1999 A.G.M. NEWS

PROPOSALS AGREED at the AGM, held at the Clifton Arms, Reading, Dec 12th 1999:

Trophies for the ALTERNATIVE RULES will be limited to winner, runner-up and highest break to help cut costs.

The Black pin penalty will be re-instated for the last-ball shot in the Alternative Rulus. (Other than the last-ball shot, the black pin only counts as a white pin.)

The Ladies County Championship will become a five-a-side competition, with any counties able to enter "B" and even "C" teams, provided they indicate their intention at least three weeks before the event to aid preparation of formats.

The AGM also discussed ways of making better use of the days when few people attend events, i.e. All-England Singles & Alternative Rules, and agreed:

to leave the Alternative Rules open to all those who wished to enter (not just three per county as at present). Entries by the end of August with no fee payable.
 to switch the All-England Ladies to the date of the Team Championship and stage a Ladies Open on the same day as the All-England Singles and the Under-22's.

PROPOSALS LOST:

That reigning champions of both All-England Singles should be invited to defend their titles without having to qualify.

That each county be permitted to send up to TWO people to each ALL-ENGLAND singles event.

To change the All-England points scoring system for events played in Individual groups FROM 2 pts per leg, 1 pt for aggregate, TO 1.1 for aggregate, 0.2 per leg.

To change the scoring system for All-England Team events from a point per leg to TWO points for a team victory, and legs only counting to decide winners in the event of a tie.

To enforce Pete Farrelly to make the MIXED PAIRS a ranking event.

To change the Alternative Rules Competition back to the 1997 version, i.e. with a triangle ONLY to start the game off.

OTHER NEWS:

The Executive Committee was returned en bloc, and the Selection Panel saw one change (Jim Millward in for Steve Mariner).

The following England teams were announced:

LADIES: Pauline Withey (capt), Jan Taylor, Kim Beeching, Gail Woods and Myra Hawkins, plus Penny Burch if Jersey could send a 6th player. Josie Hogan would be on stand-by.

MEN: Bernie McCluskey (non-playing capt), Kevin Tunstall, Mark Turner, Mark Sawyer, Paul Sainsbury, Jim Millward, Les Green, Pete Farrelly, Mark Brewster, Steve Biggs and new-caps Paul Wing and Kevin Godfrey. Named reserves: Kevin Clark and Gary Johnson.

Keith MacDonald proposed entry to the Association for Dorset.

Kevin Tunstall announced the recent death of his father John who was known by most players after having bar billiards venues in Herts, Oxon and Ascot.

The association sent their condolences to Viv. Kevin, Jan and the rest of the family. Keith Lewendon apologised for the misunderstanding which led to England agreeing to play "a point per leg" in the 1999 International against Jersey. He agreed that the AGM minutes had NOT confirmed agreement to play to this rule when in Jersey. He said discussions would be held with the Jersey officials before the 2001 match.

PETE BURTON (OXON)

MOQUET MAKES A "MOQUERY" OF THE RANKINGS

Ian Moquet has been around a long, long time, even partnering Keith Sheard in the British Open Pairs (but there again who hasn't), but he has never won a major title until now.

The Oxford "old-timer" beat holder Mark Sawyer in a low-scoring final to move up

an incredible 156 places in the ranking list to 61.

Apart from Canterbury's Mick Nichol, who won the Kent Classic back in 1993, he

is probably the lowest ranked player ever to win any major competition.

Moquet had a purple patch in 1996, when he was runner-up in this event and in the Pairs with Sheardy, but this must rank as his greatest achievement in a long career.

The final was expected to go to Sawyer despite not being at his scintillating best form of 1999, but Moquet made a solid 7,450 at the start after being asked to play first.

Sawyer made scores of only 130, 0, 160 and 130 on his first leg visits. Even though Moquet lost over 3,000 on his second visit, he made 40 and 1,640 on his

remaining visits and took the first leg 9,130 - 420.

