TONY WALSH BACK "IN FOCUS"

After a long period away from the BBQ headlines due to a serious eye illness, the likeable Tony Walsh, who looks more like "Cosmo Smallpiece" every time we see him, has won the Oxfordshire Open for the first time.

To coin a phrase from Cosmo, Tony said KNICKERS to all his opponents by kicking them all in the KNACKERS and confound all his KNOCKERS over the years.

(Anyone who does not remember Les Dawson at his best can delete the fast paragraph from their mind.)

Tony jumped ten places in the rankings and will surely be back in the top 20 soon, but he hardly looked likely to win the first event of 2001 at the start of the day. He struggled to bear Oxford unknown Graham Baldwin before turning it on against fellow Reading stalwart Phil Hawkins. But he also found himself 4,000 down against Tony Even in the third round.

The way he beat Dave Alder in the last 16 continued to dis-count him from the list of possible winners, but that assessment drastically changed when he came back from 6,260 - 7,730 down with a 2nd leg 10,460 against Keith Sheard.

A semi-final against Kevin Tunstall could only go one way.........or not! Tony made a 5,200 break in the first leg on a tricky table but Kevin made a sound 7,320 to lead 7,650 - 6,020 at the halfway stage.

KT's 6,220 break and TW's 8,760 in the second leg left Kevin just 20 ahead when the bar dropped, but he uncharacteristically missed his chance to clear up. Tony (almost) calmly potted the last few balls to win by 200.

The final against World Champion Bernie McCluskey was a VERY tight game after two visits each, Tony had 1,850 and Bernie only 60. Tony then seemed to have settled but he lost his 4,000 break when his shot at a half on the right of the 10 hole veered away.

After a few more visits to the table, Tony only led 2,200 - 990 but he made a vital 1,830 break to close the first leg.

Bernie could only make 1,150 at the start of the 2nd, and Tony composed himself like he has so many times in the 1990's to make a slow 7,640 allowing him to come off after 12 minutes of the leg with enough to assure himself of victory

The Plate final was played on a higher-scoring table between two players both in their first National Competition final. Syl Murphy made a 7,640 break to win the first leg by 5,000, but Website expert Kevin Pringle made a 9,470 break to clinch the prize

Highest point of the early rounds was "Rooster" Mark Brewster c(l)ocking up a break of 13,850 in 10% minutes against Alec Hastings. His final leg score was 20,450, only overshadowed by Paul Wing's 20,970 against Chas Gildersleve

INTERNATIONAL MATCH 2001

ENGLAND MEN PROFILES

I had been asked to imput into for the Official Programme but Nigel and Co "chickened out" of using my comments about England players as they were IOO LONG. I am printing them here in normal type, together with parts of Nigel's additions in italic script.

KEVIN TUNSTALL (OXON, CAPT): The genius, the master, the boss, is back as skipper. Not only the game's No.1 but currently holder of MORE THAN TWICE as many ranking points as anyone else. Winner of thirty major events, including two British Opens. But his most memorable moment was winning his 4th All-England title last year, equalling the achievements of Bernie McCluskey ten years earlier. His biggest disappointment was losing to Wayne Poingdestre in the semi-final of Jersey of 1987 after losing a match-winning 3.000 break. This Postman is still only 43 years young but been playing since he was 9, competitively since the tender age of 13. BERNIE McCLUSKEY (BERKS): After winning the World Championship, he is back in the ranks and loses his status as "non-playing captain". This 47yo Mechanical Foreman (I said he was Bionic) has been playing for 30 years and lists his best achievement as winning the British Open in 1985, and biggest disappointment as agreeing to partner Paul Sainsbury in the Pairs, closely followed by NOT putting £20 on Lennox Lewis and Evander Holyfield to draw their match at odds of 40-1. Bernie supports West Ham Utd, so was "quite pleased" recently when they beat Man Utd in the Cup. No 11 in the latest rankings. Oh, and don't mention his likeness to Freddie Mercury!

