PROFILES

ENGLAND MEN'S TEAM

KEVIN TUNSTALL (ABINGDON, OXON, captain, RK 1, 21st Int)

Only ever-present on either side in 21 international matches. Winner of 31 major events, over twice as many as anyone else, but "what will Katie do next?" Probably win his own Oxfordshire Open next weekend. A.k.a. "God"

PETE FARRELLY (RUSHDEN, NORTHANTS, RK 13, 14th Int)

"Fazza" is the game's only controversial reporter, allegedly. Have you seen that BBQ? 7 major titles, yet still prides himself on being the oldest (-looking) member of the team for some reason. Celebrating his 50th in Worthing (June) if anyone wants to buy him a drink.

JIM MILLWARD (WORTHING, SUSSEX, RK 4, 9th Int)

Four majors including the World Championship November 2001. Always produces his best when wearing his England waistcoat, and pretty good when "coaching" the Sussex ladies.

PAUL WING (FRATTON, PORTSMOUTH, RK 7, 3rd Int)

Never reached a major final, but prides himself on losing in the first round of the Opens so he can try to win the Plate, to help with the Taxi fare home which he drives himself so is quite expensive.

MARK TURNER (ARBOURFIELD, READING, RK 3, 4th Int)

Recently married, much to the dismay of many of the ladies team.....and a few of the men, apparently. Three majors, good record against Katie, excellent record with his wife. Mark I of the team. Future England captain (?)

PAUL SAINSBURY (TUNBRIDGE WELLS, KENT, RK 6, 15th Int)

After a barren spell, he is back to his best, so Sainsbury simply "Asda" be back in the team. Winner of eight majors, but only seems to perform at the top of his ability when the prize money is in four figures.

MARK BREWSTER (ROCHESTER, KENT, RK 8, 4th Int)

The "Rooster" has won two majors, the Open Pairs with Kevin Clark in both 2000 and 2001, but is always there or thereabouts....especially when its your round. Mark II

GARY JOHNSON (OXFORD, RK 9, on debut)

The only member of the 13-man squad who does NOT subscribe to the BBQ, so is obviously a skin-flint. (Promised to do so at the match, but yet to see his money, ed.) One major, and was also All-England Individual runner-up in 2001.

MARK JAMES (WORTHING, SUSSEX, RK 16, on debut)

Won the All-England Individual Championship in his first-ever major National final of any sort, but surely should be playing for Northern Ireland with that soft accent. But that is the only thing soft about Mark, allegedly. Mark III

DENNIS ATKINS (DIDCOT, OXFORD, RK 17, on debut)

"Gentleman Den" has won one major, but runner-up on three other occasions including in the "triangle" Alternative Rules in 2001, so he obviously does not get frustrated too easily.

TONY WALSH (READING, BERKS, RK 15, 5th Int)

BERNIE McCLUSKEY (TILEHURST, READING, reserve, RK 10)

"Freddie Mercury" steps down to 1st reserve this year, but only because he failed to retain the World Championship. The selectors are hard! Thirteen other titles to his name.

GEOFF JUKES (REIGATE, SURREY, reserve, RK 19)

Does not seem to mind when he gets called "Jeff Dukes" occasionally, but prefers to get called by the England selectors. One major title in bar billiards, but plenty in other sports.

JERSEY MEN'S TEAM

NIGEL BISSON (NON-PLAYING CAPTAIN, RK 49, 8 Prev Ints)

Captain of defending Jersey League Champions Trinity Arms, for whom he "non-plays" even when he plays. Far too modest, too!

STEVE AHIER (ESPLANADE HOTEL, RK 31, 16th Int)

Loud and generous, and that's just his trousers. Twice British Open Champion, he single-handedly took the game in Jersey to new heights: in his case almost 2 metres.

HARRY BARBET (CORINTHIAN, RK 25, 15th Int)

"McCririck" will probably be offering 2-1 ON for any result, at least until the gin kicks in. He can put more side into one shot than most players put into a whole season.

NICK BARNETT (ESPLANADE HOTEL, RK 26, 5th Int)

If this is Jersey's answer to Pete Farrelly, what the hell was the question? "Tron" is responsible for the j.b.b.l. website where he has been top of the averages for many, many months. British Open runner-up and something of a big break machine in local circles.

GRAHAM BISSON (LANDMARK INN, RK 18, 19th Int)

Our newsboy, solid and reliable, unlike his racing tips. A former British Open, Jersey and Channel Island Champion who has also acquitted himself well in a few Opens in England, reaching the Sussex Open final in 2000, (where he was beaten by a legend...ed.)