Sawyer was probably still favourite, UNTIL he blew his first break in the 2nd leg, scoring only 600. When Moquet got the break back and settled down again, it seemed all over. But he scored only 3,550 to leave Sawyer one last chance, needing to catch a deficit of 11,660 in just under 12 minutes. Easy on a good day!

Still looking uncomfortable, he only made 6,480 in the next 7 mins, and, after two

quick visits each, Sawyer conceded with over 2 mins to play.

Moquet was consistent all day, despite much discussion about the state of MOST of the tables. He made breaks of 8,260 and 16,650 in the first round against Michael Rouse, 11,510 against Josie Hogan, 10,200 and 12,160 against Ray Sturgess (Sheard's newest partner this year) and 13,460 in the fourth round against Terry Cook, but he must have thought the luck was with him after beating Gary Johnson (Sheard's last partner 1999) in the quarter-finals.

Gary had made 18,670 in the first leg, leaving Ian only a shot at the 100. Sometimes, players think that 100 may be vital but it seldom is. Ian reached 18,250 with two balls left. He contrived a magnificent shot off the cush for 200, and then slotted the last ball home to win by 80.

He made the best of a very difficult table to beat Sheard himself in the semi-final

and only had Sawyer standing in his way in the final.

Sawyer had not reached the standard he set in this event last year. An 11,350 break in the first match against Pete Burton was followed by a 20,060 against Paul Sainsbury, but he seemed to be struggling a little throughout the later stages.

PROFILES

ENGLAND HIERARCHY

ERIC HILL (FERNDOWN, DORSET) Match-fixer, sorry, MATCH ARRANGER EXTRAORDINAIRE. Somehow gets to represent his County in every event, probably because he is their only player. Currently No.69 in the rankings, and by sheer coincidence, has 69 nicknames, his latest being "BAGPUSS" because he looks like a "saggy fat-furry-old-cat-puss".....but only on a really good day.

KEITH LEWENDON (READING)

Back problems keep him upright, but usually only till about 2 30 on the Sunday morning after the match. Nicknamed "SUGAR RAY" after his 1998 Jersey antics, Lew is still No.33 in the rankings and the official team MANAGER but has controversially ordered that, after the humiliating defeat of 1999, there is to be NO SEX before the match for the England players. So if JIM disappears about 8.00 with a lady, he is liable to be disciplined.... Likewise, if MARK disappears... alone!

DAVE BARNES (UPPER HEYFORD, OXON) The All-England SECRETARY, but still insists that "nobody knows OOO-HI-HAM". Specialist subject: SPELLING, just like his predecessor. May get in the team one day...... once we instigate an Over-60's match.

BERNIE McCLUSKEY (READING)

NON-playing captain this year although he would still give anybody a hard game. Winner of 12 major titles (only KT has won more) and 7 of his 14 England games (only KT has played more). This FREDDIE MERCURY lookalike has enjoyed his very own Bohemian Rhapsody in 1999, getting to the final of the Charity Singles, and climbing back up to No.10 in the rankings.

ENGLAND MEN'S "LOWER"ARCHY

KEVIN TUNSTALL (ROKE, OXON)

Very successful captain for many years, but no-one can say that he is now "just a player". Way ahead of everyone else in the rankings and has been so for most of the 90's. May have his tongue shortened so he will be able to say "Thimply the Betht" properly. Winner of 25 major titles and 14 of his 18 England games. Appeared in five finals in 1999, surprisingly only winning two. Even makes his opponent cheer when he misses (see next profile). Always the one to beat in ANY event. "GOD" has a lot of presence, and rumours are that he actually bought one this Christmas.

PETE FARRELLY (RUSHDEN, NORTHANTS) "FAZZA" is still the old man of the team at 47, but managed to win the Sussex Open in 1999, his 6th major in a'LONG career. Promises to NEVER again cheer when his opponent misses (see profile above). Consistency has kept him in the top ten of the rankings throughout the 90's (added to the fact that he devised the system and keeps it up to date). Provisionally up to No.4 for 2001. Winner of 8 of his 11 England games (only KT has won more), and has also drawn twice (i.e. won ONE of 2 legs). Hopes one day to get another go at Micky Daw, the only one to beat him so far, way back in 1985.

