In order to raise about £100, the Assoc will donate £60 and the subs will increase by 50p to £8 per year as from the AGM. A big thank you to Richard Hockey for providing most of the paper used to produce this edition of the BBQ.

GRAND PRIX CHANGES

A proposal from the Sussex Committee (accepted 10-3) that the rule be abolished which requires players to have played in a minimum number of Grand Prix events in order to qualify for the Finals.

It was suggested by Kevin Tunstall and accepted that the Grand Prix finals be changed to a group format, still seeded and sorted out in this way: Group A. 1, 16, 8, 9. Group B: 4, 13, 5, 12. Group C: 2, 15, 7, 10. Group D: 3, 14, 6, 11. Group winners then qualifying for the semi-finals.

OVER 50's and OVER 60's

In view of the above, these senior events would have to start earlier, probably at 10.0 or 10.30, and the Grand Prix players would have to be present about 12.0 or 12.30.

To facilitate calculation of the new format, entries for both senior events would have to be made IN ADVANCE rather than accepting entries on the day. That way, entries could be taken up to the previous week (Nov 23) and the draw be made AT the Mixed Pairs enabling everyone to know exactly what time they would be playing.

But last year's decision that those entering the Over-60's also had to enter the Over-50's was rescinded, thus allowing players to enter only the senior event if they so wish. Of the 38 Over-50 entries in 2002, an amazing 19 had also been Over-60, and there seemed no advantage in enforcing them to play in an event they did not wish to

ROUND-ROBIN RULES

On a proposal from Kevin Tunstall and Mark James, the emphasis was unanimously changed from winning LEGS to winning MATCHES, by awarding 1.0 pts for an overall match win, PLUS 0.2 for each leg and 0.1 for aggregate (or if decimal points are not required, everything could be multiplied by 10).

(The proposal may just as well say 11 pts for the win plus 2 pts for each leg, but this change is unlikely to affect the ranking points awarded.)

KEN HUSSEY'S ANNUAL REPORT

Ken reported that the company now rented less than 250 tables, and announced an immediate reduction in the sponsorship of the game. There should be no new or resurrected events as the tables would not be made available. They would continue supporting the existing Opens, league finals once-a-year and All-England events but no cash sponsorship would be forthcoming.

The lower-ranked player would also take the break in each leg. The fee would be £5 each person, proceeds going to a charity of Sandra's choosing SPONSORSHIP

Paul Wing stated that, as he vehemently disagreed with the proposal which would now allow players into the Grand Prix finals without entering many events, he had decided to withdraw sponsorship of the event in 2003, but will now sponsor the 2004 International

IT'S TERRY'S TITLE

After being beaten in two previous British Isles Open Championship finals (in 1990 and 1999), Terry has finally "Raced" (sorry, I felt compelled to do ited!) to the ultimate title, the World Championship, in front of a packed De Normandie Hotel crowd.

It has to be said that his home County of Sussex made up the biggest continguent, still on a high after seeing their adopted Queen of the Green Baize, Sue Mariner, capture the Plate Competition final against the very youthful James Jeanne. (More of that later!)

The unassuming Terry Race rarely seems to let his hair down during the weekend, (in fact, like many of us, he has far less to let down these days), but he knows what he is in Jersey for, and, although he is never seen on the circuit from one year to the next, he always produces some fine performances when it really matters.... in Jersey!

Let's hope he can enjoy his prize: a week for two at a 3-star hotel in Tenerife,

Majorca or the Costa del Sol, courtesy of TRAVTEL & CHANNEL HOTELS.

Terry declined an invitation to the Grand Prix finals, and will not be making the trip back to Jersey in February when England are determined to end the run of Jersey successes. But he knows he can always look back to this weekend as, in the words of Winston Churchill, his "greatest hour".

More accurately, it was his finest SEVEN hours, because he hardly put a foot wrong

once the tournament switched to its two-leg format at 3.30 on Sunday afternoon.

You could even go back to Saturday lunchtime when he started his quest against Gina Sherratt, also from Sussex and a former multi-prize winner herself. A 7,770 break against her and then another 7,920 break against Surrey's Keith Wilkinson saw him easily through to the second day.

His "poorest" scoring performance was in the third round against Jersey stalwart

Fred Jeanne, but 5,190 was still creditable and ample.

Stepping up a gear, Terry made breaks of 10,990 and 11,080 to annihilate poor Graham Huby, and then used some of his vast experience to beat holder Jim Millward to reach the quarter-finals.

