THE FINAL CHAPTER of FARRELLY v NORTHANTS (hopefully)

I again raise this matter purely to bring you up-to-date with recent developments. There was to be a fun day at Barton Seagrave Comm Centre on the day after Finals Night (May 5th). The day would comprise the Jim Wilson Memorial Championship and a Mixed Pairs event as it has every year since the sad demise of the Northants Open. I did not enter last year due to 1) the animosity already building up, and 2) I wanted to watch the Crucible Snooker Final on TV that day which would be far more enjoyable. But, just before the closing date this year, Ian Coleman (who plays for BSCC with Esso and See-ell) went out of his way to ask me to play in it for "Jim Wilson's sake". Eventually I entered, sent a cheque for £4 to cover Steve Biggs and myself. I was then informed by the Chairman that BSCC had not accepted my entry and had made the draw WITHOUT my name. He claimed that it wasn't a LEAGUE competition and he could do nothing. However, the entry form was FROM the league, the entries had to be sent TO the Secretary, and cheques had to be made PAYABLE to NBBL. The entry form stated that it was open to players AND non-players, but nothing that stated "Pete Farrelly was not welcome". I considered my options but stayed at home to watch the snooker, and the Compasses team considered this the "final straw" and withdrew in protest from their forthcoming team semi-final with BSCC, and in effect withdrew from the league forthwith. BSCC obviously wallowed in the fact that they won all three team events when their team picture was in the local paper after Presentation Night in June. Incidentally, it took THREE requests to get my cheque back which was finally received on 29th June, nearly TWO MONTHS after their decision had been made. This is the sort of people who are now running the Northants League. Meanwhile, Northants "A" beat Oxford "A" in the Inter-Area Cup match (see page 28) and should now reach the final. It was a good victory but not quite as good as their League newsletter seemed to suggest. It says "...we defeated Oxford A, one of the favourites who have several England players in their team..." Yes, they were one of the favourites but their players have a magnificent TWO England caps between them. Don't go overboard lads.

SHEARD WINS IN POMPEY

Keith Sheard is back in (probably) his rightful place at No.2 in the provisional rankings, as well as the REAL rankings, after enjoying a terrific day at the 12th Mermaid/Wessex Open, but not without a few tough battles against some of the very best players in the country.

After making breaks of 12,890 and 9,000 in his first game against Reading Secretary & Berkshire Open organiser Dave Alder, he faced current All-England Champion Mark James and found himself 3,000 down at half-time. But an 11,780 break saw him through.

Next came former No.1 John Burrows who is now sprightly making his way back up the rankings. Milko lost a reasonable break in the first leg and lost it by just 620. A tight 2nd leg gave him a nervy overall win by just 1,530.

It did not get any easier in the quarter-final where he was drawn against Paul Sainsbury, but Keith made a 14,600 break in the first leg and Paul could not match it.

Renta-crowd chairman (& chief participant) Chris Newson had had a marvellous run into the last four, knocking out Tony Webster, Pete Sainsbury, Ernie Jordan and Tony Woolvin, but it came to an abrupt end when he scored only 810 in two legs, but probably applauded as loudly as anyone else as Keith made breaks of 15,650 and 16,000.

Keith found himself facing No.1 Kevin Tunstall in the final, NOT for the first time. Kevin won this title in 2000 and 2001, the former being against the No.2.

KT may not have been showing too many signs of nerves; well it was his EIGHTH CONSECUTIVE major final, and he was going for the 33rd major title of his career.

On inspection, his recent record shows an amazing set of stats:

But Katie only replied with 120, allowing Keith back for a 14,970 break.

Kevin was on 4,760 in the second leg when it seemed that a left-hand roll caught him out. Keith retrieved all balls when 7½ mins had already elapsed, so he had assured himself of victory by then.

Kevin had had a very difficult run to the final, having to face team-mate Mark Turner, Nigel Senior, Gary Johnson, Geoff Jukes and Dennis Atkins.

Turner seemed about to leave for home after losing to Kevin, but was embarrassed into staying to play in the Plate Competition by another team-mate Pete Farrelly. He had NEVER bothered to play for any Plate before. And he went on to win it, including a very hurtful and callous win over Farrelly in the semi-final, followed by victory over Steven Sheard in the final.