LES GREEN (KENT): Could this be his last year playing for England? Will Greece take part in a triangular event next year? These are questions which nobody is asking. Les and Ann plan to emigrate in July... and we will miss Ann very much.... Les is 42, looks older and has been playing for 24 years. He is a Motorway Communications Technician which, he says, does NOT involve laying tar. Best moment? Definitely beating Kevin. Worst? Losing to Kevin, but more specifically missing out to John Burrows in the last 16 of the Charity Singles 1992. Whilst chasing 13,000, he fell 3,000 short when a ball had three goes at going down the 30 hole to keep him in the hunt and still stayed up. Will his Grecian 2000 become Grecian 2001.

KEITH SHEARD (OXON): Always cool, calm and collected by the anti-moan police. You can always tell how he is feeling, that's why we love him. Back in the side after a self-imposed two year absence, in which time he has won the British Open, a feat achieved by harnessing his natural aggressive style of play. Yet his best achievement is listed as producing two kids. (Was it that much of a struggle, Keith? There is always Viagra these days). Worst moment? Pinning a 19,000 break whilst chasing 21,000 to allow Farrelly to famously put down his ham roll and clinch the 1993 All-England. Only other interest... watching sport on TV. One day surely this 45yo (ranked 3) will allow himself to become like the milk he delivers every day... silver top, until then the wig will have to do!

At his happiest when things are not going quite right.

PETE FARRELLY (NORTHANTS): Covering bassle-free bar billiards. Pete has now switched allegiance to the Eynsham league in Oxford just over 50 miles from home, where his side is on par with the top first division sides, having won 8 out of 9, and plans to make his debut in the Eynsham A side shortly. Still playing in the Northants league aswell, which he ran for 19 years, but decided to withdraw from the county side when they turned their. back on their best player, Steve Biggs, Insurance is the "secondary" business of this grandad of the side. Started playing accidentally in 1974 when the skittle table was despatched from the pub, not so sprightly now at 48, but knows how to use a cue under pressure. Has won the All-England, the British Pairs with Biggsy three times, as well as the Wessex Open and Sussex Open (twice), each time having to beat Mr Tunstall on the way. Still rates his best achievement as winning the final of the 1984 Pairs, chasing Keith Sheard's 20,890 in the final with a 21,030 break, and being picked up off the floor with a bear-hug by Biggsy. Worst moment? Probably the 1986 Pairs final when the bar dropped 159 minutes early with Steve at the table, losing to Bernie and Will Leary by 1,720 on aggregate. Peggy has remained his backbone and soul-mate for over 25 years now, but had to be talked into coming this weekend. How's that for support! Other interests listed as statistics, playing tenpin bowling (league and cup winners 2000) and going to live athletics, snooker and cricket. One of a handful who has remained in the top ten since inception of the ranking system in 1991 (well he does keep all the stats) and still at No.5.

Works in insurance in his spare time, so did Emil Savundra.

STEVE BIGGS (NORTHANTS): Not now playing at County level (see Farrelly) but still good enough for England, strange that! This 47 year old Garage Proprietor has played for 25 years but now only plays league on odd occasions, due to the call of the snooker table on Monday nights. Most of his games now confined to his own bedroom, and just to explain that, he has his own table in the spare room. Married to Maggie for many years with two grown-up kids, the eldest being a drummer in a Madness tribute band (not a lot of people know that either). Also enjoys tenpin bowling, car shows and magazines (car magazines that is). Lists his greatest achievement as winning the Charity Singles in 1995, presumably because he did not have the help of Farrelly for all those Pairs titles. Greatest disappointment was losing the vital deciding leg in the Team Championship in November which would have put the Compasses through to the final, the best achievement by any Northants side in the history of the competition.

MARK TURNER (OXON): Another one to change counties recently, now playing under the guidance of Kevin in Wallingford. Baby of the team, this 30 year old project manager in the software industry has been used recently as a spy working in Jersey, returning home at weekends to help plan for the wedding of the year in August. Anyone wanting an invitation can simply ask Mark and he will tell you where to go. One of the nice guys, has been playing for 12 years and likes playing golf and watching football. Best moment: winning the Grand Prix final in 1999, worst was losing to Jim Millward in the County Championship. Ranking soured to 7.

Spying in Jersey seems to be limited to lager-fuelled Wednesdays at the Esplanade.

