#### EDITORIAL

I have relegated yet another "last" chapter of the seemingly never-ending story of the stupid clash between Northants and myself to the very last page of this BBQ. Please read it because I wish everyone to know what I think of how I have been treated.

PROPOSED 2003 ALL-ENGLAND CALENDAR

As per last quarter's Editorial, All-England Secretary Dave Barnes is proposing to eliminate the Summer events from the 2003 Calendar. These dates are now proposed for discussion:

APR 6: All-England Individuals (Men) & Special Ladies Open

APR 13: Inter-Area Championships; Men's 7's, Ladies 5's & Under-22's

SEP 28: County Championships & National Under 22's

OCT 5: Ladies County Championships

OCT 12: Alternative Rules

NOV 16: Team Championships & All-England (Ladies)

NOV 23: National Mixed Pairs

NOV 30: Grand Prix Finals, Over-50's, Over 60's

The main changes are therefore (1) that the Men's All-England Individuals would be brought forward to April, thus requiring every county to be able to produce their champion much earlier than in recent years, and (2) that the Mixed Pairs would be wedged between two other dates in November. We would, however, have to liaise with the Jersey organisers in future years so that nothing clashed with the World Championships.

SURREY'S LADIES EVENTS

I announced in the last BBQ that, as the Surrey organisers had not submitted details of their Ladies Pairs and had continually failed to keep me abreast of their so-called "ranking events". I would be proposing that the "British Ladies Open" be removed from the Grand Prix Series at the next AGM.

However, I have now received personal assurances from Simon Tinto that I will in future receive stats within two weeks of each event and, as long as that actually happens. I will continue to include both events in the ranking system.

DON'T BRING YOUR OWN FOOD TO READING!

Please will you all take a final warning that you are not allowed to eat your own food inside the Reading PO Club when their food is readily available. Not only is it likely to atagonise the staff there, but if they decide not to make food available at the venue in future we may have to look for another venue. So don't be so selfish.

LADIES INTER-AREA CUP: As there may be less teams in the Ladies Inter-Area Cup next year unless some changes are made, we are currently considering two possible proposals for the 2003 competition. One idea from Reading believes that the best way would be to make it a THREE-A-SIDE event, with some associations possibly able to enter TWO teams. Other people believe the best way would be to combine the C Team Shield with the Ladies event and, bearing in mind "D" teams will also be allowed, this could make it a much bigger (and better?) competition. It would still be possible to present a trophy to the "best" ladies team if none reached the C Team Shield final.

## AN EVENT THAT KATIE CAN'T WIN AT LAST!

Kevin Tunstall is useless at trying to win the Bucks Open, officially!

He reached yet another final, his usual achievement over the last few months, but was comprehensively beaten by big rival Keith Sheard.

Katie started the event a whopping 144.5 RP ahead of No.2 Sheard but finished the day "only" 140.7 RP ahead, a devastating blow to Katie's hopes of staying at the top until well into the year 2020, or probably not.

While Oxfordshire's top players continue to rule the roost, it now seems almost inevitable that when they are in different halves of the draw, they are odds-on to meet in the final.

Keith lost the toss but proceeded to play the table out at a very impressive speed. He made no mistakes at all and had registered 23,400, the best break of the day, by the end of the 16½ minute clock.

Kevin did not seem to fancy the challenge, and made a fairly sedate start, not helped by dropping the red ball and accidentally kicking it behind Linda Sheard who was refereeing the final.

She returned it "far too quickly" leading her old man to give her a few choice words of advice.

Nevertheless, Katie had made 8,000 in 7:20, 10,000 by 8:50 and 12,000 by 10:15, gradually building up towards the required tempo. But most onlookers felt he was never quite in touch and, at 16,000 after just under 13½ minutes, still needed over 7,000 in barely more than 3 minutes.

In fact, that signalled his downfall as he, somehow, missed a break shot and came off at 16,120, conceding after one further visit.