Obviously boosted by that, he was completely undaunted by Dennis Helleur playing out the first leg for an 11,440 break, replying with a wonderful 13,100 break with time to spare.

That had his supporters in raptures but the best was still to come. To the total dismay of all watching, especially your reporter who wrote Terry off completely when Trevor Gallienne (Guernsey's shining star) accumulated a 15,840 lead at the half-way stage.

Terry's chance had appeared over when he missed a ball between the 20 and 30 pockets and failed to take advantage of Trevor coming off with only 3,900. The Guernsey man raised the pace and stormed in with another 11,940. The clock was only 15 mins 20 secs, so Terry would surely have too much to do, considering his potting style of play.

As far as your reporter can remember, Terry did not take a "split" shot, but somehow closed to within touching distance as the bar dropped. He contrived to give himself a chance, was forced to play a "split" with two of the last three balls and then calmly potted the "200" to win by 30 and send the whole crowd into raptures this time.

The final was not a classic, but that was what made the game so exciting for those

packing the room to get the best possible view.

Nigel Ryall, probably one of the hardest workers on the organising committee as Tables Manager, came through the other half of the draw.

Nigel made a total clearance of 14,200 against Steve Huntley in the first round, beat the dangerous Paul Wing in the second. Bill Houlton in the third, and then made breaks of 6.330 & 14,460 in the 4th before ousting another dangerman Chris Tupper in the last 16.

Nigel had a tough quarter-final against Mark James, even after building up a hefty first leg lead of over 7,000. The Sussex man opened the second leg with a 6,810 break to close the gap to just 280, but then failed to retrieve the break back at his next visit and Nigel stormed away again.

Nigel again took a handy first leg lead in his semi-finals against Mike Matthews, and then just held off a sterling fight back in the 2nd.

And so to the final itself:

Terry won the toss and Nigel opened with a solid 4,480, to which Terry replied with 2,980. After four further visits each, the scores had not moved on a great deal, but Nigel potted the 100 at the 2nd attempt and took a 5,330 - 3,430 interval lead.

Terry opened the 2nd leg with 4,610, taking up 7 minutes so obviously going a lot

slower than in the semi-final, and why not?

Nigel seemed to be going well, but, at 1,250, had a ball kick back from the 50 hole on

a "follow-through" shot and then he missed the next shot.

Nigel showed a slight smile of resignation as Terry got the break back after 9% minutes. Three minutes and a break of 2,100 later. Terry led by 3,560 and Nigel knocked down a pin on what transpired to be his last visit of the tournament, before Terry again got the break back and made another 1,930, sinking the 100 to quite a tumultuous cheer.

And now, how did everyone else get on..... Farrelly got on very well actually.....not in the tournament you understand, but he did quite well in his predictions, with 7 of the 16 "sheet-winners" being tipped to do so. SHEET 1 (Winner NIGEL BISSON as tipped): Nigel had an easy passage. SHEET 2 (Winner ERIC HILL as tipped): Dorset's best eased through despite the presence of Jenny Noel, Lorin Clough and Paul Sainsbury who lost to big Andy Farmer-Wright. SHEET 3 (Winner HARRY BARBET as tipped): Harry had no problems from his opening break of 13,600, then a string of good scores (including one against former runner-up Bob King). Nick Barnett failed to make any impact, losing his second round match with Alan Woodworth on table 11 [see Nick's memorable quote on page 14]. Woodworth also beat James Jeanne (runner-up in the Plate) before giving Harry his closest tussle. SHEET 4 (Winner TREVOR GALLIENNE, tip STEVE AHIER): This was a minefield with reigning All-England champion Nigel Senior, former winners Gallienne and Ahier, and good outside bets Barry Holt and Dennis Atkins all in contention. Two-time winner Steve Ahier (in 1990 & 1991) put out Senior but lost to Gallienne, who made breaks of 7,300 & 6,000. SHEET 5 (Winner KEVIN TUNSTALL, tip STEVE MARINER): Katie's presence dominated. beating Sue Leach, Richard Hockey, tough compatriot Mariner and then Wallingford team-mate Mark Turner. Mark started with only 2,920 and Katie's 5,340 and then another 4,800 in the 2nd leg left Turner floundering. A 5,380 Turner rally was too late. SHEET 6 (Winner DENNIS HELLEUR, tip GRAHAM BISSON): Helleur survived a very tough sheet, beating former winner Graham Bisson, but his expected clash with year 2000 winner Bernie McCluskey never materialised when the latter lost to Dawn Flattery. Ernie Jordan's MUCH better half, in easily the biggest shock of the early stages. SHEET 7 (Winner JIM MILLWARD, as tipped): Holder Jim had a tough sheet but prevailed by beating Peter Noel (winner in 1984 & 1999) in round 2 and Geoff Jukes in round 4. SHEET 8 (Winner TERRY RACE, as tipped): Fred Jeanne put out Terry's only other serious rival Mark Brewster.

