THE BLACKLIST FOR ARRIVING AT ALL-ENGLAND TOURNAMENTS LATE: Some events (e.g. Over-50's & the Special Ladies Open) are left "open" till the day to avoid players having byes in the early rounds and therefore required MANY formats being prepared. This caused major problems, not to mention irritation, when people arrived AFTER THE CLOSURE TIME, USUALLY 11.30, so a "one-warning and you're out" procedure would be adhered to, and any future transgression from these players would result in disqualification. IN ADDITION TO THE ABOVE, SCORE BONUSES ARE AWARDED THUS:

Players in all ranking events (including PLATE COMPS) will gain a bonus 0.1 RP for every 8,000 scored in a leg, and a further 0.1 for every full 3,000 thereover. The initial 0.1 is awarded at 5,000 (instead of 8,000) for matches played in Jersey. Score bonuses for the Alternative Rules will be determined depending on difficulty.

UP-DATING FACTOR

RP gained in, say, 2000 disappear from the system at the end of the 2002, thus keeping the system relevant to a maximum of three years' achievements.

LADIES RANKINGS

LADIES will have their own ranking lists based on the above formulae for Internationals, County Championships and All-England Indivs etc, but score bonuses commence at 5,000 LADIES BRITISH OPEN is equivalent to Grand Prix events and LADIES PAIRS is 7 each for the winners, 5 for the runners-up, 3 for semi-finalists and 1 for quarter-finalists in addition, those ladies achieving RP in OPEN events will get FULL allocation in the MAIN list and HALF allocation in the LADIES list.

MILLWARD'S JUST REWARD

Jim Millward came of age a long, long time ago but the British Isles Open came of age with this, the 21st Jersey event, and now it is, of course, the World Championship......and the 2nd W/C is big Jim.

The 1997 Champion totally and completely outplayed the game's No. 1 Kevin Tunstall who won the title in 1993 and 1994 although Jim has won only three major titles in his career compared to THIRTY-ONE won by KT, henceforth known as "Katie".

Katie was inserted, but only opened with 600 before missing a straight 50. In fact, he touched the pin without felling it. Jim missed his first opportunity, but then a sequence of FIVE missed shots at a ball near the 10 pocket commenced.

Katie's third attempt at it left a ball near the 50, and Jim was able to use it to move that offending ball near the 10, eventually resulting in him getting the break back, with nearly 5 minutes already elapsed.

He played very, very calmly and made it to 9,020 by the time the bar dropped. Katie failed to add to his 600 with the balls remaining, but Jim added 260 to take his score up to 9,280, partly due to finding two more balls stuck in the trough when everyone else thought the leg was over.

Jim opened the 2nd leg with another calm 4,210 in just under 6 minutes, so Katie now needed nearly 13,000 in 10 minutes, and that is beyond even the No.1 on these tables.

The second leg therefore became a bit of a farce with each player then having NINE visits each with the highest break being just 350. Jim made a 650 at the end and Katie finished off the last 410 but it was not pretty......

mates, he played a perfect masse at a ball near the 10 hole, with the full knowledge that even a black pin would not have cost him the £1,000 holiday voucher.

For the record, the second leg sequence of breaks is not for the faint-hearted:

The weirdest sight from where your reporter sat was what looked like the firstever Mexican Wave at a bar billiards final. When Jim left a break shot slightly short of the 50, some of the Sussex supporters stood in turn from left to right to try to see how far short he was (and then immediately sat down). Just to....Si, Señor Jim-enez Millwardi Jim's progress through the field started well with wins over Arthur Carless and Dennis Atkins, but could have come unstuck in the third round on Sunday morning when he lost an early 3,900 enabling Keith Vibert to have THREE attempts at the 100 to win.

All were unsuccessful and Jim's score of 740 was enough to progress to the last 32, where he beat Dennis' brother Martin Atkins comfortably. Martin had produced fine

form up to then, beating Chris Newson, Pauline Withey and Tony Walsh.

Newson was happier later when he won the main raffle prize of....£1,000, no less. Jim was slightly surprised to face Doug Mahy, another Sussex man, in the next round, and although Jim made a 10,900 break in the first leg, Doug could have taken him close if he had not lost breaks of 3,000 and 5,000 in the second. Doug had been victor over sheet favourite Geoff Jukes in the previous round.