Keith, as usual, barely made a mistake all day and did not lose a leg until the final.

He started off with an "international" against Jersey's Harry Barbet, making a 15,160 break in the first leg (against the advantage of break) and then 22,490 in the 2nd.

After a low-key dismissal of Steve Ross, Keith was in an iota of trouble against Oxford team-mate and one-time pairs partner Gary Johnson, but made 14,140 in reply.

Two more big scores against Barry Holt took him into a semi-final with one of the surprise successes of the day Tony Webster (Portsmouth). Keith proceeded to play out the first leg for 18,970 and then make another 16,890 break in the 2nd.

And he STILL had the best of the break in his "lunchbox", ready for the final. Katie would be unlikely to admit it, but the fact that this is the only Open that he has never won probably applied the necessary pressure to prevent him from doing so.

Dick Dewdney probably wondered what had hit him in the first round. Katie made a 16,950 break in the first leg. Dennis Claydon was more likely to trouble Katie in the next but the threat never materialised.

In theory, Katie's biggest test was in the third round against a John Burrows, now undoubtedly nearing his best form. But Katie took up the challenge and played it out for 20,180. Unfortunately John missed his first one-up and was literally "on the way home".

Katie made 19,050 against Dino Clark in the last 16 and the Wycombe player's reply of 16,930 was great to see but never quite threatening, unlike Dino's forthcoming trip to Thailand with the rest of the "Gate boys".

One was heard to say, "We may come back with a few ranking points", if I heard that correctly.

Ernie Jordan is one of those responsible for getting Katie into the game, tutoring him from the age of NINE, so he only has himself to blame! The first leg was 8k each but Katie squeezed home in the 2nd 10k-6k.

Apart from Dino's superb effort, the only leg Katie lost before the final was against Terry Isard, a former All-England Champion (not a lot of people know that!)

Terry won the first well but a Katie 12,650 break in the 2nd had the final say. Tony Webster's appearance in the semi-finals was most notable. Although he was given comfortable early games against Billy Howard and Tim Carter, he wo uld not have been expected to beat either Reading Secretary Dave Alder or (once again!) Scotland's only participant Lorin Clough. Tony moves up 31 places in the rankings to No.63.

But probably the biggest surprise of the event was Paul Caistor. He felled much bigger fish in the shape of Alan Chaloner, Mark Turner (with a 13,450 break) and Dennis Atkins' little brother Bob before going out to Eric Hill or all people. (Sorry Eric!)

Pete Farrelly's recent record against Nigel Senior is now 2-1 in favour of the current All-England Champ. The series commenced in Jersey 2001 when Farrelly slipped up early, allowing Nigel to get a 12,000 break, not only progressing in the tournament at Farrelly's expense, but taking the prize for best break thus far held by Farrelly.

Some revenge was extracted when Farrelly (and Di Welburn) ousted Nigel (and "Osama Lin" Baden) from the Mixed Pairs in July. The decider went to Nigel here, but possibly only because of one reckless shot from Fazza.

Farrelly had reached 11,000 in only 91/2 minutes when, rather than playing safe, he went for a big break-back attempt and felled the pin. Although he still won the 1st leg (800-400), Nigel made a steady 10,220 to open the 2nd.

This series is sure to run on (and it is my turn next... ed)

Jane Wood lost to Dino Clark in the first round. Not surprising you may say, but that is the first time Jane has not won her first match in any of the Opens this year.

Bucks Open Champion 2001 Paul Sainsbury left early. After having beaten Terry Cook in the 1st, he went out to Tony Walsh.

Dennis Atkins was also shocked to go out early, losing his first round match with Dawn Flattery, and with players like Steven Sheard, Harry Barbet, Phil Hawkins and Ray Hussey all losing their first matches, the Plate Competition looked interesting.

The semi-finals pitted Barbet against Atkins, the latter winning with two 9,000

scores, and Hawkins against Farrelly, the YOUNGEST of these four Over-50's.