PAUL WING (HANTS): Along with Mark Turner, the player with the least Bar Billiards experience of only 12 years. He is a 34yo taxi driver, so tends to talk over his left shoulder to you, even when YOU are at the table. Also watches all sport on TV, hence the Teletubby paunch. Has 2 kids and four step-children with Linda. Most memorable moments listed as getting called up for England last year and winning the Portsmouth singles for the first time in 1999/2000. Worst is losing in the first round to Chris Gregory in 2000/2001 Up to No.9 in the rankings, an all-time high.

BARRY HOLT (SUSSEX): The only new face in the line-up, and when the team was announced, most said "Barry who?" but he had a tremendous spell at the end of 2000, taking him No.10 (not politically, you understand), third in the averages for the County Championships behind only Keith and Kevin winning all four matches, losing in the final to Kevin in the Alternative Rules, losing to eventual runner-up Bob King in the 5th round in Jersey, and 4th in the averages at the Team Championships winning all three matches. In the building trade all his life, currently a site manager, this 39yo has been playing for 18 years. He won the Southern Counties 6 years ago, but his game started picking up when

he introduced the "split" into his repertoire only three years ago. Plays in Worthing, and Littlehampton, yet he is married with a 7yo and a 4yo, well done despite that:

GEOFF JUKES (SURREY, RESERVE): Geoff's been playing for 30 years, yet he swears he is still only 29. Obviously the only fitness fanatic in the team...he swims, cycles and runs. He has completed 8 marathons, 4 triathlons, many half-marathons and 10k runs. Easily the best moment was captaining the Flying Scud to the National Team Championships in 1976, a side which contained players of the "class" of Dave Constable and Rod Smith. He lists his worst moment as being divorced in 1994. Many would say that was the best!

Shortly to attempt the highly dangerous Bounty Bar /Wagon Wheel Highlon.

ENGLAND LADIES PROFILES

PAULINE WITHEY (OXON, CAPT): The perfect captain, and very successful since taking over, she has endured stupid and unnecessary criticism from certain people who know so little. This wages/accounts clerk has unbelievably been playing for 26 years and lists her best achievement as losing out by just 500 to Jan Taylor in the 1994 All-England. Her biggest disappointment was unluckily black-pinning against Josie Maughan in the 1994 International, but typically Pauline seeked and gained revenge the following year. Ranked No.5 and is always there when ladies prizes are awarded in any Open event. Fasty going, at least until the lat is pulled.

KIM BEECHING (SUSSEX): Very dedicated to the game, and it shows. Unbeaten in four games since coming into the England team. Won the 1999 All-England by beating Jan Taylor and Pauline Withey in the group, and Myra Hawkins in the final. This "Battler from Hastings" is now at No.4 in the rankings.

It is a shame her grandpa closed all those railways.

GAIL WOODS (SURREY): Classy player not seen often enough in big events but still retains No.3 status. Never lets you down. Only International defeat was against Tina Murphy in 1995, where she lost by just 410 points.

Fragile looks belie her gritty determination on the table.

JAN TAYLOR (KENT): The Kevin Tunstall of the ladies game, but better looking.

Outright, undisputed No.1, and would be further ahead if she travelled more. Only
International defeat was against Josie Maughan in 1993...and not likely to lose many more times.

A half-term treak in Jersey is a reward for some "discipline" work in the class.

SUE MARINER (SUSSEX): Another top player back in the side after finishing 11th in the MEN'S County Championships, but again chooses not to travel much, the only reason why she has slipped to No.12 in the rankings. Surely Steve could be encouraged to look after the kids more!

Jersey tables usually mean prizes.

JERSEY MEN PROFILES

NIGEL & CO SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PURPOSES OF EXPECTED LAWSUITS.

STEVE AHIER (ESPLANADE, Capt): Steve recently made a break in excess of 17,000 in the league, followed by a pint of Bass, a Gin & Tonic and a lamb biriani. Jersey's yardstick of quality over the past few years.

HARRY BARBET (CORINTHIAN): Spider, spider burning bright, still trying to give up the fags. Mercurial player, ranked 13 in Jersey, but would be higher if he played regularly on a half decent table.

NICK BARNETT (ESPLANADE): JBBL "Stato" and part-time shirt model (small to medium, AA Cup). Nick is currently our No.2 player, knocking in big breaks all season and former Open runner-up.

GRAHAM BISSON (LANDMARK): Current Jersey and C.I. Champion. Sometime golf companion of the "Shotgun", of whom he says "I've seen better swings in a condemned playground".

