## Kent Classic @ Six in One Club, Tonbridge, 13th July 2009

**Paul Sainsbury** (pictured right) produced his very best form to win the 2009 Kent Classic at the Six in One Club. Before the tournament Paul had won 7 national titles but amazingly had not added to this tally since the Bucks Open in 2001. Paul had a great run of wins beating Gareth Lloyd, Steven Sheard, Ian Lelliott and Nigel Senior to get to the final. There he met an emotional tournament director and brother **Pete Sainsbury** in what is the only open final competed by family members in history. Although Pete opened with 7k, Paul was not to be denied and opened with 13k to claim the title.

Surrey's **Jason Wadsworth** won the plate beating **Simon Ellam** in the final. The tables were playing well with four 20k breaks made, a **23,400** break by **Keith Sheard** being the highest. **Hayley Tunstall** was the furthest lady making the last 32 and took the high ladies break

with **4,490**. However new England ladies number 1, **Jean Brackenridge** did make a **7,930** break in the plate (but still lost the 1 leg game!)

**Lloyd.** The final was a nervy affair on a tricky table, but a pegged break by Gareth late into leg 2 allowed Curt to get over the line.

**Dave Ingram** continued his success in 2009 opens by winning the plate by beating Oxon's **Geoff Mace** in the final. **Nigel Senior** took the high break prize with a **21,230**. Recently married **Jenny Florey** (nee Abbott) took the ladies high break with **3,640** but it wasn't enough to overcome the hampered **Richard Wooton**, who must surely win the award of triumph against adversity by winning two matches with 2 broken wrists, before Dave Alder cruelly ending his run in the last 16.