Hawkins raced ahead and stayed there. The final against Atkins was scheduled for the wrong table, pointed out after they had started, as Dennis had lost his first round match on it.

But it was very tricky and Dennis only won the 1st leg 1,760 - 1,170. Phil seemed well in command in the 2nd with about 6 minutes to go but Dennis somehow girded his loins (so to speak) and made a late vital 4,000 break to win by 800.

There was another fine performance from Diana Welburn. She made a 5.950 break (the best by a lady) in the third round match against No.8 Gary Johnson to put the 2000 All-England Individual finalist (and England International) under extreme pressure.

She led after the first leg by 7.590 but, after a visit to the Gents (vital, compelling information this...eh), he fought back to win with 11,000 in the 2nd.

STATUS:

J must play in Jersey to have played in enough events to qualify. JF can only qualify by reaching final in Jersey.

#### QUALIFYING CONDITIONS:

After Jersey, the top 16 will be invited to the Grand Prix Finals, subject to certain criteria. You have to have played in at least HALF of the events available to you, i.e. Ladies 4 out of 8, Men 3 out of 6, although this rule is waived for those who reach the final in Jersey.

In most events, the winner is awarded 15, runner-up 10, semi-finalists 6, last eight 3 and last sixteen 1. In Ladies Opens, the winner is awarded 8, runner-up 5, semi-finalists 3 and last eight 1. In the World Championship, the winner is awarded 20, runner-up 15, semi-finalists 9, last eight 6, last 16 3 and last 32 1.

If any players are level on points, the following will decide positions:

(1) number of events qualified for GP points, so three 1 pts is better than one 3. (2) total number of matches won in GP events.

(3) number of GP events played in during the year.

(4) toss (or draw of lots) for the choice of position in the draw, but not if this would decide whether a player finishes in 16th or 17th positions etc, in which case a play-off will be required.

Note that if any ENGLISH-based player does not arrive for the event (or declines invitation) a reserve will be allowed to take that position in the draw. If a Jersey player declines the invitation, the whole seeded list will be re-classified, with reserves added to the bottom of the list.

Dress Code will apply: waistcoat, bow-tie, black trousers, black shoes.

Keith was given first break in the final but failed to get going, even knocking down the black pin early on (note: for this event THAT only counted as a white up to the last ball shot).

Keith also lost a handy 410 break by missing a straight shot at a ball near the 30 before Dennis made his first impression, a break of 650. Keith followed with 450 but Dennis marched on with further efforts of 860 and 690 to put him 1,720 ahead.

Keith came back at the end of the first leg with a 940, but still went into the 2nd leg with a deficit of 790.

Dennis failed to make any impact off his break, but then Keith lost a 300 to spur Dennis into action with successive breaks of 380, 320 and 450.

Keith made a small contribution of 160 but then lost a vital 880 by missing a difficult ball up the middle of the table. It seemed all over when Dennis stretched his lead by another 300 and the match was out of reach even though Keith made another 500.

Dennis is now up to No.12 in the rankings, and provisionally 10 for next year, but,

wait for it, Dave Barnes is now PROVISIONALLY No.66.

It must be stated that only 12 of the top 50 ranked players entered this event,

quite a poor turn out by the game's best players.

However, how good it was to see the late Wolfie Storch's two enthusiastic youngsters in the draw, with Christopher actually getting into the rankings by scoring over 2,000 against Alan Chaloner who was sadly called away as it started getting interesting.

There were other fine performances by our younger generation. 12-year-old Philip Skillen played his first ever competitive match, looking enthusiastic for the future, and inevitably we have to mention 16-year-old Steven Sheard who potted a last-ball 200 to oust the current All-England Champion Nigel Senior in the 2nd round, even though he "blotted his copybook" by then LOSING to Mr Barnes (oops!)

Great to see Pete Soanes win his first National event, beating Diana Welburn in the Plate final. Finally, Hampshire as a whole deserve much credit, fielding EIGHTEEN of the 56 entries, three more than any other county.