ROD LANGLOIS (TRINITY ARMS): A former Jersey and CI Champion from way back.

Sparky is enjoying an overdue return to form, with 9th place in the Jersey Masters list.

ALAN LE BLOND (CASTLE GREEN): A previous Open champion and currently ranked No.6. Fledgling slaphead and misguided Football fan (Leeds Utd).

MIKE MATTHEWS (LANDMARK): Averaging 5,000+ in the Landmark side challenging for the First Division title, and on course for a place in the top 16 Masters. Founder member of the "Slapheads Against Racism" movement.

JERSEY LADIES PROFILES

JENNY NOEL (ESPLANADE, Capt): Undisputed Jersey No.1. Bar billiards is her "forty". For Jersey she shows fortytude, and fortyfies the whole team. Recently celebrated a big birthday but we cannot say which one.

JILL BARBET (CORINTHIAN): Ranked No.4 but suffers from a lack of competitive action, being content to watch over the weekly "Ginfest" that is the Corinthian fixture list. She plays in the gallon, Spider and Co drink it.

JACKIE CLARK (ESPLANADE): Jersey No.5, provisionally No.4, Jackie regularly "performs" at the Esso in the Second Division and also plays away.

JENNY GORVEL (ESPLANADE): Likes running, 'cause it burns up the calories generated by her other hobby - drinking. Just getting back into regular competitive bar billiards and climbing the rankings.

HEATHER HAMON (STAR): Ranked No.6 and is turning in some useful league performances despite suffering George May's notorious rotation policy.

ANGIE PHILLIPS (ESPLANADE): Reserve Angie is (by her own admission) still learning the ropes. The holsters, whips, leather boots and chocolate body paint are still to come.

The Jersey team celebrated a third successive victory in the Annual Challenge Match and no-one can deny that they deserved it.

They led in EIGHT of the matches when the sandwiches were devoured, although England's chances still seemed 50-50 with Steve Biggs (4,600 down), Paul Wing (7,970 down) and Bernie McCluskey (6,100 down) all with their breaks to come.

In the first series after the break, Harry Barbet gave Jersey the edge by overturning Les Green's 5,700 lead with a FANTASTIC 10,360 initial break. Biggs failed to take advantage of having the break and under-hit his first one-up, paying the penalty by

not having another shot, standing back to watch Nigel Ryall notch up a SUPER-FANTASTIC 11,990.

2-0 down, England needed a big effort in the 3 legs of series 2 and got it!

Re-instated captain Kevin Tunstall was at his best, even by his own high standard.

Nick Barnett had a 5,540 lead and stretched that by another 1,880 before giving KT the sniff of a chance. He always seemed up for it and rolled home a magnificent 12,350 break.

Mark Brewster was secure in his win over Rod Langlois, but all eyes were on an adjacent table as Jim Millward attempted an unbelievable comeback against the master,

Steve Ahier.

Ahier had led by just 3,680 but made 4,080 at the start of the second leg. Jimbo was far from secure but somehow managed to conjure up all the required shots, including

a highly difficult one after the bar dropped, to win by 620.

World Championship runner-up Bob King was not at his best and had lost a big break in the 1st leg to allow old codger Farrelly a handy 3,660 lead. When yours truly made an opening 4,000 in the second, the game seemed fairly safe but Bob thought differently and slotted into gear.

But once he had lost a 4,000 by going too fast, Bob's late surge was far too late. The upward thoughts of Mark Turner at half-time were to be commended, but he could not quite put it into practice as he won the 2nd leg 4,940 - 2,630 but failed to overturn Mike Matthews' 3,060 lead.

Paul Wing was visibly disappointed to fail in an England shirt for the first time.

One of the few successes of the 2000 match was overshadowed by Alan Le Blond in the first leg and could only make up a small portion of his close on 8,000 deficit.

So it was 4-4 with three to play.

Nerves were jangling, everyone could hear them.....

Keith Sheard was 4,990 down to Dennis Helleur but took a long time to settle in the 2nd leg with so much pressure on, and a very inexperienced scorer (i.e. Farrelly).

That scorer seemed very slow in standing up Dennis' pin as the time ticked away. "Politely" asked to "hurry up" by Mr Sheard, I then sat goggled eyed as Keith showed his best to creep home by 340.

