Guernsey Pairs, Les Rocquettes 30th April 2016

The day before the Guernsey Open, the 6th Guernsey Pairs took place. This was won by Jim Millward & Martin Cole (pictured right) who beat Dave Ingram & Matt Jones in the final. The 1st leg was

low scoring but Martin showed good nerve in leg 2 to open with a winning break; the final score being 10,450-3,930.

Jim & Martin won their first two games easily, but were pushed hard in the quarter finals by last year's World Champ runners up Colin Southouse & Phil Osborne-only 1,390 between them in the end. Dave & Matt had some tough pairs to beat but were never really run close en route to the final—their closest game was in round 1 against Ian Lelliott & Martin Smith.

Mark Brewster & Mark Trafford won the plate beating Guernsey's Darren Ogier & Matt Wilcox.

2 Opens have taken place over the last two months. Martin Cole took his first national title in Guernsey. I told him it was a matter of time after a near miss against me in the Grand Prix. He also completed a great double by taking the Guernsey doubles title with Jim Millward the day before.

Curt Driver won the Sussex title in June. He has been consistently making finals recently but not winning them, but he was very clinical this time.

The AEBBA Mixed Pairs was won by a Sussex/Surrey combo in Ian Lelliott & Genette Nicholls, on a great day at the Salfords Club.

With 4 opens coming up in quick succession, we will be very busy in the next couple of months. The highlight being the welcome return of the Northants Open, last played in 1999, we are looking forward to that one!

Guernsey Open @ Les Rocquettes Hotel, 1st May 2016

Martin Cole (pictured right) won the 9th Guernsey Open to bag his 1st national title. Martin beat local player Ian Champion in the final. After a close first leg where Ian held a 190 point lead, Martin took control to finally win by 10,960-5,130. This also completed a great double for Martin winning the pairs with Jim Millward the previous day

Martin scored heavily in his early matches to beat Paul Dyer and Chrissie Newson. This took him to a last 16 match against the very experienced Geoff Jukes and it was a close affair which Martin held onto win by just 390 points. The quarter final against

Colin Robbins was low scoring but he came through that to win an even lower scoring semi final (as can often be the way on Guernsey tables). This was against Gerry Fitzjohn and the final score was 4,040—1,080.

Ian squeezed past Chris Tupper and 2014 champ Bob Chapple before recording a comfortable win in the last 16 over Martin Smith. In the quarter finals he had a tough match against Dave Ingram coming back from nearly 6k down. He then met the current World Champ Paul Sainsbury in the semi finals. Paul was in good form knocking in the highest break of 17,380 in the previous round. On a table far harder to split Ian built up a 6k lead. Paul looked to have got to grips finally with the table but crucially missed a ball when on a break that had just drawn him level with Ian.

Jean Brackenridge was the furthest lady reaching the last 32, and took the ladies high break prize with

Weeks at Number One

Is it the end of an era? 2016 will be the first year since the rankings started in 1991 that Kevin Tunstall has not spent at least one week at the top spot. As at the end of 2016, Kevin has spent 1,195 weeks (the equivalent of 23 years) at number 1 in the rankings. The other 5 players have only managed 157 weeks between them; Nigel Senior (63 weeks), Keith Sheard (31 weeks), Les Green (27 weeks), Curt Driver (19 weeks) & Mark Trafford (17 weeks).



So how does Kevin's record compare with other sports? Well tennis players get nowhere near Kevin—Roger Federer has 302 weeks at number 1, Steffi Graf 377 weeks. Snooker? Stephen Hendry managed 9 years at number 1, not close to Kevin's 23...Golf—Tiger Woods has a total of 683 weeks at number 1, over halfway to Kevin's total but seems unlikely to add to them. What about 16 time World Champ Phil Taylor in darts? Well in the darts rankings he never always held down the number one spot as he didn't play everything, overall he has 'only' spent around 500 weeks as the PDC number 1—so well short.

So what about a 'sport' that players can compete well into their later years....Chess? **Garry Kasparov** gets closer, over 1,000 weeks at number 1 spanning 19 years, so not quite. But what about the women? Hungary's **Judit Polgar** spell as the women's number 1 chess player recently ended but she was there since 1989, and for 24 years, and consecutive! So Kevin you have to get back to number 1 for another year at least to beat her!

Sussex Open @ Roffey Club, Horsham, 12th June 2016

Curt Driver (I have decided to put a picture of the trophy as we see a lot of Curt in 2016!) won the his 6th National title by winning the Sussex Open at the Roffey Club, Horsham. Curt beat **Dave Ingram** in the final, Dave missed on 4k and never got another chance as Curt ran out the winner by a scoreline of **18,670-4,000**. After a series of near misses in the last 18 months Curt will be happy to have got over the line this time.

Curt beat 4 Sussex players to make the last 4. These were all fairly one sided, as he beat **Ric Cunningham**, **Jim Greensted**, **Gareth Lloyd** and **Nigel Senior**. The semi final was much tougher as he played the World Champ **Paul Sainsbury**. There were two run outs in a great match but Curt edged it **17.810-16.690**.

In contrast Dave beat no Sussex players until the last 4. Wins over **Pete Sainsbury**, **Lee Radford & Lorin Clough** set him up to play **Mark Trafford** in the quarter finals. Dave beat Mark in a close match, the consolation for Mark is that he regained the number 1 ranking. In the semi finals Dave faced an old foe in **Ian Lelliott**, Dave was a comfortable winner on this occasion.

Gerry Fitzjohn made the high break in round 2 with **18,910**. **Michelle Baden** made the ladies high break with **3,620** and **Sandra Hall** was the furthest lady making the last 32. **Colin Southouse** won the plate final beating **Pete Sainsbury 16,490-12,320**.
