SUE: THREE-TIMES A LADY

Sue Mariner has won the Ladies British Open for the third time, but it is the first title for Sussex as she won the others whilst representing Surrey.

Sue was in tremendous form all day, beating off challenges from Ann Green and Hilary Burford in the early rounds before coming from behind to beat Jan Taylor and Pauline Withey in the next two.

Janie Macoy gave her a worry in the semi-final also, where the eventual difference in scores was only 710, but the final against Bella Stoner was very one-sided, with Sue making a 12,440 break mid-way through the first leg, and had HER break to follow.

Kent and Surrey players have dominated the final placings in this event over the years, with only Myra Hawkins and Pauline Withey, runners-up in 1995 and 1996 respectively, breaking the monopoly.

Holder Gail Woods went out in round two this year, to Surrey colleague Josie Hogan, while Penny Burch fell to the power of Jan Taylor.

But both victors suffered the effects and fell at the next hurdle, Hogan to Jenny Parsons and Taylor to eventual champion Mariner.

Bella Stoner leaps 40 places to no. 21 in the rankings and Kim Beeching closes in on Jan Taylor at the top.

KEVIN'S UMPTIENth TITLE

England's undisputed No.1 Kevin Tunstall captured his third Mermain/Wessex Open without raising sweat.

He did not have to play at his best but always managed to do enough to keep his head above water, and his scores ahead of whatever opposition came his way.

The Final was a case in point: he won the toss and asked his great rival Keith Sheard to have first crack.

Sheard, still at No.2 in the rankings but provisionally SEVEN for next year, started modestly, reaching 8,000 in regulation pace of just in excess of 1,000 per minute. But then, as usual, he gathered pace to reach 10,000 in under 9½ mins.

Disaster struck when he left the red ball on the back edge of the 50 from the split at 11,100 because, although he played in-off, the red whipped round the 30-pocket and rested centrally right behind the 10-hole.

After a pause for thought, he seemed to have played a perfect bend around the 10-hole, but a slight roll off caused the cue ball to hit the 10 hole and MISS.

Kevin stepped up and played the same shot, but his luck was in and, although he missed the 10-hole, the ball just clipped the object ball and, 90 seconds later he had retrieved the cue ball for the break back.

He looked to be struggling at first, missing the break, but eventually scored 1,030 from a missing both balls on a split shot.

Keith made 320 before Kevin returned for another 1,430 to the end.

Already 2,460 - 320 ahead, Kevin started leg 2 with a solid 10,280. Keith paid two

visits before Kevin ended with another 6,270.

But whereas Keith had made a 20,030 break in the third round against Thomas Ellis-Rees, Kevin proved a saying borrowed and amended from the game of darts: **"It's big breaks for show, numerous tournament victories for dough!"**

Not that Kevin didn't make big breaks himself during the day, well one anyway. After a first round walk-over against no-show Steve Minihane, he set an 18,950 target for ex-pairs partner Pete Lee (scorer of a 17,650 break in the first round himself) and must have been slightly worried as he watched Lee come back with 16,330.

14,120 and 8,110 totals against in-form Janet Burns (who had scored four big ones to reach the last 16) was followed by a tough tussle against old war-horse Farrelly. On what was reckoned to be a tough table, Fazza started with a 6,880, only to have to watch KT come back with 9,080 and then a winning start to the 2nd leg. Lucky b.....!

The semi-final was downright weird. Geoff Jukes struggled slightly more than KT on table one and the aggregates over the two legs were 7,370 - 4,440.

Jukes had had his best day in a ranking event for some time, beating holder Gary Johnson in the 1st, making a 14,720 break against Barry Radford in the 2nd, an 11,380 break against Steven Sheard in the 3rd, and getting the better of Steve Biggs in the last 8.

Young Sheardy went on to pick up his first GRAND PRIX point (good job his dad got some aswell) and a Special Junior Meritorious Award for getting to the last 16.

Event promoter Wayne Steere did his duty by losing in the first round (I can't abide these promoters who insist on doing well in their own event) to Myra Hawkins.