Debutant Barry Holt always seemed under the cosh, unlucky to draw the power of

Graham Bisson.

So, in effect, it all came down to the match between the last two British Isles Open Champions, veteran Peter Noel and apprentice veteran Bernie McCluskey.

Bernie, who does not have the best England record and last year's captain, trailed by 6,100 and fx/ cx/ messed-up his initial break and many more chances. Although he won the leg by 1,520, it was well short of the requirement.

Summing up, each game was close with EIGHT going one-leg each. However, the final difference was achieved by 2-0 wins for Jersey by Nigel Ryall and Graham Bisson

while only Farrelly could win both his legs for England.

Your BBQ editor had predicted a 7-4 England victory when the draw was made, and Jim's win should have made it 8-3, but Jersey's heroes were Harry, Mike and Alan to overturn that scoreline from the one so humbly predicted.

Competition for places in both 2002 teams will be great.

Let me now predict an 8-3 scoreline!!!!!!!!

......And I will leave you to decide which way you think I think it will go.

ENGLAND LADIES MAKE UP FOR THE MEN AGAIN

Pauline Withey picked up the winners' plate as she has every year since 1994, and confirmed herself as the most successful International captain in bar billiards, if not in ANY sport.

Only Kim Beeching lost the first leg for England, and that only because the lost a match winning break. But it showed the spirit of the players instilled by Pauline in the way Kim marched back with a convincing overall victory.

I suppose it was a little surprising that Sue Mariner and Pauline herself lost their 2nd legs, but not by enough to change the overall result.....5-0.

It is unfair simply to say Sue Mariner won, as it was a true dog-fight against Jersey's top lady player. Jenny Noel. Sue had made a 2,920 break in the first leg to lead by 3,170, but Jenny made a 3,860 break in the 2nd as well as Sue having another run of 3,360 to finish up just 1,240 ahead.

BRITISH OPEN PAIRS 2001

The other? Bernie McCluskey and Will Leary in 1985 and 1986 (although they will always have to count themselves lucky as 1986 is the only FOUR-leg final to go to aggregate scores and they only won by 1,720 against a very heroic young pair from Northamptonshire who rightly clained that the bar had dropped early....but you've heard enough of that story before).

Possibly the pressure of trying to retain the title caused Kevin and Mark to have a slowish start, just doing enough to get through, but Mark hit form in the 4th round against Penny Burch and Myra Hawkins when, already 7,000 ahead, he made a 17,600 break. He also needed calmness in the quarterfinal against Mark James and Gareth Lloyd when he needed and potted the last ball.

The semi-final, over 4 legs as usual, went to the Rochester boys against the unique Berks/Dorset partnership of Phil Hawkins and Eric Hill but only 6,920 - 6,210. Kevin at last made a mark with a 9,350 break to give them a 2-0 lead.

Eric gave his "many Dorset supporters" a boost with a 8,770 break in leg 3 to take it into the 4th leg, but they had to win it by 5,200 to take the aggregate. Mark's 7,220 put paid to that although Phil made a brave effort with 5,900 of his own.

The final would surely be only the second four-leg pairs final to go to aggregate!

The class of the players would surely see to that!?!

Bernie easily built up a massive break in the 1st leg but crazily lost it all at 13,750, allowing the Kent boys to win with a meagre 480.

Mark scored a 12,740 break to make it 2-0, but the Berkshire pair won the 3rd leg easily to take it to a 4th. Kevin, already holding a 4,040 lead overall, opened with 8,050 and, despite Bernie's consolation 7,790, it was still 4,300 short of success, and 260 short of making the aggregate count.

Can I now remind Bernie that he stated when interviewed for the International that the worst moment of his career was agreeing to partner Mr Sainsbury!

Perhaps he should try to get Will Leary back on the scene.

Changing fortunes was the theme of the tournament....

Bill Trinder, a past winner with Mark Sawyer, made a covid 8,910 in 14½ minutes to oust three-times winners Steve Biggs and Pete Farrelly in the first round, and then he and partner Steve Blain made an average of just 3,100 and a top score of 6,980 in the next three rounds before losing to Hawkins and Hill in the last eight.