The biggest early exit was Jim Millward going out to Sainsbury.

ANCIENT MARINER BACK FROM THE DEAD

Nobody was going to beat Keith Sheard, in fine form after winning the Mermaid Open a few weeks earlier, and who had already broken the record for the highest break in the history of the Sussex Open TWICE.

But nobody told Steve Mariner.....

The "Ancient One" lost the toss in the final and only opened up with 510, but, as scorer Jim Millward struggled with a "frog in his throat", Milko only replied with 2,140.

Steve settled in with a 12,330 break, only allowing Keith a shot at the 100 hole.

Chasing a deficit of only 10,600 would not normally worry Keith as he set off in the second leg but he looked increasingly uneasy until he made a mistake at 7,010, made in a fairly slow 8 mins 15 secs.

Again nobody considered it fatal as Steve missed his first shot. Keith looked virtually assured when he made another 5,840 to go 2,250 ahead overall, with very little time to go, but Steve somehow clawed his way back.

Your BBQ reporter was scoring the game (replacing a croaking Millward) and even HE cannot work out how Steve managed to get himself 40 ahead when the bar dropped.

He casually potted the balls to win by 440.

Steve, as per usual, had a great day including some big breaks. Mike Tiley led him by over 3,000 in the first round but a 19,780 reply bolstered Mariner hopes.

After putting paid to PETE Sainsbury, Steve ended Kevin Tunstall's glorious recent run of EIGHT appearances in major finals. Katie, who had already posted breaks of 16,520 and 10,440 in early rounds, could only mustre a two-leg total of 3,870 and was unable to become the "albatross" around Mariner's neck.

Steve then faced the vastly experienced and underrated Charlie Gildersleve (only one of those adjectives was dictated to me by Charlie). Although Chas led by 400, Steve made no mistakes in the 2nd leg.

Ernie Jordan could not produce his best in the quarter-final, and neither could Paul Sainsbury in the semi.

Steve's second Sussex Open victory lifts him nearly 40 places in the rankings to 44, Keith was a likely winner all day.....

Martin Smith, who went on to Plate semi-final, could do nothing in the first round as Sheardy powered in 12,690 and then a Sussex Open record break of 21,500. Don Cadec must have thought his trip from Jersey was really worthwhile after facing him in the second, and John Smith (only travelled from Wycombe) was on the wrong end of it in the third.

Tony Martin applied lots of pressure by holding a near 3,000 advantage in the last 16, but an 11,850 break stopped Milko turning sour. Tony Walsh could not live with him in the quarters either.

In the semis, Keith broke his own new record with an amazing 21,750, forcing John Burrows to concede when his reply stalled at 6,120.

Sue Mariner, now the highest-ranked lady in the main British Rankings despite falling down the ladies lists, almost made it a family double, but was obviously too intent on how the old man was doing at the other end of the room. She lost the Plate Final to the underrated Colin S.thouse.

As usual in Sussex, there was a prize for the best Over-50 year old, won by Ernie Jordan, but NOTHING for the youngest Over-50 year old. Your BBQ bloke had "celebrated" just two days earlier. WOWWEE!

DARK HORSE SENIOR SHOWS HE HAS COME OF AGE

When your reporter was told the list of qualifiers for this year's All-England, it seemed fairly obvious who the two favourites would be, with one dark horse who could possibly upset the apple-cart if the draw was favourable, i.e. if one group was loaded.

Well, one group WAS loaded, but the dark horse was right IN AMONGST IT, and yet the dark horse won through and captured his first major title.

NIGEL has joined the SENIOR group of players.

Group 1 was the graveyard, just ask Dave Franklin, the Cambridge champion who would not have liked the draw for groups made just before the tournament kicked off.

He was to face the FOUR favourites for the title in his group.

By sheer coincidence, the top two faced each other first, and Mark Turner (now representing Oxfordshire) LOST a vital 7,000 break in the first leg against John Burrows (on John's first break) who is now almost back to his best form. It prevented Mark winning 5-0 and would have set him up for a really good chance of taking the much-coveted title for the first time.

John actually won 3-2 which was to be his par for the day. After two further 3-2's he desperately needed a 5-0 against Franklin in his last game, but a nervy performance cost him dearly.