Jim must have been even more surprised to see who he was due to play in the quarter-finals. Kent's John Mitchell had gained his first ever ranking points, jumping straight in at No.77. Two low-key wins had given him a match with Paul Sainsbury, and he produced the goods with a 6,820 score. He was also over 2,000 on the first leg with David May (also Kent, and also taking his first ranking points) but came back to win.

It was even tighter for Mitchell in the last 16, beating Trevor Wanstall (Bucks and ALSO gaining his first ranking points) by just 90 pts. Wanstall had made his way through a very "Star-starved" sheet 7 with amazing ease. The favourite to progress from that sheet had been Dave Gallichan but he went out in round 2 when he lost a 7,700 break against Paul Newton.

With Sainsbury on sheet 8 was Dennis Helleur, always dangerous and the 1992

champion, but he fell in the second round to Alan Woodworth.

So, back to new champ Jim, facing Mitchell in the last eight. John opened with a solid 4,000 but Jim came back to edge the first leg and open the second with 7,500.

Jim was over 3,000 down in the semi- also but a 9,000 start to leg two made sure

he beat last year's runner-up Bob King.

Bob had hoped to go one better than last year, and looked a good bet when he put paid to players like Roger Taylor. Don Cadec, Steve Mariner and Nigel Ryall with consummate ease.

Mariner had made three big breaks in the first three rounds, actually holding the best break twice in that time, cheekily moaning at Farrelly later for not starting his game with Nigel Senior with a LITTLE more, so that Senior could not have pipped Mariner's effort. The cheek of it!!!!

Ryall, the superb tables manager at the event for many years, had also produced magnificent performances earlier, beating Internationals Micky Daw, Mark Brewster and

Harry Barbet before succumbing to King.

Jenny Noel jumped into the Top 20 of the Ladies Rankings with a splendid performance throughout FIVE rounds. She registered her first "Open" ranking points for some years by making a string a big breaks which won her THREE of the six Ladies score/break prizes available.

A 2,050 break against Sharon Balcombe started her off, followed by breaks of

4,910 and 3,640 respectively against Colin Green and Mick Fairs.

She did not let up when it came to the two-leg matches, making a 4,820 break against 1988 Champion Alan Le Blond (a red hot favourite for his group despite being a very late entry) and then a splendid nerve-jangling 6,360 break against Dave Evans in the last 16 match.

Unfortunately for her numerous supporters, it was not enough as surprise package

Evans had made a 6,150 break himself in the first leg, and he just held on for a place in
the quarter-finals.

"Good Evans", he had only attained 0.1 RP before this, and here he was with 11.3

from one event and jumping to a heady No.74 in the list.

Whatismore, he had endured a very tough group. He had to get past Pete Farrelly, Bernie McCluskey, 1981 Runner-up Derek Payne and stalwart Alan Chaloner on his sheet, but only had to face Chaloner on his way, as the others fell by the wayside, probably in fear of having to face the Eynsham league's friendliest hippy.

Payne fell to McCluskey in the first round, and the holder also went on to beat

Gary Aubert with a 10,060 break before he fell in a shock exit to Chaloner.

Farrelly had reached the best break at the time, 10,310, to win his first round match, but then only kicked off round two with a paltry 500 against the dangerous Nigel

Senior. The Sussex youngster replied with a very controlled 11,700 break, one which was destined to remain the best break in the single-leg games to win for Nigel a very nice Jersey holiday next year.

He had managed to avoid use of the "cushion" shots until almost getting himself

into a lot of trouble with his final three shots when the bar was due.

Senior was, however, caught out in the next match with Evans, losing two breaks with wayward cushion shots which, if kept, would have easily been enough to stay in the tournament.

Evans' run ended in the last eight when Bob King managed to hold on to a 3,000

first leg advantage.

Tunstall's early round form was not exceptionally impressive, but didn't need to be. His first real test was against Dennis Claydon, passed with flying colours; well "waving pastel shades" at least.

Ray Sturgess could not produce the form he had shown against Sue Mariner, Geoff Pitt and Chris Saville, and was sank by Katie without trace.