DAVE GALLICHAN (BLACK DOG, RK -, on debut)

"Milton" enjoyed much success last season, runner-up in the Jersey Singles and winning the Doubles. Knocking on the door of the minds of the selectors for a few years. Time to come in!

DENNIS HELLEUR (TRINITY ARMS, RK 47, 20th Int)

Age is no barrier, time does not wither him - much! Competitive, hard to beat, back to form - need we say more about this former British Open, Jersey & Channel Is. Champion.

FRED JEANNE (BLACK DOG, RK 89, 3rd Int)

Consistent quality play season after season has made him a regular choice. Had his first away experience in the famous draw of 2000, and amazingly is back for more.

BOB KING (TRINITY ARMS, RK 20, 5th Int)

"Bouncing Bob" has made the final and semi-final in the last two British Opens. Always a threat if he can stay clear of injuries, speed bumps, high bar stools, steps etc.

ALAN LE BLOND (BLACK DOG, RK 42, 5th Int)

This former British Open winner will not be sending Christmas cards to anyone in Cardiff or Liverpool this year (he supports Leeds) and in fact the whole of Europe may be out of bounds. That smiley exterior shields a fiercely competitive player.

PAUL NEWTON (ESPLANADE, RK 66, 2nd Int)

Made his debut in Horley in 2000, has a 100% record and extremely hard to beat (just like the Reds). Weekly banker bet for the Esso B.

NIGEL RYALL (TRINITY ARMS, RK 21, 14th Int)

The Wasp killer of Rozel is a previous Jersey and Channel Island champion who is just about the most consistent Jersey League player this season. Wears a picture of Jonathan Woodgate in his locket.

ALAN FERRAND (UNION INN, reserve, RK 139)

There or thereabouts at the top of the league averages for years, but an away trip "virgin" who has just returned from a contract as a Bin Laden lookalike.

That is not meant to denegrate the Jersey players or their fantastic achievement, or diminish their feat as all credit must go to them for producing enough leg-winning breaks at their first visit to, firstly, put the pressure on the England players, and then follow these up with the determination to take the trophy home AGAIN, this time by actually (and unbelievably) winning the match 12-10

Two years ago, it was, of course, a "one-off". Two of the tables were ruined once the air-conditioning was turned on, destroying home confidence, and therefore home advantage. Not this time. The best excuse the BBQ editor can come up with is that the bar was too close to proceedings and open for too long.

But basically it was simply that too many Jersey players opened up with enough to win the leg on their opening break, but very few England players did, AND they also fought harder and seemed to want it more.

It was a very fine performance by the visitors, enjoying the weekend A LOT.

THE STORY OF THE MATCH: FIRST SESSION

Nigel Ryall started with a 9,320 break, putting Dennis Atkins under extreme pressure on his long-awaited England debut. Jim Millward only kicked off with 4,800 but Fred Jeanne was never really in contention. Graham Bisson gained some revenge against Pete Farrelly for defeat in the 2000 Sussex Open final by leading the way with an 8,280 break in about 14 minutes.

SECOND SESSION

Tony Walsh lost his first 2,000 and Alan Le Blond stepped in for a methodical 5,520. Meanwhile Harry Barbet tried for a "split" but missed both balls. Kevin Tunstall made an 8,390 reply. Mark James settled into a nice rhythm immediately, showing no nerves, despite being on debut and made a superb 7,610. TONG 3 TONG 3

THIRD SESSION

Debutant Dave Gallichan only made 600 at the start and Gary Johnson made a top notch 8,200 on his second visit to the table in an England match. Mark Turner made a solid 4,000 but not enough as Steve Ahier replied with 5,490 on his 2nd visit. Dennis Helleur opened with 7,040.

FOURTH SESSION

Mark Brewster and Paul Newton played a ropey game by all accounts, with Paul somehow making a 3,450 score. Bob King won his first ever leg for Jersey at the ninth attempt but it was in real style, with an 8,390 opener. ENG & JER 7 of MALF-TOWN

FIFTH SESSION

Dennis Atkins could not return the pressure and lost 6,000 - 4,000 to Nigel Ryall who is now provisionally No.11 in the rankings. Fred Jeanne stunned Jim Millward with an opening 8,400. Pete Farrelly started with one nice split but then missed a 50/20 split and the balls settled into awkward positions. Eventually, Pete got the break back with just 3 minutes to go (the only player to do so on that table in the 3 games) and made a slow 1,600 to clinch England's first point in 7 games. RNO 5 DER 9