Paul Wing made a 17,760 and a 12,770, and he and partner Tony Woolvin another score of 16,870 before a string of stangely minimal scores (960, 320 and 500) took them

out.

Ex-Wokingham and now Hampshire pair Alan Chaloner and Dennis Claydon made breaks of 11,700 and 12,660 respectively and would have been in contention for the old highest combined break award, but the Committee had withdrawn the prize at the AGM in favour of a "Merit Award", won by Pete Phillips and Steven Sheard, who beat Tony Walsh and Tony Martin.

The latter was partnering Walsh as his usual partner (KT) missed the weekend to

concentrate on his house move

Will Keith Sheard ever win the Pairs? If Mike Walton had not lost a small but vital 2,500 break at a vital stage, Keith and Ray Sturgess may not have even got through the first round, but the "well-known Oxfordshire pair" of Ian Moss and Alan Oliver saw them off in the second.

Past winners Les Green and Chris Saville beat youngsters Daniel & Darren Woolvin in the first, but Paul Wing and the senior Woolvin (Tony) put them out in round 2.

two visits, and then lost another 50. Mark, after two NILS, finally troubled the scorers

Kevin got the break back after 5 painful minutes and made 1,370 before coming inside on the one-up. Mark made 200. Kevin had another go at the break and made 3,440 to raise his score to a heady 4,910. Mark pinned 30 and began to think that he must have kicked the cat.

KT had another try at the break with less than 5 minutes to play in the first leg and made 2,900. Mark missed again. KT 50, MT 70, KT 0, MT 0, KT 120, and then Mark Turner pinned again. Another 20 from Kevin and MT was happy with a final 100, but he had lost the leg by 8,000 - 420.

Still there was always the 2nd leg. Mark started with 2,070, but then only scored

The draw had had a very Southern bias with only Oxfordshire well represented from north of the Thames. One player from Northants, Bucks and Scotland, plus two from Berkshire was a poor turnout from those Counties and something must be done soon to spread the word.

Geoff Jukes had been KO'd in round one by Barry Radford but he found some sparkling form in the Plate, averaging over 8,700 per leg including a 17,390 break in the Final against Chris Saville.

Mark James came through the toughest group and captured the biggest prize in the

game, the All-England Individual Championship, at the first time of asking.

He set up the chance from the off with a 5-0 win over group favourite Paul...

Sainsbury, while Kevin Clark narrowly ousted Aian Donovan 3-2. Geoff Jukes, the third player in the group currently in the top 20 in the rankings, started badly by losing 5-0 to Donovan while James came from over 8,000 down to beat Clark 3-2.

The draw seemed to favour James as he then beat out-of-touch Jukes 3-2 from nearly 2,000 down, while Clark moved into 2nd place with a narrow win over Sainsbury.

despite facing a 12,000 deficit.

That ALMOST put Sainsbury out of contention, the final nail in the coffin being when Jukes made an 11,940 break against him in the next match. The Berkshire rover from Kent stormed back with the best break of the day, 20,310, but he was out.

Donovan and Clark were still dangers to James' hopes of winning the group. More so when Donovan beat James in their first leg and held a lead in the 2nd. But James came back to win 4,550 - 4,440 and finish his group games with 13 pts.

Clark's chances depended on beating Jukes 5-0 and scoring around 20,000 ... a

target he never looked like achieving.

Donovan was now the only danger. He needed to beat Sainsbury 3-2 and score around 12,500 in the process. When he lost the first with only 1,550, the pressure was too great and Sainsbury was now VERY determined to keep a player who is NOT exactly "a mate" out of the final.

Mark James breathed a large sigh of relief and was soon losing the toss in the final. But he kicked off with a totally faultless 6,800 before the crowd saw a sniff of an error. He marched on calmly and had made 7,000 after 8 minutes and 9,000 after 10.

Gary's progress to the final had seemed very easy in comparison, so he ended the day with MORE ranking points than Mark's and climbed to No.13 in the list, while the winner jumped from 56 to 24.

Although Gary started the day by losing the first leg to Eric Hill, he won all other legs in the group, beating Andy Chambers, Pete Doherty and Paul Wing in the process.

Obviously. Wing was the only player expected to give Johnson any trouble, but by then Wing needed both legs and he was not in contention.