Nigel Bisson put up a show, but his first leg lead of 2,730 was dwarfed by Katie's 9,650 break in the second leg.

Nigel's sheet 14 was fairly comfortable, except for fellow Jerseyman Mike Matthews who he met and beat in the last 32.

Katie met dangerman Chris Tupper in the quarters and only won leg 1 by 190, but a break of 9,690 in the second settled it.

Tupper had had easy early progress but had to out-shine Scotland's representative Lorin Clough in the last 32 and two-time winner Steve Ahier in the last 16.

Lorin had beaten Guernsey's only previous winner Trevor Gallienne, who had earlier

ousted another past champion Peter Noel.

Ahier is ALWAYS one to beat, and had easy early progress until having to produce his very best against Mark Turner (soon to be re-named "Euro" Turner?). Ahier had a lead of 4,000 and made a 12,820 break in the second leg.

Tunstall's semi- was against Nick Barnett but Katie made breaks of 16,340 and

8,030 to give Nick-Nick NO CHANCE.

Nick had looked a likely winner early on. Every score in the single leg games had been over 8,000. He scored 11,000 and 4,000 in the last 32, but struggled against Dorset's best player Eric Hill in the last 16.

"Over-the-" Hill won the first leg by 4,800 but Barnett stormed back in the second to end the Eric hopes. Ernie hopes (Jordan that is) had also ended in this section, losing

to Steve Ellis.

This section of the draw (sheets 9 and 10) was amazingly short of top ranked players, with John Jeune and Richard Harris both gaining ranking points for the first time.

Barnett made a phenomenal 13,670 break to beat Mark James in the quarters but the reigning All-England Champion had enjoyed a good tournament. He beat 1996 winner Terry Oakley in the first round and had expected to face Keith Sheard in round four, BUT Bella Stoner had knocked him out.

Bella achieved her first "Open" ranking points by making a 3,710 break in round three against Sheard, for her VERY unlikely victory.

Mark James was 4,300 down at half-time against Bella but made a score of 8,940

in the second leg. He then totally eclipsed Graham Bisson in the last 16.

Bisson only made 770 in two legs, but had ousted Terry Race, Micky Leader and Dave Barnes in earlier rounds, with consistent scores between 6,000 and 9,000, to make his mark on the event.

Partially-sighted Micky had tethered up his guide dog to beat highly-fancied Paul Wing and Fred Jeanne in the first two rounds, but Bisson was a different proposition. (Wingy-Wingy was promised the headlines for this but I changed my mind).

All-Eng Hon Sec (but nobody still knows "HOO HI HAM") Dave Barnes sailed into the rankings for the first time at No.139 by beating Tony Webster, Emile Sanguy and Gary Sweeney. (I'd like to say more about this performance but can't, I'm too emotional!)

John Alker, the 1981 Jersey league president, returned from sunnier climes specially to declare the event "open" first thing on Saturday morning. Only visitors from the early days (like your reporter) remember people like John, Tony Tagg and Chic Channing, but their legacy should be well remembered in everything that IS the B.I.O.C. these days.

The major change this year was a Plate Competition for first round losers. And it was just for first round losers, not for any who had a bye or walkover in the first round and then lost in the second...but perhaps that anomaly can be looked at next year. It would be fairer and avoid so many Plate first round byes, but it would have to start later, i.e. after the second round instead of after the first.

There were many looking to become the first Plate Champion, but that honour went to Jersey's former international player Rod Langlois, who beat All-England Chairman Keith Lewendon in the final which was played in the arena as an "hors d'oeuvres" to the main

final.

After a slow start, Rod made a sound 3,570 break, but Keith made a recovery before failing to get enough right-hand side on the cue ball for the one-up, finishing the second leg just over 2,000 down.

Rod had his break to come and extended his lead somewhat. Keith even had a black

pin later, but he was well behind the clock by then and never really in contention.

Kevin Pringle did well on his first visit to Jersey, reaching the quarter-finals of the Plate, but the best player throughout this competition was actually Mick Lingham, a former All-England Champion and England International, who made breaks of 5,380, 12,730, 5,600 and 10,080 before losing to Langlois in the semi-.