SIXTH SESSION

England desperately needed all three points in this session. Alan Le Blond started with a 4,280 break but Tony Walsh was back in charge and won comfortably. Kevin Tunstall only opened with 5,010 but it was enough against an out-of-touch Harry Barbet. Just when England looked down and out and the inquest was just beginning, Nick Barnett gave them increased hope. He had seemed to be in no trouble as he neared 9,000 but then somehow managed to play the ball only about nine inches off the "D" at a ball close to the left hand 50. Initially Mark James could not pot it straight but managed a 20 and eventually won an amazing low scoring game. Hopes raised: ENGL & FORL

SEVENTH SESSION

English hopes were now high, needing just four of the remaining five legs. Gary Johnson made breaks of 4,610 and 11,930 to record the highest break and score of the match. It also lifted him to Provisional No.2 in the rankings. Mark Turner failed to take advantage of Steve Ahier's opening 1,250. It was very close (1,290-1,080 to Steve) when the twice Open Champion got the break back for another 6,000. After a slow start, Paul Sainsbury missed his second one-up and stood back to watch "The Grinder" make another 5,510.

So, I suppose a draw was out of the question, but the best England could now hope for . BONG D DER 11

EIGHTH SESSION

Paul Wing was doing absolutely nothing wrong in opening with a 10,840 break, but Mark Brewster and Paul Newton were again struggling in the other leg. Paul eventually potted the vital last few balls for just 130 to give Jersey the long-awaited first-ever victory on English soil.

TUNSTALL'S 32nd MAJOR TITLE

KEVIN TUNSTALL promotes, stages, sets-up, runs and then WINS the OXFORDSHIRE OPEN! Not an easy task! It was the tenth Oxfordshire Open and, not surprisingly, it is only the second time he has won it, and states that the help he had on the desk from Jersey's Jenny Noel as the main reason he won it this year.

Previously, only John Burrows (in 1997 and 1998) had ever won the event twice. According to BBQ stats, Kevin has now won the All-England FOUR times (in 1980, 1994, 1996 and 2000), the British Open TWICE (in 1993 and 1994), the Grand Prix Masters ONCE (in 1994), the Alternative Rules FOUR times (in 1991, 1994, 1999 and 2000), the British Open Pairs FIVE times (with Pete Lee in 1988, and with Tony Martin in 1991, 1994, 1996 and 1998), the Oxford Open TWICE (1996 and 2002), the Northants Open in 1995, the Sussex Open in 1998 and 2001, the Berkshire Open in 1998, the Kent Classic in 1999, the Charity Singles in 1991, 1992, 1993 and 1997, the Mermaid/Wessex in 1990, 1993, 2000 and 2001, and the Mixed Pairs with Denise Wills in 1999, giving him a phenomenal THIRTY TWO titles.

You cannot take it away from him.....unless he turns his back, of course. How does he do it?and what is the best way to break his arms?

He played Bernie McCluskey in the final, beaten in last year's final by Tony Walsh. Katie won the toss and Bernie started with only 1,200 when he hit the 2nd split shot too thick and missed both balls.

Katie failed to register a score on his first visit, but Bernie initially struggled to settle down, hitting the next split too thick again, seeing the red ball going round the back of the 50 hole.

Eventually all the jig-saw fell into place and Bernie made a slow 11,820, only leaving one ball which he later pocketed into the 100 on his THIRD attempt.

It was 13,120 - 0 but Katie now had 161/2 minutes to match it.

His heart may have missed a beat when he whipped out of the 100 on his first split, but he immediately played a splendid in-off 100 going off the side cush for the 20 to get going. His next minor error was not until he had reached 9,000, playing the split too thick just like Bernie had earlier. He found little problem from there and played it out for 15,770.

So now THIRTY TWO, and what else is left for Katie to win. He has left the Under-22's a little too late, and must wait a little longer to have a chance of the Over-50's, but he has not yet taken the two-year-old Bucks Open.

Other than that, he will have to go all the way and change sex, so that he could win all the Ladies events.....

He was only in danger once during the day, and that was against Tony Martin, his friend and long-standing pairs partner. Not usually troubled a great deal by his teammates. Katie found himself up against it when Tony opened with an 18,840 break. That was quickly put into perspective with Katie's 22,150, a performance which won the prize for the SECOND best break of the day.

Other than that, his early opponents (Merv "The Swerve" Yearwood & Mark Senior) had scored less than 4,000 between them. Dennis Atkins made over 9,000 but he was chasing double that.

Even Keith Sheard, the "almost perpetual" No.2 in the rankings, could not step up to give him any problem. Even a very tough table [take it from your editor] could not stop Katie making a very good 11,150 break, and narrowly losing the 2nd 9,000 - 6,000.

