

The first major event of the bar billiards year was the annual meeting between the Jersey (pictured below) and England (pictured right) Mens teams. In a new venue at the Ardington Hotel, Worthing, the England Men were looking to avenge last years landslide defeat of 22-11 at the hands of the Jersey men.

Jersey made a decent start winning 3 of the first 7 legs to trail by one, but they lost the next 4 to trail 3-8 at half time. Nigel Senior made a 20,540 break which was the match's highest break. In the second half England turned up the pressure and took 6 of the first 7

Oxfordshire Open @ Didcot Con Club, 13th February 2010

Nigel Senior (pictured right) won the first national open of the year by winning the 2010 Oxfordshire Open. Nigel beat World Champion Phil Collins in the final. This is Nigel's 2nd win in the event after his previous victory in 2006. Nigel rode his luck on his way to the final and the semi with Hampshire's Barry Radford was a classic. Barry, who's one national final was a 1989 runners up in the All England Singles, looked set to overhaul a 15k defecit before missing after the bar had dropped only 20 points behind. A relieved Nigel cleared the balls to win. Curt Driver succumbed to Phil Collins in the other semi



but the Grand Prix champ had another great day beating **Keith Sheard** in Round 1 and **Kevin Tunstall** in the quarter finals.

Keith Sheard went onto win the plate, beating Jon Bamsey in the final. His son, Steven Sheard, made the days highest break of 20,820. Jenny Florey made an impressive high lady's break with 8,130, sadly for her it was not quite enough to win her match! Chris Toner was the furthest lady making the last 16.