SHEET 9 (Winner CHRIS TUPPER, tip "MODESTY FORBIDS"): Chris calmly edged through, despite only one score over 4,000. Farrelly came through a tougher than expected first round against Dick Cable but then narrowly lost to Bella Stoner who started well and then made a good break when Fazza broke down in the dying minutes. She was SO lucky!!!! It is embarrassingly the fourth time in the last six years that he has been beaten by a female player in an early round. Records show that since reaching the semi-final in the last year at the Inn-on-the-Park (1995), and losing to Mick Lingham in the last 16 in 1996, he has lost to Sue Mariner (1997) Michelle Baden (1998) Janie Macoy (2000) and now Bella Stoner (2002), so if defeats by Dave Constable (1999) and Nigel Senior (2001) are included, you could say he has been beaten by a "lady" SIX times in six years!!!! SORRY YOU TWO!!!

SHEET 10 (Winner NIGEL RYALL, as tipped).

SHEET 11 (Winner MICK FAIRS, tip ERNIE JORDAN): Ernie fell at the first hurdle against Martin Atkins, who lost to Terry Molloy, who lost to Vince Watts, who lost to Mick Fairs. So you could say I got that one "Fair(s)ly" wrong!!! Mick was a surprise, lowering his

ranking from 94 to 59 with this event.

SHEET 12 (Winner MARK JAMES, as tipped): Mark's charge up the rankings continued, despite a tough draw. He needed wins over a former winner Tim Ringsdore and England Ladies captain Pauline Withey to progress. Tim is making a comeback to the game after taking a few years off since his unexpected Championship win in 1983. "Auntie" Pauline had earlier ended Steven Sheard's first year in the main competition after he had won the Junior event five years on the trot.

SHEET 13 (Winner DAVE GALLICHAN, tip RAY STURGESS): Ray lost to Dave, after three 7,000+ scores, including two 6,000 breaks. Dave is the one person in the room that your

reporter actually "looks up to". But only 'cause he is about 6 ft 6 in!!

SHEET 14 (Winner STEVE HAWKES, tip TONY WALSH): Hawkes came quietly through the

sheet which saw Walshy succumb to Kent's Craig Carlson in round 2.

SHEET 15 (Winner MIKE MATTHEWS, tip KEITH SHEARD): Money was at stake here, my money(!), but Keith (the 1998 champion) went out on that infamous table 11 in round one when he simply could not get the one-up right. Opponent Chris Saville opened up with a hard-fought 3,390 and admitted to bad nerves. Keith put the first one-up attempt round the back of the 50 and then, given one last chance, hit it far too softly, to allow Saville to travel (remember Saville's travels?) back to the table to finish him off. And before you gloat too much at my financial loss, it was Katie who benefited. All donations to the address at the top of page 1 of this BBQ would be gratefully accepted. Chris then seemed to have a simple task of qualifying but lost out two rounds later to Richard Wooton (Sussex), who then lost to much under-rated Jerseyman, Mike Matchews.

SHEET 16 (Winner ROGER TAYLOR, tip SUE MARINER): Taylor won by beating Sue in the

first round, and a former winner Terry Oakley in the second.

The LAST 16, the other QUARTER-FINALS, and the Jersey/England battle:

Trevor Gallienne beat Harry Barbet despite a break of 9,350 from the latter, and made breaks of 11,230 & 16,550 against Nigel Bisson, comfortable winner over Eric Hill.

Dennis Helleur beat Katie with a slow 9,460 opener and then holding on to the lead in

the 2nd leg.

Proceedings were held up for a while when the organisers inexplicably ordered an immediate two-leg replay after Mark James and Mick Fairs had played out a DRAW, but Mark came through fairly easily second time around.

Mike Matthews beat Roger Taylor narrowly, but made a break of 12,380 in the

quarter-final against Dave Gallichan, winner over Steve Hawkes in the last 16.

There is a subliminal extra edge to this championship each year, as shown statistically at the foot of page 19. UK visitors well outnumber locals at the outset, and it is always interesting to see IF OR WHEN Jersey players start to outnumber the visitors.