Pete Burton posed no problems in the semi-final.

Katie's 22,150 against Tony Martin was, in fact, the FOURTH best of the event, beaten THREE times by Sheard.

The No.2 was in tremendous scoring form throughout, UNTIL he met Katie.

Keith totalled annihilated Tony Webster by over 49,000 in the first round. Breaks of 22,590 and 26,420 battered the Portsmouth player into submission, but he picked himself up magnificently to reach the semi-finals of the Plate later.

Breaks of 11,070 and 15,110 put teenager Dominic Kuligowicz in his place. Incidentally, Dominic beat Steven Sheard a few weeks later in the Inter-Area Under-22's competition [see Inter-Area Despatches at the end of this BBQ for full info] even though young Steven actually gained revenge in the final of that event.

Keith made another 18,020 in the first leg of the third round against Keith Lewendon, so none of Sheard's opponents had registered a score at that stage. It changed when Lew made 15,010 in the 2nd leg.

Sheard was back with another 22,450 in the last 16 match with Tony Walsh but started looking nervous when the holder reached 21,150 in reply. It may have affected him when he played Katie a few minutes later.

Bernie had been on good form also. A string of five-figure scores against Tony Lewis and Steven Sheard gave him a go against one of the favourites for the event John Burrows. The latter failed to perform and Bernie was in the last 16.

Big opening breaks was enough against Alan Oliver and Pete Welch, but things got tight in the semi-final against Steve Huntley, one of the best performers of the day. Just over 12,000 was the Eynsham league player's target when he whipped out of the 50 on the one-up shot and failed when looking good at 9,210.

Other than all these, one of the best performances at Didcot was by a scorer. TWELVE-year-old Christopher Storch volunteered to referee a 2nd round match between Derek Payne and Ernie Jordan, and sat confidently and unerringly while Derek made a 15,000 break. Ernie made 8,000 in the 2nd leg too.

If only a few more adults were as forthcoming as young Chris, a credit to his Dad Wolfie to whom we wish a speedy recovery.

No 3 ranked Mark Turner lost in the first round to Chris Saville. No 7 ranked Paul Sainsbury lost in the second to Tony Walsh. New England recruit Gary Johnson narrowly beat World Champion Jim Millward in the 2nd round but surprisingly fell at the next to

Alan Oliver.

Paul Wing jumped to No.5 after getting his first match at 4.45, due to drawn opponent Steve Biggs not being able to make it. Formality wins over Alan Chaloner and Bob Allsworth preceded defeat in the last eight against Huntley.

Dorset's interest died when Eric Hill lost out to Derek Payne in the first, but ... newly-associated Gloucestershire kept it going into the second when Mark Allfrey and Fran

Unwin both won their first matches.

Pete Farrelly, trying manfully to get back into the top ten, having fallen out of it for the first time recently, beat off Pauline Withey without the expected problems, then Dave Alder proved more difficult than it looked after the first leg, maybe due to the friendly banter Farrelly received from Alder's better-known team-mates.

Barry Holt and Geoff Pitt provided stern opposition but Pete Burton turned out to be too tough. Farrelly opened up with 6,690 and made one blunder to allow "Sumo" in. He

made 7,260 and still had the break in the 2nd leg.

When he only made 1,300, Farrelly failed to take advantage. Oh dear!

Witney's Jane Wood made the best ladies break, 3,600, in her defeat against Dennis Atkins, but the best-placed lady was Diana Welburn who beat Pete Lee to progress to round three.

The Plate, very-strangely formatted as usual by Katie, was won by Stuart Florey, against Tony Ewen. Stuart was 4,540 up at the end of leg one but Tony failed to take advantage after Stuart's opening 160 in the second.

Meanwhile, how long can anyone wait for Katie's retirement?

GOLDEN QUARTER-FINAL LINE UP but WORLD & ALL-ENGLAND CHAMPS WIN

The reigning WORLD champion, Jim Millward, and the reigning ALL-ENGLAND champion, Mark James, were "bound" to win the 20th British Open Pairs once they decided to pair up for the first time. Weren't they?

If only it always went to plan like that!

But it did work wonderfully well. They were very consistent in the early rounds, especially with Jim Millward producing two big breaks, but it was Mark who won the final "almost single-handedly".

They played FOUR-time winners Kevin Tunstall and Tony Martin and won the toss, asking the Oxfordshire pair to go first. Kevin amazed ALL watching when he had one ball whip out on his second split shot and only scored 1,340. Jim could only make 20 but Tony missed the ball between the 20 and 30 pockets and Mark paid his first visit to the table.

