#### SWEET REVENGE AT LAST FOR JERSEY

Jersey has won the Annual International match with the mighty England team for the first time since 1993; and the staggering 14-8 scoreline is their best ever result.

The atmosphere of the match at the Woodville Hotel, St Helier, simply did not ignite for the England team as it usually does, but it certainly did for the Jersey lads.

Some of the visiting players disliked the agreement of the England hierarchy to play on the basis of one point per leg (i.e. best of 22) rather than one point being available to the player with the best aggregate over both legs (i.e. best of 11), although, under the former rules, the defeat would eventually have been even more resounding, 9-2.

They felt that the new ruling could change the course of the game, with the slower scoring style of the Jersey players being more effective if they only had to win the leg for a point, an argument somewhat defeated by Steve Ahier making a splendidly aggressive 17,850 break in a revenge match against Brighton's Jim Millward who had inflicted a heavy defeat upon Ahier in the 1997 British Isles Open final.

And to a lesser extent, Dennis Helleur and Alan Le Blond, both former winners of the Open, also disproved the England theory with breaks of 14,720 against Kevin Clark (Rochester) and 13,180 against Les Green (Rainham).

However, the new rule was supposed to make the match closer, and therefore more exciting. The playing format was also changed slightly so that the last four legs of the match would run concurrently, again leading towards a more thrilling finale.

But, because Jersey played so well early on, the match was virtually over by the interval, with a glorious 9-2 lead making the refreshments taste much better for the Jersey team and their magnificent supporters.

Only Steve Mariner, with a 5,890 break against 1998 Open runner-up Nick Barnett, and Mark Sawyer, with a 7,260 break against 1984 and 1996 Open runner-up Don Cadec, had given England any satisfaction.

Some of the first leg games had been closely fought, and if the match had been played under the old rules, it could have been calculated that, if FOUR of the England players could make sterling recoveries, the match could still have been pulled out of the fire.

As it was, an England victory seemed very long odds, needing 10 of the 11 remaining legs.

Chances heightened briefly when the match resumed, with current No.1 Les Green finally getting a shot in his match with Le Blond, and England skipper Bernie McCluskey looking to be well in command against Harry Barbet.

Green opened with a creditable 5,790, while McCluskey was making England supporters cross-eyed by trying to watch both vital games in opposite corners of the room.

McCluskey had reached the "safety zone" well before the time his break had reached over 7000 and should have settled for victory, but then put himself in big trouble by leaving the only ball in the middle of the table and firing well wide of the target. The break was lost and Barbet accepted another leg gratefully.

Meanwhile, it became apparent that even Green's effort was not enough, and Le Blond made it 11-2 in Jersey's favour with a magnificent 6,410 reply.

It was a case of "what might have been" as England closed in on a very unlikely face-saving 11-11 draw during the next four legs.

Former No.1 Kevin Tunstall made a 9,150 break to counter Graham Bisson's earlier 8,710, debutant Mark Brewster (Rochester) edged past Nigel Ryall, Paul Sainsbury (Tunbridge Wells) outscored Graeme Le Monnier, and another new boy Mark Turner (Wokingham) made an encouraging 7,170 in beating Graeme Marett.

If only Steve Mariner could continue his first leg form to inflict another defeat on Nick Barnett, miracles were still possible. But, although he started well, a Barnett 6,340 reply set the Jersey cheers echoing around the room.

This left the last four legs, which should have been the deciders, totally redundant of purpose, although Jim Millward and Peter Farrelly managed to salvage a touch of pride.

So a very disappointing weekend for the visitors from the mainland was obviously a very successful match for the Jersey lads, rightly cook-a-hoop about this very long-awaited victory, and therefore adding a lot of interest to next year's annual confrontation.

But that is likely to be a different story. The best result achieved by Jersey on English soil is still the 7-4 DEFEAT in 1986, but if the really top Jersey men all make the trip in the millennium year, perhaps success could be on the cards for them at long last.

The awards for the highest break made within each team went to Kevin Tunstall (9,150) for England and Steve Ahier (17,850) for Jersey.

**ENGLAND PLAYER PROFILES**

*Your BBQ editor provided profiles for the International programme as requested, but they were "CRUELLY" edited, so here is your chance to be offended properly.*

**BERNIE McCLUSKEY (Ranked 12, from READING)** Appointed non-playing captain for the 1998 International, but now very definitely PLAYING, and very definitely looking to improve upon his fairly mediocre England record of only winning 7 of his 13 matches. He has won the All-England Individuals FOUR TIMES, he was the first mainland player to win the BIOC, he was the first Grand Prix Masters Champion in 1993, and he has captured SIX other major titles over his many years at the top. **LES GREEN (1, RAINHAM)** A real "GREEK GOD". Still in Kent for now, so still available to play for England. Zoomed to No.1 with a brilliant year in 1998, but may soon be finding it difficult to struggle into the Greek National team. Les does not care who he plays for: "Dos moi pou sto kai ten gen kineso" he said hopefully. "Panta men kathara tois katharais," he went on. Then on the subject of the No.1 slot, he said "ktema es aei", but "pathemata mathemata" and "pleon hemisy pantos" so "es korakas."