PAUL SAINSBURY (TUNBRIDGE WELLS) Perfected the art of losing just about every major final in 1998, but captured the prestigious All-England Individuals in 1999, his seventh major. Has won 7 of his 13 England games, and headed the averages in the County Championships last September despite Berkshire suffering the ignominy of relegation. The "GYPSY ROVER" travels from Kent up to play HOME league games in READING, so the small drive to Horley will seem like a "match in his own back passage", although he hopes it is not a Swan Vestas as that thought brings colour to all his cheeks.

LES GREEN (RAINHAM, KENT)

His only title in 1999 was the Pairs, his
11th major. won half of his 6 England matches. Still keeps saying he is moving to Grease,
but, although Ann could obviously be taken for Olivia Newton-John, he does not look a
bit like John Travolta. If only he played the drums, he would look more like "ANIMAL"
from the Muppets. Get that perm back Les.

JIM MILLWARD (WORTHING, SUSSEX) Kept his England place despite an indifferent year or so on the circuit which has seen him slip in the rankings. His only final since winning the BIOC 1997 (his 3rd major) is a runner-up place in the 1998 Mixed Pairs with "wotsername" A.N. Other. Solid England performer and winner of all but one of his 6 England outings. Has helped many Sussex ladies with their technique, not just the bar billiards players. Nicknamed "YOGI", not only because of his deep voice but because he always brings a bit of a BOO-BOO.

MARK TURNER (LOWER EARLEY, BERKS) Quantum leaps up the rankings by virtue of winning the Charity Singles and Grand Prix Masters in 1999, after only winning one previous event. Won one leg on his England debut last year. Obviously benefiting from leaving Wokingham to join KT at Wallingford. Lot in common with the new Russian President, because when he met his girlfriend, he VLADIMIR PUTIN immediately.

MARK SAWYER (WOKINGHAM, BERKS) Phenomenally high-scoring winner of the Oxfordshire Open in 1999 when he averaged 19,470 in the 12 legs where he got a shot during the day, including seven scores of 20,000+. "Tom Twain" scored 24,760 and 29,000 in the two legs against Sean Lee, and chased KT's 22,070 in the final with 23,700. Could not quite keep up that standard during the year, just reaching one other final. So he still only has three major titles to his name, and has won 1 and drawn 1 of his two previous England games. Little known younger half-brother of Grant and Phil, but much more trustworthy. Well, he is an Estate Agent!

MARK BREWSTER (ROCHESTER, KENT) Rochester-mafia member who performs consistently in every event, yet still awaits that first major after losing in four finals. Firmly established in the rankings and took one leg on his debut last year, and you may still find that first cap under the curls if you look hard enough. Cross between Fozzie Bear and a Womble, cuddly and with the same sense of fashion.

STEVE BIGGS (WYMINGTON, BEDS)

Does well in every event he attends, so it is just as well that he can't play in them all as he much prefers to sell cars on Saturdays. Averaged over 10,000 in the County Championships in 1999 to regain his place in the side. Only two previous caps and the only current player with a 100% record and winner of 4 majors. His wife recently asked for more animation in the bedroom, so Steve went out to buy "The Lion King". She told him that that was not what she had in mind so he got A-ladd-in instead. That worked, the Lad did extremely well and Maggie was happy.

KEVIN GODFREY (OXFORD)

Forced his way into the England team for the first time by virtue of a 100% performance in the County Championship. Not a regular on the circuit but climbing the rankings and is very, very dependable in ANY team. Captained his Oxford A side into the final of the Inter-Area Cup in November. Secret love-child of Burt Reynolds and Marty Feldman, although his brother looks more like a long-lost member of the BeeGees. "Tragedy".