Myra went on to put the wind up Farrelly who managed a final break of 3,000 in the dying minutes to win by 540. It saved Phil Hawkins having to play his wife. In that one, Farrelly built up a first leg lead against Phil and then played out the 2nd for an 18,120 break, his BEST FOR YONKS!

The best first round clash promised to be the one between England team-mates Mark Turner and Steve Biggs. Although it was on the infamous table 1, Biggs came back from 8,300 down to beat Mark with a 9,600 opener to leg 2.

Chris Saville beat Steve Huntley in the Plate final after feeling ill in the first leg. He made a sound 8,630 break in the 2nd.

FAZZA DOES IT AGAIN, AND HE'S STILL "ONLY" 47

There is life in the old dogs yet! Proof on that was given when Pete Farrelly beat fellow old-codger Graham Bisson in the Sussex Open final in Worthing.

Farrelly became only the *third* player ever to retain a major Open tournament in England. Last year he won his first National event since the 1993 All-England Individuals just a couple of hours before his 47th birthday, not daring to expect that he would be able to retain the trophy a couple of days before celebrating his 48th.

But that is just what he achieved!

Only Kevin Tunstall (Charity Singles 91,92 and 93) and John Burrows (Oxfordshire Open 97 and 98) had previously won any Open in successive years.

It lifted him back to No.6 in the rankings and is now in the heady No.3 position in the provisional table for next year.

Yet, much of the day's admiration was rightly reserved for Jersey's Graham Bisson, who led an powerful contingent of NINE who honoured the event with their presence. He became the first Channel Islander to reach the final of any event in England, the previous best being Ronnie Rebours finishing 4th in the All-England Individuals many years ago.

It is fair to say that Graham was not in a prolific scoring mood (his best leg score being only 8,970) but he is so difficult to beat that it did not matter. He is now at an amazing No.14 in the rankings, the highest ever placing for any Jersey player, justifying his decision to make the effort to take part in the tournament.

Wins over Lorraine Hill and Kevin Stoner brought a top score of only 5,510 but raised his play for a 6,580 to beat Stuart Mephram in the last 16. Another step up to 8,970 in the quarter-finals just saw off No.17 ranked Paul Wing.

Nigel Senior, a shock winner over Keith Sheard (more of that later), unluckily lost his opening 4,000 break in the semi-, allowing Bisson a chance to build a good first leg lead, and a phenomenal 2nd leg win by 10,340 - 6,710 for Senior was never enough.

Meanwhile, Farrelly was building confidence all day. Having recently played what is likely to be his LAST MATCH FOR NORTHANTS (more of that elsewhere in this BBQ), he had felt that confidence was to be the most important factor during the morning matches.

A solid first leg lead in the first round against Sue Mariner's "little sister" Heather allowed Fazza the safety of going for a really big break in the second leg. Even though he pushed too much and lost 9,000, he was cueing well and through to meet Myra Hawkins.

Having only narrowly beaten her in the Mermaid, Farrelly was not giving anything away. Breaks of 7,970, 8,080 and 10,870 showed his confidence was growing.

It was the infamous "Table 9" next. It was the "club" table and was not covered in the normal baise. The speed of the "cloth" was frighteningly fast and had already seen the shock exits of Paul Sainsbury, Jim Millward and Roy Clough in the handful of games played on it. Farrelly had expected to face Steve Mariner but he had lost to 1997 Mermaid Open champion Gary Johnson's 16,800 break.

Gary settled in well at the start for about 3,500 but the scoring reduced dramatically in the next couple of visits each. Johnson then played a wild shot considering the speed of the table. A ball whipped out the 50 and rebounded back to the black pin. Gary seemed to suffer from the shock and never really recovered.

Fazza made his highest break of the day in the last 16. Roger Taylor won the toss and Fazza set a target of 17,750, only missing the last ball. Then came old adversary Les Green. The start was a struggle but Farrelly came off best in the first leg 7,070 - 710. Green made a great recovery and sailed ahead but gave Farrelly one last chance. It seemed

too late when the bar dropped with 560 still needed from the last 6 white balls. Somehow, enough score was contrived and Farrelly won on the last ball by 50.