This year UK were still on top in the last 32, having 20 participants against Jersey's 10. But it evened out in the next round before there were only Mark James and Terry Race from England left in the last eight. [Mark is regarded as "English" for this purpose as he is in the England team, despite his very soft Ulster brogue.]

The Plate Competition simply gets more and more popular, and must be one of the reasons why we saw a bigger overall entry this year. The finalists must feel very good when they are called upon to provide the hors d'oeuvre for the main final on the table which has just been set up especially for the climax of the weekend.

It is not unusual either to see better bar billiards in the Plate final due to the pressure

on the players in the main event.

It started in grand style this year. James Jeanne, in his first ever Senior event, lost the toss but kicked off with a very creditable 4,620 break, proudly watched by dad Bob and an excited "Uncle Fred".

Sue Mariner replied with 6,060 before James made another 1,110 to leave it very finely balanced at 6,320 - 5,780 in Sue's favour at half-way.

Sue lost her initial 450 when she left it near the 10 hole. James moved the ball but only made 90 as nerves began to show. Sue's 1,130 was countered by James' 1,930 and he was back in the lead...just. Three more visits each did not move the scores on very much

and then James should have sealed it when he retrieved the break back with 41/2 minutes to go but only made 790. Sue could have done the same but missed at 1,460. James missed a ball in front of the 10. Sue hit it but missed just after the bar dropped. James nervously potted a few but Sue was just out of reach and the 100 gave her victory by 600 overall.

Odd that Steve Mariner had donated the trophy for this event. Sue had told him to as

she wanted "rid of it" before promptly winning it back.

The Junior event only produced five entrants this year, disappointing when you consider many of last year's players were now in the senior event leaving it very open to bring on a new winner.

Maria Rayson conducted the event, nevertheless, which saw Matthew Malorey crowned the first local to win the event after a five-year monopoly of Steven Sheard who graciously handed over the trophy, but could not be forced into making a speech.

At least the BBQ campaign to allow Steven into the big event was successful, after hearing that he had been told he would have to play in the Juniors one more year.

ALMA'LLRIGHT AS SAVILLE'S TRAVELLERS TAKE THE TITLE

It is, as far as the editor can recall, the first time in BBQ history that a headline has been allowed to take up TWO lines, but the Alma (Deal) deserve it!

One minute, the admin desk were being informed that the 5th leg of the final would not be required as Chequers were "walking it", the next minute they had lost 3-1 already. leaving Kevin without a game in the scheduled "timed-break" deciding leg.

The Alma were not the highest scoring team at the event, they were not even the highest scoring team in their group. In fact they were only No.4 of the eight teams in the scoring stakes, but they stormed away with the title in style.

Things were not looking good when the day started, with them only beating Barton Seagrave CC (the weakest team in the group, on paper, and in reality at the final outcome) by 3-2 and the signs did not improve when Tim Bourner was given the devil's number (666) for his meal ticket.

But things looked much better when they beat last year's runners-up, the Stadium from Hove, in their next match, [although they wished it to be pointed out that this was the WORTHING league team as opposed to the BRIGHTON team last year]. With captain Chris Saville beating Jim Millward (who was in BOTH teams) with a 7,750 break amd Tim Bourner and John Mitchell winning against break advantage (v I Lelliott and N Senior respectively), the Alma were on a roll.

The group was so tight at that point, with the Stadium and the star-studded Caversham WMC only one point adrift. But Alma knew that if they beat Caversham in the last group game, the Sussex team would need to beat lowly Barton Seagrave 5-0.

Both games ended 3-2 as Ted Batchelor scored 7,120 against break advantage of outof-sorts Keith Lewendon, John Mitchell made it 2-0 and the skipper made it 3-1.

So, although Bernie McCluskey made a 10,100 break in the 5th leg, the Kent side "hopped"-it into the final.

Jim Millward's 11,390 against Northants "good-guy" Ian Coleman looked like capturing the best break prize as his consolation at that point.

In GROUP B, the Derby Tavern from Portsmouth were sensational.

Sensationally unlucky that is!

Any team including Dennis Claydon, Alan Chaloner and Chris Newson have got to be unlucky if they get through three matches without winning a leg.

The Ship (Redhill) were the first to send them packing, followed by the Red Lion

(Penn, near High Wycombe). At that point favourites Chequers (Dorchester) were struggling badly.

They had beaten the Bucks side 4-1 (with Katie taking out John Burrows, but "soon to be retiring" Dave Mahoney smashing 11,300 past Ray Hayter) but then lost 3-2 to the Ship.