PAUL WING (SOUTHSEA, HANTS)

Long-awaited debut for the only original
Teletubby who had not played for England in the past. "Wingy-Winky" (the one with the
handbag) follows "Walshy", "Lew-Lew" and "Milko" into the side at last. Solid
performances throughout 1999, at least until the AGM when all his proposals were lost. So
annoyed about a recent telephone bill, he has started using 0400 numbers because he heard
they were half the price of 0800 numbers. Needs thinking about.

KEVIN CLARK (ROCHESTER, 1st RES) "Superman" (Clark from Kent, geddit?) is on call in case anyone drops out at short notice, but watch out if he arrives with his underpants over his trousers. KC rarely takes part in major events now as he prefers to stay at home with his "Sunshine Band". Has won 6 majors and 2 of his 4 England games.

GARY JOHNSON (OXFORD, 2nd RES)

Surely ready to add to his one major title at any time. When he is sporting his flat-top hairstyle, and if only he was two feet taller, he would look like Frankenstein in a dim light. If he played every game at the Democrats Club he would be unbeatable. Knows the difference between light and hard, because he CAN go to sleep with a light on....

JERSEY ADMINISTRATION

MICK COTILLARD

If only Mick could bring himself to add another "I" into his surname by deed poll, it would almost rhyme with his favourite pastime..... surely the ONLY thing he would ever have in common with Tony Tagg.

NIGEL BISSON

EXCEPT some slight additios which are all i square brackets: []. Sice Ovember's BIOC, Igel has bee kown as IGEL BISSO as he ofte fails to otice the odd "N" missig from importat words. What a silly cut; see all of the 1999 BIOC sweat-shirts for cofirmatio. What would the "BIOC Ope Competitio" be without Igel? OT MUCH! Fair to say he is THE most popular Jerseyma in Eglish Bar Billiards.

JERSEY MEN'S TEAM

STEVE AHIER (CAPTAIN, ESPLANADE A) Stephen sets a very good example to the other boys and is always smartly turned out, the others are often TURFED out [end of school report]. He is currently averaging over 8,000 in the league and recently made a 14,590 break. Twice British Isles Open Champion and captain of Jersey's defending league champions. [probably most feared Jersey player when he is on form, i.e. only when there is a "d" in the day].

HARRY BARBET (CORINTHIAN A) The "SPIDER" has lost only one league game in the first half of the season and is averaging nearly 6,500. A recent convert to the Ahier/Douglas gin & tonic volunteer brigade, although still awaiting his pips. [Gladys Knight had them standing behind her last time I saw them].

NICK BARNETT (ESPLANADE A)

Runner-up in the 1998 Open and Jersey's very own "STATO". Nick is current number 2 but provisional number 1 in the brand new JBBL rankings. Nick also administers the rankings....[so what is Farrelly doing down at No.8 then]. Still in the frame for the notorious "Bournemouth Binge".

GRAHAM BISSON (LANDMARK INN A) Former Open champion and JBBL Player of the Year 1997/98, Graham is averaging over 8,000 this season. The pints per game calculation is still being worked on, if scientists can put their finger on the missing factor.

DON CADEC (ESPLANADE A)

Recently elected President of the JBBL, the runner-up spot in the 1996 Open signalled a welcome resurgence for Jersey's "Silver Fox". Currently enjoying a 90% success rate in the league despite the perils of travelling to and from the Esso. [Which petrol does this Gentleman of the game use?]

MICK EOUZAN (ESPLANADE A) "Hornblower" is capable of some unbelievable performances [mostly in the pub, and always with his hat on, allegedly], and is averaging over 7,000 this season despite a fair sprinkling of defeats. FRED JEANNE (CASTLE GREEN)

Fred has recently moved into the top dozen in the Jersey rankings, averaging around 6,500 in the league. Although not his first representative match, it IS his first experience of an England trip, so be gentle with him and keep him away from Messrs Cadec and Barnett. [as if....].

