—it was hard enough to get Terry away from the bar at this stage!

Chris' first match was tough on paper but he beat **Jon Bamsey** fairly comfortably. Wins over **Chrissie Newson** and **Connor Messenbird** followed. He then had a great win over **Colin Southouse** from 6k down to make the semis. There he met **Nigel Senior** who was never going to chase down a great 7k opener from Sav on tricky table 2. Nigel had to console himself with the high break prize making **16,640** to defeat reigning champ **Bob Chapple** who had made **15,880** in leg 1.

Jean Brackenridge was the furthest lady reaching the last 16, and took the ladies high break prize.

Curt Driver won the plate final with a win over Darren Ogier.

Big Breaks

Mark Sawyer, currently holds the biggest break recorded in bar billiards. He scored an incredible 29,000 in the 1999 Oxon Open in one leg. He won the open that averaging over 16k leg (and he didn't get a go in 2 of the 14 legs he played! In national events 3 other players have recorded 25k+ breaks. Keith Sheard has made 3 of them. Jon Bamsey and Kevin Tunstall have made one each.

In Sussex a T-Shirt is awarded for anyone achieving either a 25k break or a 20k break. Members of the 25k Sussex Club are Steve Mariner, Jim Millward, Kevin Tunstall, Gareth Lloyd & Nigel Senior. There are 29 members of the 20k

It would be good to compile a list of players who have reached these milestones. They are certainly big achievements in the game and to my knowledge it is only Sussex that keeps such records.

Sussex Open @ Roffey Club, Horsham, 14th June 2015

Paul Sainsbury (pictured right) won the his 12th National Open title by winning the Sussex Open at the Roffey Club, Horsham. Paul beat Ricky Dewdney in the final, who was appearing in his 2nd major final after losing the 2011 Bucks final. The final was a scrappy affair but Paul always had the better of the action as he won 13,820-2,220.

Paul beat Marion Skinner before recording a good win over Steven Sheard in round 2. He was 3k down at the break against Matt Knight but scored 11k to win. Much improved Stuart Carruthers gave Paul a scare in the semi-Paul was 16k up but Stuart fought back and only lost by 680. Paul then beat Martin Cole in the semis.



Rick, incredibly beat all Sussex players to reach the final and picked up some good scalps in the later stages. For the record they were Zoe Stoner, Rob Jones, Nick Brown, defending champ Richard Wooton, Jim Millward and then Nigel Senior. His closest match was that semi against Nigel. Nigel missing a good chance at the end to lose by 1,610.

Keith Sheard made the high break with 19,030. Pauline Withey made the ladies high break but Sami Baden was the furthest lady (standing in for her ill/hung-over mother) by making the last 16. Mark Trafford won a close plate final beating Denise Wills 11,480-9,360.
