# ESSO'S TITLE AT FOURTH TIME OF ASKING

Jersey's top team, "The Esplanade", have taken the British Isles Open Championship 1999 in the shape of PETER NOEL, having had three different players in the final for the last three years

Peter who, at just a few weeks short of his 70th birthday, is believed to be the oldest-ever winner of the event (unless Harry Siddal was older when he won the first BIOC in 1981), had also won the title way back in 1984 as well losing out to Reading's Dave Harris in 1986.

Team-mates Don Cadec, Steve Ahier and Nick Barnett were all beaten in the last three finals by Englishmen, but Peter was not going to let it happen again, playing the 1990 runner-up Terry Race (Brighton).

It was a classic, the most intriguing final for years:

He started off with a 7,970 break in the first nine minutes of the first leg after losing the toss.

But he did not get another chance as Terry replied with a 5,820 in under seven minutes himself to take a 2,150 deficit into the 2nd leg, and with his break to come.

Terry, although appearing to play slightly quicker, had made only 6,720 in just under nine minutes when he allowed Peter to the table.

4,570 behind with seven minutes left, Peter seemed to have lost his chance when he scored only 340 in the next minute and allowed Terry a chance to clinch it.

The Brighton man played a superb three-ball shot which would have assured him the title, but only two went down and the third travelled back towards the pin, just knocked it over and gave Peter a last golden opportunity.

A scorching 5,750 break in under six minutes gave Jersey their first BIOC since Dennis Helleur beat Harry Barbet in 1992.

Terry made 300 with the last few balls but Peter had won 14.060-12.840, and the celebrations began, but they were not too highly-spirited.

Well, he is 69!

Peter had fought his way through undoubtedly the toughest of the 16 sheets. When the draw was made, if he had looked at the British Rankings, he would have noticed numbers 1, 3 and 4 alongside him, as well as the prospect of the sheet winner having to play the no. 2 Les Green, or Jersey's 2nd highest-ranked player Dennis Helleur, for a place in the last eight.

Undaunted, he beat Reading's Kent-based Paul Sainsbury with a 7,350 break in the second round following a first round bye.

The ample (?) frame of Neil "Jockey" Bickers, who later controversially lost on the crowd's say-so to champion Dicko Pembroke in another classic "Spoons Challenge", was Peter's next opponent, followed by Roy Wells "Sussex", before having to face no. 1 Kevin Tunstall in the fifth round, the stage where the double-leg games are introduced.

Peter built up an impressive 8,760 - 560 first leg lead, and then held on tight as Tunstall failed to make a large enough impression. Peter won the 2nd leg too, 5,770 - 5,450.

Helleur had seen off Green in the 4th round with a 7.150 break, but, although leading Noel at half-time 5,990 - 230, Peter's 11,210 break in the 2nd was a dream.

Next came Jason Holley, a late entrant from Jersey who had ousted much-fancied pair Alan Le Blond and Graeme Le Monnier to get this far. (Well, much-fancied by their own families, anyway.) Holley plays in the local league's SECOND Division.

But a 12,750 break in the first leg and another score of 11,520 to follow gave Peter the required impetus into the semi-finals where he met Portsmouth's Paul Wing,

hoping to impress enough to get his first England cap in 2000.

Paul had had a sedate run into the fifth round before beating England's first-ever BIOC winner Bernie McCluskey. Trailing only 900 - 4,210 on first innings, Paul opened the 2nd leg with a classy 9,110 break.

Noel trailed 6,090 - 3,220 to Wing, but made a magnifique 10,110 in leg two and

he was comfortably into his third BIOC final.

There had been a raised eyebrow or two when the draw was published. Top-ranked duo Kevin Tunstall and Keith Sheard, fierce rivals in ALL events over the last twenty years or so but also Oxfordshire team-mates, were scheduled to meet.

Holder Sheard seemed to "bottle" his first break, scoring only 1,150. Kevin steadily made an 8,860 in reply, followed by some shots from Sheard which were hit so hard they

only threatened the scorer's handsome good looks.

Dave Constable (Redhill) regained some "form of years gone by" with a tremendous run of results. He beat England Ladies International Josie Hogan (a fellow Redhill-mobster) in round three, followed by wins over Pete Farrelly (yes, very luckily), Micky Daw (yes, very splendidly) and Harry Barbet (yes, very, very unexpectedly).

Over 7,000 to Barbet, he opened leg two (if you pardon the expression) with a very

calm 8,000, taking the punters' favourite out of the running.

Barbet's play to that moment was phenomenal. Drawn to play 1998 runner-up Nick Barnett in round one, he stepped in when Barnett missed his first one-up and proceeded to reply with an 8,890 break.

A 9,670 break then ousted Sussex starlet Gareth Lloyd, before just avoiding embarrassment by beating Sue Barnes, wife of AE Sec Dave, in round three. After losing a break close to 2,000, he simply could not keep any score 75% of the way into the game.

Sue had won her first two matches with 370 and 460, so she was on a career-best

490 before the "Spider" untangled himself from his own web.

Harry resumed normal service for rounds four and five, making a 7,180 break to beat Nigel Bisson and then a 13,080 break to beat Guernsey's best player Trevor Gallienne, before being "arrested" by the Redhill Constable.

Martin Carre, not currently registered for any Jersey side, reached the quarter-

finals by beating Mark Brewster, Dorset's own Eric Hill and Chris Tupper.

Another of the event's surprise packages was John Robertson from Sussex who, despite given "no chance" by first round opponent Jim Millward, the 1997 champion, went through to narrowly lose out to Graham Bisson, the 1982 champion and 1993 runner-up, in the last sixteen.

Bisson had earlier beaten the 1990 and 1991 champion Steve Ahier with an 8,160

opener so impressive that Ahier just shook hands and walked away.

Terry Oakley from Redhill, who has struggled since winning in 1996, fought his way into the last 16 this time before losing to Tables Manager Nigel Ryall.

Ryall always performs in this event, but seems to run out of steam. After a bye and a walk-over and two regulation victories, he caused a storm by ousting Mark Sawyer (Wokingham), one of England's hot hopefuls.

Once Sawyer had lost his opener, Ryall won the first leg 10,630 - 30 and then started leg 2 with a truly remarkable 14,380, the best break of the weekend, although it

could not qualify for any prize.

That went to Dennis Helleur for the Channel Is and Terry Race for UK, although in the past a runner-up could not claim the holiday prize.

Sheila O'Brien took three of the six ladies' prizes.

Steven Sheard retained his Junior title, still remaining unbeaten in THREE years. Watch out when he is old enough for the big person's game!