The Junior Champion is, for the fifth time in succession, 15-year-old Steven Sheard. He went to Jersey standing at No. 69 in the National Rankings and unfairly slipped three places over the weekend BECAUSE HE WAS NOT ALLOWED TO TAKE PART IN THE MAIN EVENT.

He thought it would be his last year in the Juniors because it has always been called the Under-16 event and he will be 16 in April 2002. Now, only by seeing THREE 16-year-olds in the Junior event, he finds that he must serve one more year in the Juniors before being able to go for the big one in 2003.

Your reporter, and surely, many more neutral observers, believe that Steven should be allowed to play with the big boys in 2002, if for no other reason to allow those 15 year-olds who have had to succumb to Steven for so long in the Juniors to have ONE chance of taking the title before THEY move up to the Seniors.

Come on, bend the rules, by being fair to all.

The event itself was well-organised and well-played, with a fine early performance by 12-year-old Shane Gallery, who narrowly went out to Greg Anderton. Greg then played in the competition's only "tie". 1,800-all with Christian Moriarty was decided in Christian's favour in the replay.

Christian headed James Jeanne in the semi-final, but 16-year-old James stormed

back with 3,470 for his THIRD Junior final in the last 4 years.

Steven beat off an early challenge from Jack Wigley, but must have worried when Justin Cotillard moved closer in the semi-final. Steven only mastered James by 640 and made it to another final where he reigned totally supreme with two 6,000 scores.

I say again, LET HIM LOOSE ON THE BIG BOYS, NOW. For the rest of us who did not win ANYTHING, roll on 2002.......

JAN TAYLOR GIVES ENGLAND SKIPPER SIX OF THE BEST

Teacher Jan Taylor taught her England skipper, Pauline Withey, a lesson by taking her 6th All-England Ladies title in the last ten years, but not without a real fight.

It was tight but not as tight as when the same stars met in the 1994 final. BBQ 14 tells me that I was still using an old typewriter and my report on the final was:

"Pauline made a 7,600 opener, Jan made 200 and 6,660 to close to within 740. Jan only started the 2nd leg with 1,990, Pauline scored just 260 and Jan another 330. Pauline made 1,410 to go 90 ahead overall with ten minutes to go. A determined 4,790 by Jan seemed to have clinched it but Pauline amazingly made 4,200 to lose by only 500."

Pauline was ranked 6 then, well behind No.1 Jan who has beaten Christine Toner, Sue Mariner, Penny Burch and Kim Beeching in her other finals, a veritable "Who's Who?" in the ladies game, and only losing one of her previous finals, 1991 to Myra Hawkins.

These days, of course, they vie for the top slot, with Jan at the helm going into

the end of the year, but Pauline is set to take over in January.

The story of this year's final:

Jan opened with 5,920 and then watched Pauline come back magnificently to take the lead. She had just reached 6,000 when she missed a difficult ball near the 30 hole. Jan made another 1,050 to take a 6,970 lead going into the 2nd leg.

Pauline seemed to have forgotten the lost break as she started to claw her way back, but then fluffed her shot at 4,570. The game slowed over the next few minutes as Pauline struggled to get the break back for another chance, and Jan seemed to have the

edge.

On her 4th visit, with just under five minutes to go, Jan crucially retrieved the balls and made a title-winning 1,890 break in the next 3 minutes.

Pauline's first title was tantalisingly out of reach, and Jan's SIX OF THE BEST was

written all over the blackboard.

But Pauline's relatively easy progress from Group 1 to the final actually gave her slightly more ranking points than Jan, even though the winner gets an extra three for winning the title.

Pauline steam-rollered Dawn Flattery and Fran Unwin, only losing an otherwise meaningless final leg against Reading's Jane Carless.

Jan's group was MUCH more interesting!

She started with the formality of a 5-0 win over Cambridge's debutant Claire Newton, while seemingly closest rival Penny Burch only narrowly defeated Jan Bithell 3-2.

While Penny also beat Claire 5-0, Jan Taylor was shocked to lose by the same margin to Jan Bithell. After losing the first leg by 1,500, Jan Taylor was under extreme pressure and also lost the 2nd leg by 180.

That should have cost her that place in the final, and would have if the final group

matches had been judged by the "Pools Panel".

