KENT MINNOWS "LEFTOVERS"

(By special request, I provide the report on the Kent Minnows played in June 1999, which was missed out of the last BBQ, with sincere apologies to Lorin):

LORIN CLOUGH made the long trip from Perth to Cliffe and was rewarded with his first national trophy.

Lorin's first two matches were low-key wins over Martin Dickman and Chris Jarrett, but he hit form with a 9,840 break to beat Paul Trotman, and then an 8,640 break to beat Keith MacDonald.

He looked beaten in the semi-final clash with Dino Clark, but rallied superbly in the last five minutes of the second leg to come out on aggregate 11,110 - 10,960.

The final was so close all the way, but Garry Speller could not spoil Clough's happy day.

Speller had looked a possible finalist throughout. A 9,660 break had seen off Richard Harris, but he was happy not to have to take on Steve Purkiss at Arm Wrestling instead. Breaks of 9,630 and 8,700 stumped Andy Haines (the highest-ranked player in the event at No. 51) and then another 7,840 made his victory over Syl Murphy in the semi-final seem very easy.

Chris Newson, who camped outside the venue in his van for the weekend, took the highest break prize for his 14,660 in the first round against Tracy Speller, but he lost out in the 3rd round match with Dino Clark.

The 12,030 - 60 half-time lead certainly seemed big enough when Bernie only started leg 2 with 2,690. Mark scored 1,950 but then lost his second effort of 510, but by now time was against Bernie, despite showing signs of being back to the form which has given him four All-England titles.

However, he made 7,300 before the bar dropped.

Mark's day was solid throughout, without really being tested. Mark Brewster was the only real challenger, but Turner won the first leg 7,440 - 5,770 and the second without reply.

The first problem for him came against Wokingham team-mate Mark Sawyer in the semi-final. Turner scraped through the first leg 3,600 - 3,180 with Sawyer showing a little petulance by banging his cue and throwing it on the floor to offer his exasperation on the standard of the table.

When Sawyer played the split-shot so hard that the 50 hole threw the ball back towards the 200 and it took out the black pin. Turner was heading towards the final.

TIP: As it was not Mark's own cue, could you please be careful if he ever wants to borrow yours.
