THE WINNER

Mick Nicholl is a 50-year-old insurance agent from Whitstable who plays for the Hop Poles pub in Canterbury. He said that the highlight of his 20-year career before now was the time he was the only winner as Kent lost 10-1 to England in 1985. (The BBQ Editor believed he only said that as HE was the one who was beaten). Mick has won the Faversham Singles "more than once" but this was his first big one.

THE FINAL

Mick Nicholl kicked off with 13,090 in the first 15 minutes. Mark Woods, step-son of Grand Prix specialist Les Green, replied with 1,510 and lost the first leg 13,950 - 1,720. Mark then lost his cool as he lost his first three breaks in the second leg, totalling only 2,000 in all. Mick, meanwhile, found himself stretching his lead by another 5,000. Mark made four more visits, losing another 1,000 break and totalling only 460. Mick finished it off with another 3,600 break and never looked in trouble.

SOUTH YORKSHIRE

First report from up north; here I quote a letter from Charlie Wheeler, asked by Mick Eccles to send a report to BBQ, but it sounds like Charlie's life history SINCE moving to Doncaster . . . well done Charlie.

"When former Reading Inter Area Captain Charlie Wheeler moved to Doncaster he found it difficult to find a pub with a Bar Billiards table, but after a lot of travelling and probably a bit of arm twisting too, he persuaded a few landlords to get one in with a view to setting up a League. No sooner had it got off the ground, he was being told that it wouldn't last, but despite there being only three tables at the outset, he persevered and a year later South Yorkshire joined the AEBBA.

Several competitions were organised and TEN years later the League runs no less than 16 competitions which include the Yorkshire Television Cup - the only TV company to have a trophy under its name.