BOB KING (UNION INN B)

Bob has enjoyed a successful first half of the season with only one league defeat and an average of around 6,500, but he suffered a painful collapse in form on New Year's Eve (or was it New Year's Day). Ask to see his "Millennium First" certificate from the Ambulance Service.

PETER NOEL (ESPLANADE A)

The current British Isles Open Champion,
Peter picked up the title in November without having won a league match up to that time!
But success breeds success, and he has since recorded a 13,000 break in the league with a
three-match unbeaten run, retaining a top five ranking.

NIGEL RYALL (UNION INN B)

Past Jersey Champion twice and Channel
Island Champion, plus a frequent prize winner at the Open (he "does" the tables). [That is
libellous, so make sure you know who wrote that bit, Nigel]. Waspish performances have
helped maintain his top ten ranking, but maintains an aversion to yellow and black stripes.

PAUL NEWTON (ESPLANADE B) [Reserve who stepped up when Eouzan stayed at home to wash his hat.] The "other" Esplanade player. A 75% win ratio, a 5,000 average and some fine knock-out performances have moved him up the rankings. And another thing...Paul is a Man Utd fan with a Manchester accent!

DICKIE ALLEN (LANDMARK INN A: RES) Dickie has loitered on the fringes of selection for some time and manages to turn in consistently good league performances despite his admitted inclination towards other indoor sports. [Yes, we've heard!]

WE NEVER THOUGHT WE'D SEE THE DAY!

Sabotaged by the blokes who prepare the tables, or just a poor display by the England team, you make your own mind up!

Never before has Jersey got close to defeating the mighty England on their own patch. Four out of 11 was their previous best in 1986, although they managed 5 legs when we agreed to change to LEGS in 1998 "to make the scoreline more respectable".

Two of the tables set up in the window alcoves were VERY difficult and some could say beneficial to Jersey players as they prevented the normally high-scoring England men from achieving big breaks.

Sour grapes, perhaps, but why play these annual matches on tables which suit AWAY teams?

On table 1. Les Green won both his matches with a total of over 18,000. Mark Brewster scored 7,430 in the second leg against Peter Noel, and only Jim Millward really struggled, but Graham Bisson allowed him very little time at the table.

On table 2, Kevin Tunstall and Mark Sawyer won all available points with big

scores, and only Steve Biggs dropped one point in a scrappy 2nd leg.

Tables 3 and 4 were disastrous for England. Table 3 saw debutant Kevin Godfrey only score 2,200 over two legs against late replacement Paul Newton who won with 1,570 and 1,980. Farrelly was disgusted with scores of 1,000 and 2,670 which allowed Dennis Helleur an easy two points for scoring 2,970 and 3,330, and only Paul Wing learned from these earlier games to win with 3,060 and 2,770.

Farrelly could only console his dismay with the knowledge that he started his 2nd leg with the best break of the match ON THAT TABLE, just over 2,000, before failing to add to that with any decisive break as Dennis closed the gap and then pinched the game in the dying minutes.

Table 4 was just as bad. Sainsbury won the first leg against skipper Ahier but Mark Turner had no chance to counter Harry Barbet.

From a positive point of view, there were some nice sandwiches later on.

History was made by Jersey as they RETAINED the trophy as they held it last year. 6-5 down at the half-way stage, they fought like tigers when they saw the problems that the England men were having. Only last-gasp wins for Wing and Green actually accomplished a draw for the home side.

NEW PAIRS WINNERS: SUPERMAN & THE ROOSTER FROM ROCHESTER ADD THEIR NAMES TO LIST OF DYNAMIC DUOS

With so many names engraved on the British Open Pairs Trophy many, many times, it was so nice to see a new pairing get to the final....and then snatch the title from under the noses of FIVE-times winner Kevin Tunstall and FOUR-timer Tony Martin.

