3rd National Off the Spot Open @ Salfords Club, Surrey, 25th Oct 2015

Matt Jones (pictured right) won the 3rd National Off the Spot title beating **Curt Driver**. This is Matt's first national title and this is more remarkable as he only first appeared at the end of 2014 on the national scene. He was



also impressive in the final as he ran the table out-off the spot remember for 15,200. Curt was off early in reply to make it his 3rd runners up in individual events this year.

Matt's run to the final was also impressive—he made swift progress to the quarter finals where he beat Geoff Jukes, but it was in the semi he really came of age beating current World Champion, Dave Ingram from 11k down. Curt was untroubled to the quarter finals where he only overcame Matt Knight by 1.550 at the end—a 16.860 target was too much for Mark James in the semis.

Mark Brewster made a 20,100 break-a great break off the spot. Martin Cole beat Stephen Coleman in the plate final.



### AEBBA Newsletter Editorial

A very busy couple of months in the Bar Billiards calendar has seen Kent A winning the county championship, 16 years after their last—I think Curt had hair then! Not the best team on paper but they won all their matches and the whole team contributed for a great win.

This months highlight was **Matt Jones** winning the Off the Spot. For someone who has not being playing very long, he showed remarkable composure in his first big final—playing the table out (off the spot). There can be no doubt he will be a very top player in the coming years. Nigel Senior won the All England Singles for the 3rd time to make up for his disappointment in losing the crucial leg for Sussex the week before. Kevin Tunstall took the Alternative Rules title, amazingly his first title of 2015!

#### County Champs Div 1 @ Didcot Con Club, 20th Sept 2015

Kent A won the county championship title—their 5th win but the first since 1999! The winning side was  $\operatorname{\mathbf{Curt}}\operatorname{\mathbf{Driver}}$ (capt), Jon Sainsbury, Richard Corbould, Pete Sainsbury, Gerry Fitzjohn, Mark Brewster & Ian Wright.

In series 1 favourites Sussex A started strongly with a 6-1 win over their B side who were sadly missing one player for the day. Kent A and Surrey also started well with 4-3 wins over Oxon A and Berks A respectively. In series 2 Sussex A extended their lead to 3 points with a good 5-2 win over Oxon

A. Kent A kept themselves in contention with a 4-3 win over Surrey A.

In series 3  ${\bf Sussex}$   ${\bf A}$  let an opportunity slip as they lost to  ${\bf Kent}$   ${\bf A}$  4-3 with 4 breaks. This left  $Kent\ A$  two points behind  $Sussex\ A$  at this stage with  $Oxon\ A$  a further two points behind. The penultimate series 4 tightened things up at the top as Kent A beat Sussex B 5-2 and Sussex A slipped to their second 4-3 defeat against reigning champs Berks A. So with one match to go it would be either Kent A or Sussex A who would take the title tied on 17 points with one match to go. Advantage to Kent A though as they had the extra match win. It all went to the wire-Kent A took 4 points against Surrey A. This left Sussex A needing the last 3 legs against Surrey A. Kevin Tunstall & Martin Cole recorded wins, but

Nigel Senior was making things exciting on table 1 playing Tony Cross-needing around 700 with the bar dropped- he made one shot of the cushion into the 200—but pegged the next one to give **Kent A** the title.

Sussex B were relegated but will be disappointed as they gave away 5 games and were only one point short of  $\mathbf{Sur}$ rey, Berks A and Oxon A. Leon Beer (Oxon) (top average of 13,090), Kevin Tunstall (Sussex A) and Henry Brooks (Sussex B) won 5 matches out of 5. Curt Driver had the 6 Sussex B 15 days high break of 11,010.

#### **Pauline** Withey (pictured right) won the Special Ladies for the 9th time. Pauline beat Sami Baden



making her first appearance in a major ladies final. Pauline's experience was probably a big factor in the final as she made the days high break of 6,430 and she won 15,900-2,740.

Only 7 entries turned out and instead of the usual knockout format the players were drawn into groups of 4 and 3. Pauline went through unbeaten in her group as did Sami who had good wins over Oxon players Jenny Florey and Mel Standbridge. Group runners up contested the plate final—Jenny Florey beating Janet Burns.

#### All England Ladies, 20th Sept 2015

Pauline Withey (pictured right) won the All England Ladies title for the 5th time. Only five county champions showed up, but it was a strong field. Three former champions were present Pauline, Denise Wills and reigning champ Jean Brackenridge. Denise met Jean first and it was Denise who came out on top 18,580-5,450. Pauline narrowly beat Dawn Jordan and then met Jean in her 2nd match. Pauline was 8k up but Jean



fought back but lost by only 760. This put Jean out of the running and Denise and Pauline had both won their opening 2 matches before they met. Denise was only 700 behind with her break to come, but Pauline came back in leg 2 to win **14,120-10,020**. Pauline still had to beat Carla Jolly to clinch the title and she

Barry put himself in but missed early and Nigel also missed early with the break back. 2 breaks later and Barry had a 1k lead, but Nigel broke off with enough in leg 2 to take the title. Nigel won his group, winning all 3 matches. Barry's group was more interesting with 3 players in contention—Simon Coleman was in prime position but Barry scored 26k without reply to book his place in the final. Top break was Nigel's 19,040.

This is a unique event where 6 white balls are placed in a triangle at the back of the table to start the game. Everytime the balls are cleared the triangle is reformed. A great entry (probably due to Keith Sheard's 60th the night before!) of 39 were split into groups of 5 (with one of 4), with top in each group progressing

Kevin made it through his group, despite a loss to wife Hayley. Curt also made it through despite losing a game. This was to last years champ Nigel Senior who topped scored in the groups with 10k+ in his 4 legs. Nigel made it to the semis where he lost out to Kevin. Another Kevin-Kevin Hall also made it to the semi finals. He lost by just 30 points to Curt—a great effort as he was on debut in this tournament