Oh, I don't know, perhaps not!!! When a football match is re-arranged for a Friday night, and then the Panel get together the next afternoon and say that if it had been played on Saturday it would have been a totally different result......well, anything is possible. You may even see another Northants player in the England side one day!!!!

Come on, back to reality.....

Jan Taylor made the best bresk of the day, 11,240 in her first leg against Penny but Jan Bithell still only needed both legs against Claire to reach the final.

She won the first, unconvincingly, but somehow managed to lose the second 1,720 - 1,240. Jan Taylor still needed the final leg against Penny, and, as the pressure built, she won 5,840 - 5,750. Truly the stuff of champions.

It was Keith Sheard who beat him LAST year and he did it again this year. But last time KT held an 18,450 lead before watching KS make a 20,050 reply, this time it was in reverse.... but the same outcome.

Keith was in "robotic perfection" mode. He only used the two 50 holes and the 100 throughout the first leg. He had reached 9,000 in a "sedate" 8 minutes, but bumped it up to make another 6,000 in the next 4½ minutes

When he clocked up 21,000 it was by way of 30 repetitions of the five basic shots. Two more break shots before the bar dropped....21,300, one more break with two white balls....21,400, one-up....21,450, the 31st split....21,600, leaving the last ball for the 100. The only surprise was that he did not go for the 200.....

Katie had 2,000 on the board after 98 seconds but looked decidedly nervous and

broke down at 3,400. Keith made 1,190 and Kevin conceded when he missed again. Earlier in the day, Gary Johnson won the toss with Terry Cook and "chose" to play

World Champion Jim Millward, rather than Katie.

He did the right thing as he beat Jim...easily. Jim opened with only 2,440 and then lost another break of similar size. Gary made a 9,330 and then opened the 2nd leg with 6,560. Far too late, Jim scored a 10,480 reply, still over 3,000 short.

Meanwhile, Katie was struggling a little against Terry Cook. The Witney man had opened with 5,000 and Katie only managed to win the leg by 1,580. Terry should have stepped on the gas when KT slipped up at 1,300 in the 2nd, but he was allowed straight back on and clinched a place in the last eight.

The only other major surprise in the first round was Dino Clark's win over All-England Champion Mark James. Dino opened with only 5,680 and won the leg by 5,900

but Mark did not even get half-way there in the 2nd.

The best game of the first round was Paul Sainsbury's 19,030 play-out to beat Paul Wing's setting 18,980 with the last ball.

Sheardy's early progress was a formality, even though he was playing someone seeded three places higher in Pauline Withey. Although the England skipper only opened with 500, her other two visits to the table brought her breaks of 2,530 and 4,520.

1999 Champion Mark Turner, now a fully blown married man if you pardon the expression, found the going easy against the event's other female qualifier Jane Wood, a

10,830 break in the 2nd leg serving as a good practice session.

Dennis Atkins went out without troubling the scorers, against Barry Holt's 8,000 and 16,000 totals, and Tony Walsh also saw off one of the Jersey stars Dave Evans. Walshy made a 10,120 break and then another 7,000 to win the 2nd leg by another 3,000.

ROUND TWO

Sheardy found himself 14,910 down before taking a first look at the table against Gary Johnson, but then made 2,900 in several visits before turning up the volume to make 20,550 in the 2nd leg.

Katie was still struggling....Dino Clark only made 1,310 and 4,000 in his first two chances but he won the first leg by 1,730. However, Katie settled down at last for a fine

10,960 break to take him into the semi-finals.

Sainsbury's exploits from the first round would have been needed again as Mark Turner played it out for 16,630, but the champion in 1995 and 1996 seemed a little more troubled this time. He had to rely on a lucky double kiss after reaching 13,000, but then played a similar shot without any luck at all and his dream was over.

The only low-scoring game in the quarter-finals was Walshy's very narrow win over Barry Holt. A very slow start by both players saw all the balls on the table and

Walshy win by the odd 40 points, 3,180 - 3,140.

Holt was off early and Tony edged 3,000 ahead. Barry started to play properly but it was too late and a 2,500 break was just 410 short.

SEMI-FINALS

Katie made short work of his old adversary Tony Walsh who only started with 600. "Not quite enough" to put any pressure on Katie who made breaks of 16,140 and 10,350 before Tony waved the white flag.