It was, arguably, the most riveting final since the four-leg rule was brought in, and it was, without doubt, the highest scoring four leg match in the history of the Pairs event.

There were only SEVEN visits to the table during nearly 90 minutes of top-class bar billiards, Kevin Tunstall making two massive breaks despite ending up on the losing side for the first time in a pairs final.

83.150 points were scored and there was less than 2,000 in it in the final count. So here's how it went......Tunstall was put in and, on a table BOTH pairs had played previously, proceeded to play the table out for 20,350.

Kevin Clark almost did the same but "only" scored 19,010, allowing Tony a brief

look at the table as he potted the 100 shot.

The title seemed to be heading eastwards when Tony only started leg 3 with 600, but Kevin Clark could only mustre 40 in reply. Kevin Tunstall came back to the table and his partner's early miss seemed to have worked in their favour as KT plundered 19,550.

This set Mark Brewster, a loser in all his four previous major finals, a

straightforward task of catching a 21,550 deficit.

Most observers thought he COULD do it "speedwise", but would he be able to hold

himself together under the severe pressure building up in the room.

A nervy start, yes, for the first few minutes, but then he switched to automatic pilot and passed the target with plenty of time to spare. The danger for them was then making a mistake to allow Kevin Tunstall a chance of making a winning clearance.

But he didn't and the bar dropped. Seven of the balls were put away, and your reporter led the applause before Mark could attempt to put the last ball down the 100. Kevin Clark stepped forward and looked as if he may even attempt to pick up his hero.

He didn't, so he must be wiser than he looks. They merely hugged to celebrate

their success.

Both semi-finals had also been decided on aggregate. Brewster was put in by Green and Saville, the latter making it 1-1 by scoring his best break of the week-end. 14,700.

Clark made 15,930 to leave Green needing to win his 4th leg by under 10,000. But when he slipped up on his first break at around 8,000, the 1995/1999 winners were out.

Tunstall made 17,250 after being put in and Scot Lorin Clough won the second leg by taking a 6,710 break. KT made another 12,360 to set the brothers Clough a daunting target in the 4th leg of nearly 25,000. They were eventually happy to make it 2-2, with

Lorin making another 10,520.

That table at home in Perth must be making a difference.

Nice to see three ladies still in the main competition just before dinner on the first day: Janet Burns partnered her old man Andy to a place in the last sixteen before going out to Green and Saville, but it was the scratch duo of Dawn Flattery and Sue Leach who raised most eyebrows. They had two good wins (with Sue making a 5,080 break) before they lost out to Northants' Chris Lawman and Steve Oram.

Also great to see little Steven Sheard reach the last 16 with Pete Phillips, and how

long before we see him climbing up the rankings, with the help of a box or not.

Keith Sheard's pairs record is still seeking improvement. He has lost in the final three times (with three different partners) and was trying to make amends with his FIFTH partner, Ray Sturgess, until losing out to Sawyer and Trinder in only their second match.

Keith says he will stick to Ray next year, and we all wish him well for success.

Bernie McCluskey (three-times champion) and Paul Sainsbury (once winner and three times runner-up) partnered each other for the first time, but Paul's best break of the event was only 9,810. Bernie did the damage until they lost out in the quarters to KT and Tony Martin, but this assured them of the best combined break prize, as other bigger scorers could not qualify due to reaching the semi-finals or better.

One of Bernie's former partners, Paul Yeo, insists he "does not play any more" but made breaks of 17,300 and 11,310 on the way to see him and Sainsbury's old partner

Keith Lewendon into the semi-final of the Plate.

They lost out to Ian Moquet and Geoff Jukes, who went on to beat High Wycombe's Brian Ray and Steve Buckle in a lowish scoring final.

More good performances from the ladies, with Pauline Withey and Diana Welburn

reaching the semis also.

With all these creditable from the girls, it was all the more surprising that a special prize donated by Phil Hawkins for the highest ladies break throughout....was won by Myra, 7,650, with a close second place for Jane Wood (6,850).