**TRANSLATION NOT AVAILABLE** but he IS a Greek God!!!!!! or so says Ann.  
(NIGEL BISSON added the bit about watching LESBOS)

**MARK SAWYER (5, WOKINGHAM)** Made a successful England debut last year. The only player ever likely to have an extensive fan club, but also Honorary President and fully paid-down member of the fan club of the Jersey Spoons Champion (1997-98). Holder of the World Record break of 31,350, made in 18 mins 48 secs. Slow player! Not the usual type of Estate Agent...he ALMOST looks trustworthy. To use one of his trade's favourite words: his head is not very "bijoux", i.e. not very small, not very elegant. Recently tried Willie Thorne's own-brand shampoo "Shoulders".

A first Jersey win since 1993 seemed on the cards when Karen Aubert and Heather Hamon inflicted early defeats on debutant Denise Hoadley (Surrey) and Kent's Diana Welburn making only her second International appearance.

**PAULINE WITHEY (ladies ranking 2, from OXFORD)** Leading the team again, and very pleased to be playing for England after last year's aborted match. Won 9 of her 12 matches, but impossible to say anything nasty about the ladies in case they gang up. And the Wokingham estate agent was certainly on form at the Oxfordshire Open, making seven scores of over 20,000 during the day, totalling an incredible 233,630 during the 14 legs he played, which gave him an average of 16,690.

But, he did not get a shot in TWO of those legs, so he averaged an unbelievable 19,470 in the 12 legs where he was given an opportunity.

Most incredible of all was the 29,000 points he scored in his quarter-final match against Sean Lee (Wallingford). That is nearly 4,000 MORE than the previous best break in a ranking event. And that was only in the 2nd leg. He had already scored 24,760 in the first leg.

Surely, he could not keep doing it, but he did, taking the £300 first prize by beating Kevin Tunstall in a fantastic final.

After losing the toss, Tunstall set a target of 22,070 by playing out the first leg, which was obviously going to TEST Sawyer, but not enough.

A 23,700 reply was almost an anti-climax after his previous achievements.

His string of whopping scores also gave Sawyer 15.4 ranking points, a record for this type of event, moving him up to a career-best No.4 in the new list.

The Plate Final was fought out between Wallingford team-mates Keith Sheard and Gary Johnson. Sheard, No.3 in the rankings but ousted by Stuart Florey in the first round of the main competition, played it out for 22,080 in the first leg.

Johnson chased in vain and blew it at 3,320 in the second leg. Sheard rubbed it in with another 9,530 break and Johnson then black-pinned.

**GREEN AND SAVILLE TAKE THE PAIRS AGAIN**

*Celebrating his newly-found status of Number One, Les Green partnered Chris Saville and regained the British Open Pairs title they first won in 1995.*

On day one, Green had made a 20,200 break to overcome Ray Sturgess' brave effort of 16,850, and then a 16,850 break to outshine Mark Brewster's 11,970.

Saville was a little overshadowed but did manage a 5,960 against Alan Shubert and Di Welburn before Green again made an 18,490 total clearance.

Opening the second day, they struggled to narrowly overcome Sheard and Johnson, but they then showed the killer touch with virtually identical performances in the semi's and final.

In-form Steve Biggs totally underhit the opening shot of the semi, scoring just 200, and allowing Green to take the initiative immediately with a 15,750 break.

Saville's opening 7,190 in the 2nd did not seem enough, but everybody had another go before Farrelly made a 5,410 to close the gap a little.

Farrelly's opening 3,000+ in the 3rd was lost on a cushion shot at a ball in between the 100 and 200 holes, but Biggs' 3,900 at least gave them the leg.

Green's break in the 4th and the Northants pair needed to win it by 14,650. When Green made 4,250, a few points were scored before conceding after six minutes.

The final was an amazingly similar story.

Green and Saville again won the toss, and Mark Sawyer, who had been getting up from his sick bed after each early round, only made 500 before a short red on the one-up shot left him with a tough follow-through 50 option on a slow table.

Green's 18,330 reply was a sickener, although there were SEVEN missed 100 shots.

Saville's 2nd leg opener was only 2,050, caught out on a shot near to the 10 hole. Small contributions from the next SIX turns at the table before Sawyer made an 8,800. Trinder's 4,770 in leg 3 was not enough as Saville settled in for an 8,030 to give them a 2-1 lead.

Again Green had the break in the 4th with a 14,290 lead, and the "sad man" just settled for an extra 0.1 of a ranking point with an 8,000 opener before coming off and allowing the Wokingham pair to concede.

For the Rochester duo, it was sweet revenge for their 1997 final defeat.

The other semi-final started off looking one-sided too, with Trinder's 10,340 and Sawyer's 13,720 giving them a 2-0 lead. But veteran Derek Payne whose finest moment was playing in the first ever Jersey final, made a 14,110 effort to haul it back.

The 8,270 aggregate lead was swollen by Trinder's 5,000 4th leg opener, but Giles powered in for a magnificent effort. He reached 11,900, which was an agonisingly unlucky 1,370 short.

The highest combined break prize could not be won by Farrelly and Biggs who had a total of 39,400 under their belts due to them reaching the last four; instead it went to Kevin Clark and Mark Brewster for their combined effort of 32,480.

In the Plate Competition for first round losers, High Wycombe's Dino Clark and Andy Haines outscored Oxford's more experienced Pete Lee and Ian Moquet in a thrilling final.

Moquet had opened with a 4,900 break, but Haines and Lee both made a visit before Clark settled into a handy 5,280 effort. Haines also contributed a 1,620 before the half-way mark which saw the Wycombe boys 7,220 - 5,790 ahead.

When Clark opened leg 2 with a fine 7,440, the title was theirs. Clark also celebrated in the best way possible with another 6,000 before the end.