He missed his first attempt at a 50/10 split but kept it going with determination. Mark settled down quickly and achieved almost perfection until the ball whipped out of the 100 around the 9,000 mark, rolling up to (but just stopping on) the pin. A perfect shot to split it away was very well executed.

He reached 11,260 and came off with the bar. Kevin made 140 and Jim potted the last ball so the Sussex lads led 11,380 - 1,480.

Mark now had the break in the 2nd leg. Perfection was complete as he played with perfect pace and total control for 22 repetitions of the five basic shots for a break of 15,400. After three more break-shots, he came off which just allowed Tony to pot the last few balls for 120.

As the game paused for the Plate final to start, Kevin seemed to have resigned the chance of his SIXTH pairs title as he and Tony not only needed to win the remaining two legs, but also catch up well over 25,000 in score.

Tony started OK but was only making 50/20 or 50/10 splits, missing his fourth split and making only 2,450. Mark had the chance of winning it straight away but the balls started getting awkward and, three visits for each team later, the score was still only 2,640 - 300 in the Oxford pair's favour.

Exactly half-way through the leg and a win was not enough as Jim would have the

break in the 4th leg as well as an aggregate advantage of over 20,000.

Jim made a contribution at last. It was a scrappy break but the 2,270 was decisive. It took vital time up and took them within 70 pts of catching up.

All four players had two more visits without troubling the scorers greatly, but, on his second, Jim cleared up and finished things off with another 1,750 to clinch it 3-0.

....AND STILL ONLY ONE FINAL HAS BEEN DECIDED ON AGGREGATE SINCE THE RULE WAS CHANGED IN 1985 TO PLAY IT OVER FOUR LEGS.

Jim, now up to No.3 in the rankings, and No.2 provisionally, had made a 17,930 break in round 2 and a 15,640 break in round 4 but Mark definitely stole the limelight with an EXCELLENT performance in the final.

Onlookers believe the quarter-final line-up was the hottest ever, with TWELVE of the top 21 in the rankings still in the competition. We had Mark Brewster and Kevin Clark, winners of the last two years, playing the powerful pairing of Geoff Jukes and Dennis Atkins. Jukes had dominated with three big breaks up to then and played out the 1st leg of the quarter-final with a 16,400 effort, enough to oust the Kent boys.

We had the irrepressible Tunstall and Martin TOTALLY outplaying the wily

partnership of Ernie Jordan and Terry Isard.

We had James and Millward finally seeing the back of Tony Walsh and Mick Lingham. Walshy had earlier breaks of 20,600 and 18,470 with Mick finally coming to life in round four with breaks of 15,310 and 16,470 in the same game.

And finally, we had a real classic.... Keith Sheard has now found a partner with which he will SURELY finally win this Pairs title, Ray Sturgess. Their first four legs in this year's competition had seen Keith take breaks of 18,950, 11,580 and 13,560 as well as an 18,900 from Ray, before Keith made another 19,900.

But this was against Bernie McCluskey, winner of this title three times with other partners and most other titles over the years, including the inaugural World crown in 2000. Bernie did not seem to be powering at full pelt but finished with 20,780 and Keith's dreams will have to wait another year.

The semi-final was a 3-0 walk-over for Tunstall and Martin but the other was a little closer. Mark and Jim were 2-0 up but the lead was only 9,330. When Bernie and Paul won the 3rd 9,180 - 150, the gap was only 300. The 4th leg was not a classic but the Sussex lads won 5,190 - 2,170 for a 3-1 victory.

The Plate was captured by Sussex aswell. Nigel Senior and Michelle "Osama Lin" Baden surprised even themselves when they beat Gary Johnson and Leon Beer in the final.

The Oxford boys were over 3,000 down on the first leg but seemed well set for a comeback in the 2nd until Leon lost a 5,000 break off the cushion.

Michelle and Nigel had ousted Keith Lewendon and Paul Yeo in a memorable semifinal, the latter having had a tough task in the previous round against Penny Burch and Myra Hawkins. Penny's 7,970 break at the start of the 2nd leg seemed to have given the girls the victory until a last-gasp break of 2,000 by the under-rated Yeo sealed a very narrow win.

It was great to have two of Wolfie Storch's boys in the tournament, even if their entry was very late. 14-year-old Joseph made a splendid 1,960 break in the first round match, and he and his precocious 12-year-old brother Christopher were awarded the Special Merit Prize, which was introduced in recent years to replace the highest combined break prize.