They don't come much tougher than Les, unless you then have to face Mr Tunstall. Winner of so many events, and so far ahead in the rankings that he could probably retire for two years and still stay at No.1. Kevin had a score to settle after last year's abysmal Sussex Open final.

He had already made breaks of 10,390, 14,830, 16,730, 14,850, 14,400 and 17,910 in ten legs, and looked supremely confident as he reached a another of 16,340 but then crucially allowed Farrelly to the table for the last minute of so. Although not much scoring was done, the time was vital as it allowed Farrelly to take his time in the second leg. He timed his break to perfection, completely sweeping up for 17,220, his second 17,000 run of the day, and not too bad for an old 'un.

Fazza is one of the players who is NEVER fazed by Kevin but absolutely glows when the chance comes to beat him. That is surely a compliment to KT, but Farrelly has beaten him in all three of the Opens that he has won, including a memorable quarter-final victory in the 1991 Wessex.

Kevin will be waiting for sweet revenge!

So the holder carried his Nation's hopes in the final against the visitor from the Channel, although as Steve Mariner stated just before the start, he simply could not afford to lose.

Graham was very disappointing at the start, and hardly troubled the scorers, but the same could be said for Farrelly who scored each time but lost most of it on similar shots. He found the middle of the table strangely slow and kept leaving the split shot short of the 100. Each time, either missing the ball or felling the pin. Eventually, more by luck than skill, he registered a few small breaks and built a 5,500 first leg lead.

By then, he was so determined, it was not unexpected that he would clinch it in one second leg visit, and so it turned out. 9,000 was more than enough.

The other Jersey players were not as successful, with only reigning BIOC Champion Peter Noel and his daughter Jenny winning their first games. But the visitors could certainly find something to celebrate, seeing that fine achievement by Graham.

President Don Cadec promised more Jersey representatives in 2001 in his address at close of play, also announcing that this year's BIOC would be regarded as a World Championship.

There were some memorable matches earlier in the tournament. None more so than Nigel Senior, a solid local player but well outside to top 100 in the rankings, coming back from 15,180 down against Keith Sheard with a career-best 16,410 break.

Kevin Clark failed to score in the first round match against Sheard and then left before playing in the Plate. Paul Sainsbury scored 3,210 and 1,210 on "table 9" but still left before the Plate.

Les Green had to beat his wife Ann in the first round, but the Police were not called!!!

On paper, the closest match in the draw promised to be Barry Holt against Lorin Clough, the latter being one place below Holt in the rankings. Holt won comfortably but Lorin reached the semi-final of the Plate, getting enough score bonuses on the way to catch Barry and they are now coincidentally totally level at No.56.

Alison Shilling reached the last 16 with two good wins and a 3,730 break, and then beat Sheard in the first leg of the next before taking her place at the bar for the rest of the day.

Steve Mariner, a former Open Champion, won the Plate against Geoff Jukes.

*No.4 for KEVIN....but it's
his 1st for OXFORD*

Kevin Tunstall has drawn level with Bernie McCluskey's record FOUR All-England Indiv titles.

Kevin's previous three were for his first love, Herts (in 1980 v Keith Akers [where he now?]) and his adopted summer county Berkshire (1994 & 1996).

He has to join everyone's list of all-time greats, a list that already includes his successor as England team captain Bernie, winner of this most prestigious individual competition four times between 1978 and 1990.

He did not put a foot (or cue) wrong all day from seeing off his first opponent, unranked Mick Wright (Surrey) with breaks of 12,100 and 9,800.

The dangerous floater, Barry Radford (ranked 60 from Portsmouth), was next for the kill. Kevin played it out for 18,450, the best break of the day, but only just won the 2nd leg 8,230 - 7,450, to crucially make it 5-0 again.

Real top-class opposition followed at last as Kevin met his team-mate, [not only at local and area level, but also at England level,] Mark Turner, still representing Berkshire this year, but soon to join Kevin in the Oxfordshire line-up, and already at No.8 in the rankings.