The Cambridge champion had not exactly been the punch-bag as had been expected. He had earlier been close to taking the 2nd leg off Barry Radford, but, at the end of the day, had only taken one leg from eight chances. But it was a vital leg. It was the 1st leg against Burrows, and ultimately was probably the leg which cost the Wycombe flyer a place in the final.

Mark produced big breaks in a 3-2 defeat to Radford and a 3-2 win over Senior, but, by the time he made two more big ones against Franklin, he was already out of contention, but now up to his best-ever No.3 position in the rankings.

It gave him 12 pts in the group, the same as John who had won all four games. The fact that Mark's aggregate scores were much better was NOT a factor, and neither was the fact that Nigel's aggregate scores would only have given him FOURTH place in the group if that had been the sole criteria.

In the deciding game of the group, Senior (9 pts) faced Radford (10 pts). Nigel won a low-scoring first leg but the fur started to fly in the 2nd. Nigel started off with 8,850 and Barry came back with 8,840, deciding to go for the 100 hole at the death to lose by 10, rather than the 200 to win the leg.

Barry could not have qualified with those two points as it would have left all four level on 12. So he did not go for it. Perhaps John should have bought him a drink!

So it was just not to be Burrows' day, although he jumps 17 places to No.28 in the rankings and is provisionally No.17 for next year. Neither place shows John's true place among the very best players in the game.

The other group was less star-studded but not less interesting.

Your reporter now apologises for completing nearly a page of detail on this event before mentioning one of the undoubted stars of the day.....PHIL HAWKINS.

Yes, OK, Phil had a much easier group with which to contend, but you can only beat those players who pick up a cue against you.

None of his four opponents were ranked in the top 100 before the event, and his "Fazza Odds" (see page 17) would have been slashed AFTER the draw was made. Or perhaps the draw itself was rigged by some secret betting coup on the sub-continent?

Phil started in glorious fashion with 5-0 wins over Kent's unlikely representative Diana Welburn and South Gloucestershire's "champion" Mark Allfrey. But then inexplicably lost two low-scoring legs to Ian Coleman (one of the few nice guys from Northants, despite the choice of his one supporter, ed.)

Allfrey, ex-Hampshire "also-ran", was becoming the surprise dangerman to Phil's hopes, and when he beat Coleman 5-0 in his last game, the pressure was on for Phil to at least take the aggregate point against Dave Bewey.

All's well in the first as Phil won by 5,000 but a Bewey fightback in the 2nd almost gave Phil another Surrey nightmare.

The final count gave Phil a place in the final on aggregate points only, as he and Mark were level on 13 pts and three wins each. No recount was necessary when the initial maths gave Hawkins a total of 61,870 to Allfrey's 18,840. Very close call.

At last.....the final.....
 Phil lost the toss and kicked off with 1,760 before leaving the one-up short.
 Nigel seemed tentative as you would expect, compared with Phil's YEARS, and years, and YEARS of experience.
 Nigel made 3,050 before Phil settled down for a comfortable 7,300 break.
 Well, comfortable UNTIL he rattled a pin just before he came off with a minute to play. The look on the face of the scorer (Myra) said it all.
 Nigel made 430 with the remaining balls, but trailed by 5,580 at half-way.
 He started the second leg much better and looked much calmer, even when having to play a very slow shot up the middle into the 100 hole. He was off just after that, with a score of 6,270.
 Phil struggled on and got the balls back, but played a poor split shot and was off with 1,090 (just 400 ahead with 6½ minutes to play), and was the subject of another look from Myra.
 But Nigel missed and Phil could only make a 200 as the game deteriorated to a spot of panic on both sides. Nigel made only 40, Phil 370 and it was still there for the taking.
 Nigel then made the most important break of his life (even better than his 12,000 in Jersey last November, AGAINST Farrelly and also taking his highest break off him).
 It was only 1,180 but it gave him the title by just **250 points**.
 After Mark James' success last year, can Nigel follow him into the England line-up?

Kevin Tunstall just carries on and on!