The Chequers skipper called that a "Ship result", or something similar.

So, with one match left, the Chequers and the Red Lion were both two points behind the Ship.

Katie had to hope they could beat the Derby 4-1 and the Red Lion could beat the Ship

3-2, as Chequers' superior scoring could then see them through.

His team did the business 5-0, including a very good win for late call-up Stuart Florey who had had to sit out the earlier games after Katie "allegedly" slammed the car door on his fingers.

Qualification now depended upon the deciding leg of the other match which stood at 2-2 as all four legs had gone "with break advantage". If Dave Constable won, the Ship would "sail" into the final; if John Burrows won, the Red Lion would be "roaring" the Chequers on

John had first break but took time to settle and things got a bit edgy for all concerned. Eventually, John made a wonderful 12,730 break although some interested observers were willing him to come off much earlier.

That also rightly earned John the best break award.

The toss for the final was won by Katie who opted for three first breaks.

The first four legs were, as usual, played concurrently.

Florey was playing well again, scoring 7,030 against Bourner, but Mark Turner had started badly and was going down to Mike Callanan. Never mind, as Chequers still had Tony Martin and Kevin Godfrey blazing away, both against break advantage.

When both lost breaks of around 6,000 within a few minutes, Chris Saville and Ted Batchelor respectively took advantage. Skipper Katie had his coat on and off, allegedly because he was cold, or could it have been that he thought he would not be required for the 5th leg.

Well, he wasn't!

All the big names were at the top of the averages. Burrows, Sainsbury, Tunstall, McCluskey, Millward and Turner all topped 8,000 on the day. But sandwiched in the middle was Dave Mahoney, a High Wycombe league stalwart, stretching back to the early days, despite his "youthful good looks".

He has now said that he has played his last game. The BBQ hopes that this is not

true, but, if it is, let him be granted a very happy retirement.

And finally, Surrey's Laurie Roberts lost his tip at Reading Station. Strange 'cause his team-mate Dave Constable lost something else just outside Kings Cross many years ago.

BERNIE'S THE BEST; WINGY ALMOST WINS HIS OWN MONEY

When Bernie McCluskey plays well, very few come close to beating him, even now he is nearing the time when he will have to consider entering the Over 50's.

He is again the Master after having the audacity to beat the sponsor in the final of this year's Grand Prix Masters event.

And Paul Wing was the star of the day, offering to put up some of the prize money and then sneakily trying to win it back.

But the sad part of the day was the fact that SIX of the original seeded 16 players did not (or could not) attend. Nigel Ryall was unable to make it over from Jersey. Mark James. Pauline Withey. Sue Mariner and Terry Race all declined for different reasons, and then on top of all that, Mark Turner arrived a few minutes after the declared deadline of 3 00 and Gary Johnson was given his place.

It all helped to devalue the competition slightly, with match averages well down on the early years of the event. But changes to the format are in place for next year, as you will see from the AGM notes on page 4.

None of this mattered to Freddie Mercury, oh sorry, Bernie McCiuskey. He barely made a noticeable mistake all day:

- Coming back from over 8,000 down in the first round to beat Erme Jordan with a 14,710 break.
- (2) Setting a wonderful 17,690 target for poor Dennis Atkins in the second round.
- (3) Successfully chasing Keith Sheard's 16,880 in the semi-finals, by making his best break of the day, 19,100.
- (4) Setting another 17,320 target for Paul in the final.

Paul Wing was visibly devastated to slip up at 2,840 in reply. Bernie was heard to expel an enormous sigh when he got the break back immediately, and it was all over well before Bernie came off with another 7,990 to his name with five minutes left.

But it was Paul who was the star. Nobody was too surprised when he ousted Hampshire team-mate Chris Newson in the first round with a 12,450 break, but very few expected him to get the better of Katie in the second round

The undisputed No.1 was in good form when he made an 18,700 break to beat Tony Walsh's 17,860, but admitted to having to struggle to get to grips with the table in the match against Paul.

John Burrows was also back to his best when he made a hard-fought 15,290 break to beat Paul Sainsbury in the first round, and then another 10,980 break to oust Barry Hoit in the 2nd round, but he had no answer to Wingy's 17,770 in the semi-final.

John can console himself if he sees himself up to No.10 provisionally for 2003.

And finally, how lucky can Barry Holt get, being drawn against the duffer who missed his second one-up on such an easy table, and then only got back to the table about half an hour later. Burrows was not as kind!

Hampshire pair Tony Webster and Chris Newson.....enjoyed the day immensely.