The other semi-final was riveting! Mark Turner opened with 5,270 but only made 330 in three more visits whilst Sheardy only had 210 on the board. Turner made a useful

2,300 before seeing the one-up shot whip out of the 50 hole.

Sheardy started a recovery but missed the one-up aswell to end the first leg 9,010 980 behind, and there looked no way back for the holder as he was struggling to control his usual perfect shots.

More so when he made just 450 and 1,600 on his first two visits in the 2nd, each time missing the one-up. Mark only made 760 and 780 on his first two chances, but it seemed not to matter as he would get another chance....surely!

Plenty of time still to go but Keith was never going to slug it out on this tricky table. Yet he did....he made a top class 9,580 break and stayed there until there were just 5 seconds to go before the bar dropped.

None of the reserves (E Jordan, D Claydon, S Biggs, D Flattery, E Hill) were required as all top 16 accepted their invitations.

The average score per leg was only 13,131, well down on the record of 1996 when the average was 15,742.

The final seedings were decided on the following points: K Tunstall 61 (a record) J Millward (26) M Turner (18) T Walsh (16) D Atkins, P Sainsbury (15) P Withey (11) D Clark (10) M James (9) K Sheard, P Wing (7) B Holt, D Evans (6) J Wood (5) G Johnson, T Cook (4).

THIRTY YEARS OF A.E.B.B.A.

I have received this from Charlie Gildersleve, celebrating 30 years of the All-England Association

In 1970, Arthur Wenham (of Bar Billiards Ltd) said that it was about time that the North of the Thames counties met the various associations of the South, so a meeting was arranged at the "Hammer and Tonges", Basingstoke in the Autumn of that year.

Charlie Gildersleve and the late, great Norrie Lambert represented Bucks, and there

were two from Reading and two from Oxford present also.

Southern Counties dominated the Committee in the early years.

Charlie remembers that he made a suggestion at the first meeting but it was not included in the minutes when they were read the following year.

When he challenged this, the Chairman said that "If it isn't in the minutes, you couldn't have said it." So the North were given the impression that they had no impact.

Progress was made, however, at the instigation of the first Team Championships in 1973. Sponsored by Watneys and staged at Horsham, it was won by Charlie's team, the Mayflower (High Wycombe) who beat a top Oxford side in the final.

The hall was still very full at the presentation at 11.0 p.m. as Watneys gave every

player on the day a pack of 24 cans of light ale.

The divide between North and South was such that, when Norrie became Chairman, he and Peter Pannell (Surrey) should alternate for the position every year and this went on for several years.

The meetings dragged on as agreement on any issue was hard work. In 1979, Horrie Wood was Secretary and worked together with Norrie to draw up a set of rules

and get them accepted.

On two occasions, once at the Royal Hospital (Horley) and once at the Fox and Hounds (Reading), the meetings had to be terminated at midnight without reaching "Any Other Business", but there was much improvement when Ken Hussey was voted in as Secretary in 1981.

He did a wonderful job in modernising the Association and, in his last year, the meetings were moved from Saturday nights to Sunday lunchtimes. Suddenly they were far

more civilised.

Eric Hill took over from Ken and continued the fine work to bring us up to our current committee of that handsomely debonair man-about-town Keith Lewendon (Chairman), hard-working Dave Barnes (Secretary), an extremely efficient Treasurer (Keith MacDonald) and a superb Tournament Director (Peter Farrelly). We must also thank Phil Hawkins for his support and constructive criticism.

The comments in the last paragraph are that of Charlie Gildersleve!

The meetings over the years have been held at Basingstoke, the Royal Hospital (Horley), the Jolly Sailor (Ripley), the Stoke Hotel (Guildford), the RBL Club (Normandy), the Fox & Hounds (Caversham), the Bridge Hotel (Caversham), the Dashwood Arm,s (Piddington), the Blue Flag (Cadmore End), the RAFA Club (High Wycombe), the Skinners Arrns (High Wycombe), the Millers Arms (Caversham) and the Clifton Arms (Caversham).

Charlie, at 73, says that he is looking forward to the next THIRTY years.

Thanks for all this information, Charlie....