We MUST try to get extra prize money for these events as he wishes to retire from his job soon. But Katie must be given due credit for just carrying on and on and now has nearly TWICE as many ranking points as No.2 Keith Sheard and 2½ times as many as No.3 Mark Turner. The man's consistency is unbelievable! After the slight hiccup against Steve Mariner in the Sussex Open, he re-starts another run of finals, perhaps.

He lost the toss in this final, against team-mate and normal golfing partner Mark Turner who actually has quite a good record against Katie (or so he tells us).

Table 1 looked very tricky, and there was quite a lot of discussion on the desk beforehand as to whether to stage the final on it. Yet Katie made an initial 16,700 in under 16 minutes, despite the white ball whipping out of the right-hand 50 hole several times.

The last minute's play saw each player make two visits each, giving Katie a lead of 16,960 to 130.

Mark also suffered "the whip", but let's get back to the match report.....

He made just 2,840 and then a further 1,750 on his 2nd visit, but the game was over when Katie made 2,220.

As usual, Katie produced a string of breaks, even though the organisers had weirdly decided NOT to award a prize for the best break of the day. 18,140 against Alan Huntley and 20,310 against Hampshire's Tony Webster, who was making a surprise appearance in the last 16, having beaten PETE Sainsbury by just 80 in the previous round.

Tony was the only low-ranked player in the top half of the draw once the fourth round started. The others were ranked 1, 2, 5, 9, 11, 15 and 33, which proved that the best place to be was in the bottom half where only Mark Turner (3) and Paul Wing (6) were ranked highly, plus Phil Hawkins (17), Barry Holt (18) and Ray Sturgess (35).

Kevin's quarter-final was against Mr Sheard and he was forced to come back from 16,000 down....he did it with 17,620.

He then set a fantastic 18,580 target in the semi-final against Steve Biggs, assuring everyone that he can do it both ways.....so Jan assures us!

Mr Sheard, previously known as lots of nicknames including Milko, had had his usual phenomenal day, setting good targets on each occasion until he met Katie.

He made 19,990 against Merv (The Swerve) Yearwood and 18,270 against Terry (The Nugget) Cook before facing Paul Sainsbury in a controversial last 16 match.

Again, Milko set a 15,260 target for Super(Market)man who had himself averaged over 15,000 per leg until then. There were rumours that the bar had dropped early when Paul finished just 690 pts short.

The other games in that death valley at the top of the draw were also big clashes: The 2001 All-England Champion Mark James simply could not get to grips with another tough table and was out-bombed (or possibly bored to death) by Farrelly.

The man who lost that 2001 final Gary Johnson lost on an adjacent table to Steve Biggs who somehow built up a big first leg lead and hung on.

The next round brought together Farrelly and Biggs, best mates and pairs partners at local and national level for as long as anyone can remember. Fazza realised the table was superb and felt he had to play it out quickly to get out of reach. Sadly, very sadly as it happens, he fluffed it at just 2,820. He was given one more chance but he failed to get the balls back and Biggsy made a 14,630 break, despite very few competitive games during recent months.

Steve made an early mistake in the 2nd leg and Pete (now fully representing OXON) saw a glimmer of a chance of making over 15,000 in about 13 minutes. A determined effort was never quite enough as he made 11,150 in ten minutes, but then missed the break shot trying to rush it too much. Sad, sad, sad.

Mark Turner's progress in the bottom half was steady, against Janet Burns, Pauline Withey, Jon Bamsey (where he made a 20k), Barry Holt and Pete Lee, but the semi-final was against a young man by the name of Phil Hawkins.

Phil must have thought he was dreaming. Yes, we know he has been there before but look at his list of opponents:

John Burrows made a 15,590 opener but then reflected that he should have gone faster when Phil came back with 16,700.

Bernie McCluskey fluffed his opening effort and Phil won the first leg by over 10,000. He held on well in the second.

Geoff Mace, known as "Who?" outside Oxford, won the first leg in the last 16 by 2,610 but Phil settled down to make it to the last eight, where he played Paul Wing but Phil was never in danger.

Mr Hawkins is now at No.14 in the rankings, and PROVISIONALLY No.9.

With no HIGH BREAK PRIZE to win for the big boys, Janet Burns won the highest ladies break prize, even though it was unusually in the Plate Competition.

Dino Clark beat Keith Lewendon in the Plate final with a splendid 2nd leg break.