No disrespect to the other players, but it is always difficult in a group where there are only TWO main contenders. The match between them is SO vital as the loser cannot rely on the others taking points off the opponent, whereas if there are many top names in the group, strange things can happen.

Mark won the first leg 11,190 - 1,850 and then hoped Kevin fluffed early. He hoped in vain..... as he watched his hopes fade away into the distance.

Mark could then only keep his fingers crossed that Eric Hill, now ranked 76 and representing his new County DORSET(shire) [in joke, ed], could somehow take both legs off Kevin.

It did not happen.....

The final was a touch one-sided as Kevin tasted blood.

Jim Millward, ranked only 25 now, was representing Sussex for the first time since 1982 [just able to reach the table from his pram, well he does not look that old..... SOUNDS it, but does not LOOK it],

Put in first, Jim whipped out of the 50 on the "one-up" at 1,850 and Kevin soon retrieved optimum position. The scorer (me) was staggered when Kevin played the break far too thick and only scored 460.

60 for Jim, 220 for Kevin and he had missed another good chance, as memories of his pathetic display in the 1999 Sussex Open flooded back, [well it doesn't happen that often].

60 more for Jim before Kevin started closing the coffin with a 6,350 break. There were still four minutes left when Jim scored another 130, and Kevin another 60.

When Jim lost a small break of 160 with the first pin of the game it seemed he had resigned already. Kevin made another 2,840 and Jim potted the last ball to take his tally to 2,200.

Kevin therefore had a lead of 7,730 going into the 2nd leg with his break likely to knock home the last nail.

But not quite as Kevin made 5,550 in 6 minutes before leaving the one-up short. Jim needed just over 13,000 in 11 minutes, but when he missed at 350 he graciously conceded to the master.

Jim's progress to the final had proved dodgy anyway.

He beat Northants' unranked Simon Coleman [suffering from a bad hangover if there is such a thing] with a 12,870 break, but then lost 3-2 to group favourite Les Green (No.3 from Kent).

With Les then beating out-of-touch Phil Buckle (No. 63, Cambridge) 5-0, it looked tough for Jim. But when he slaughtered pointless Phil while Les lost 3-2 to late entrant Ernie Jordan it was all very close again.

Bucks' little ol' Ernie was there to support Dawn Flattery in the Ladies Open and Terry Isard was there to support Darren in the Under-22's, but Bucks champion Alan Donovan could not make it and they tossed for the chance of playing in the big one.

Ernie, at No.33 in the rankings, was on 13 points, Jim 12 and Les 10 so if Jim beat Ernie 3-2 and Les beat Simon 5-0, they would have all won 3/4 and it was all down to aggregates where Jim had excelled so far.

It soon became apparent that Les would not get the required aggregates on a tricky table and actually lost the first leg anyway.

Ernie had battled (as is his wont) to a 8,330 - 3,190 first leg lead as it became apparent that the winner of his game would progress to the final.

But Jim's a bit of a battler too, and he scored 12,650 in the second leg.

What I said earlier about having more than two top players in a group was illustrated well here as Les has beaten Jim 3-2 earlier but did not do enough against the others.

The Oxford "Blues" out-gunned the Witney and Eynsham "Jades" to take the first ever T.V. Team Trophy in front of the cameras at Kidlington.

Jon was not happy because he wanted the break in the last leg, but that's Jon. The referee's decision was final and he went back to his box to explain about the players' "experience" again.

It was, as expected, a very nervy start on a VERY downhill table, purposely set that way by Kevin Tunstall and "one other" so that play was not too boring. Jane Wood knew the ONE-UP had to be thin to get the red in the right position but played it far too thin and firm, so pinned her best chance.

Pauline Withey just came out on top.

Max Dick soon made it 2-0, using all that "experience" mustered over, well I don't know, about 80 years(?), to make a 4,500 break including some VERY good shots. Terry Cook is NOT renowned for speed, so 3,500 in 2½ minutes was too much to counter.
