Editorial:

This one has taken even longer as there as TWO sections in this issue which have "amused" me somewhat whilst seeking things to do to fill my time. The first recalls the most momentous landmarks in BBQ history, followed by a complete list of trophy winners since Dec 1990. As a special celebration of this momentous 50th edition of this unique publication, I am including FOUR special items for your delectation. The first is a diary of incidents that I feel stand out in BBO history, but I may have missed out on your personal favourite. If so, let me know what it is. The second feature (on the next TEN pages) is a complete fact file of winners since December 1990, the date the BBQ was born. The column headings are for Individual events (I), Pairs events (P) and Team events (T). Plate Competitions include the Jersey "Top Gun" events for highest scorers in the early rounds which took place for two years prior to the Plate Competition being introduced. It is (or SHOULD be) a complete list of success from the International Match in 1991 up to the British Open Pairs in 2003, i.e. up to the close of BBQ No. 49. Later in this issue, you will find that I thought I should give a fairly full list of winners PRIOR to the BBQ starting, followed by a "progress" report of all players who have been in the top 20 of the rankings when each BBQ was issued

The final was eagerly awaited, but John, put in first, missed the first split. He managed to get it back and then settled down magnificently for a superb 18,990 break, beating Kevin's highest break of the day, made against fluory Holl.

Kevin inequinably messed it all up at only 1,400 when he came mode the 50 on the split. The break lock attempt just did not happen and Kevin was stunned, unable to explain what had happened. John made an unrecessory 8,890 reply and Kevin conceded at the end of it.

SUSSEX TITLE No. 3 FOR OUR KATIE

Kevin Tunstall won his first National title and then everyone woke up and it was all a bad dream.

B.B.Q. No. SO PAGE 27 (SUBSEX OPEN)

Yet another major title for Katie, but you'll have to work out how many that is now, 'cause I can't be bothered anymore.

Well actually I will. It is his TWENTY-EIGHTH major singles title, but you have to add SIX pairs titles (including one Mixed Pairs) and at the last count SEVEN team titles (most, if not all, as captain). That is 41, twenty more than the next best. Bernie with 21. [Please note that if Kevin's figures do not add up according to the information given elsewhere in this BBQ, it is because I have since found that he actually won the 1990 Wessex Open].

Many players just cannot produce their best against the Great One, finding it difficult to keep him off the table, possibly as they know full well that, if they don't, they may not get another shot.

Even Tony Walsh, who has a better-than-most record against Katie, could not push him in the final, even after winning the toss. Kevin played out the first leg (bar the last ball), making 17,120 in 17 mins 25 secs. Self-critical Katie thought he was slow as the balls were "taking forever to come down the trough".

But it was easily enough for Tony who pinned his initial 2,000 and, even though Katie missed, was never in contention and conceded as soon as he missed again

A small amount of revenge was registered the very next day when Tony beat Kevin in the 1" log of a Reading Summer league match. Out of interest, Kevin's team still won 3-2, aided by a slight diversion on the way home from Worthing for Pete Farrelly who beat someone called Bernie McCluskey (on his own table???). Unbelievable!

Kevin had, as usual, improved during the tournament, which takes some doing when he starts superbly. A 10,840 break beat off Andy Haines, followed by a 13,930 break to beat off Tony Webster. The only time he was in trouble leading up to the final was in the third round when facing Dino Clark (still keeping his Bournemouth form going). Dino made a solid 14,620 in the first leg to make Katie think, but all he thought about was passing it. He did it comfortably with a 17,220 break.

Even Paul Sainsbury, who had beaten Dennis Atkins and Nigel Senior on the way, could not stop the immovable force that is Kevin Tunstall. Even Steve Mariner, on his own beloved Tarratt tables, could not halt the tide when, chasing Kevin's 15,300 opener, Steve messed it up at only 4,000.

Even Ian Street, new kid on the block who lost in the Oxfordshire Open final, had absolutely no reply to Katie's vast experience in a tough semi-final.

It just gets boring! Nothing against Katse, it just seems that everyone else will have to get better. It COULD lose the No. 1 spot in the rankings..... if he takes about two years sabbatical.

Geoff Pitt had (probably) the most memorable day of his long career. After beating more-than-capable Jane Wood, Tony Martin and Emie Jordan, he then astounded everyone (including himself) to beat a rampant Keith Sheard (on the notorious and dreaded table 10) and then, in the next round, by coming from well behind to beat John Burrows in the nick of time by 490.

In fact, he should have beaten Tony Walsh in the semi-finals but simply could not get to grips with table 5. He was well clear in the 1" leg but allowed Tony in for an attacking 5,000 break which put him 1,940 ahead. Geoff messed up his very first shot in the 2nd and Tony seemed well in command, even though one of his mighty break shots had spun out of the 50 hole and ended up within 3 inches of the red ball spot. Tony continued to fire in the break shots at pace and was home and dry by the time he again spun out the 50 hole and, this time, felled the black pin just as the bar dropped. Geoff had 1,470 on the board and so needed 480 to win with the last few white balls.

The break shot was not to his liking, so experience told him to play the one-up and split shots. He succeeded once but then missed the 2nd one-up to hand it terminally to Tony.

There were two other surprise quarter-finalists. Martin Smith and Kim Wood, both from the local leagues, who came through two sections of the draw that were almost bereft of top-ranked players. Garath Lloyd had been fancied but lost to Smith in the first round whereas Wood had eliminated Harry Barbet in the first and never looked back.

Sheila O'Brien (embarrassingly announced as "Pinner" at the presentations) had an easy passage to the last 16 but then lost to Kim Wood, but gained two other prizes for being the lady that "went the farthest and for the best Sussex ladies break. Pauline Withey took the main prize for best fadies break. 4 100 which had been made in the first round defeat against John Burrows.

Just for a change, Keith Sheard won the highest break award, even though it was vasily short of his Sussex record break set last year of 21,750. This time, a 19,570 was his "meagre" attempt against poor Tony Brown from Kent. He beat stiffer opposition in his other two matches, but with less assurance Mark James (eventual winner of the PLATE) was his 1" round opponent, and Chris Saville was his 3".

Steve Mariner, who beat Sheard in last year's final, made the best Sussex break, 16,500 in the 4th round against Mark Brewster, who had produced a string a big scores up to then and looked well in contention to at least match his achievements in reaching both the 1994 and 1997 finals.

The Jersey contingent of six was very unfortunate, with only their league President Don Cadec winning his first match and, in fact, only two won games in the Plate, with Graham Bisson losing to Size Marines Don did, however, ask to have it recorded that he thought the event was supremely well organised and thanked everyone for their wonderfully liquid hospitality, or words to that effect

Dorset's own ancient relic, Eric Hill, also managed to reach the last 16; as did Witney gent Terry Cook

Mark Turner had two good wins, including one against Geoff Jukes (coming back from 11,380 behind with a 12,960 break), before losing to Walshy by just 190 in a tough and nervy last 16 encounter

Farrelly had somehow rolled back the years to play the table out in the 1" round, only to be eliminated when Burrows did something similar in the 3"

Dennis Atkins, winner of the Oxfordshire a few months ago, went out in the first round to Paul Samshury and then also lost in the first round of the Plate to Paul Phillips. When did THAT last happen?"

A subdued Paul Wing won his first match with a 16,310 break, but lost to Ian Street who made an 11,950 break after starting the 2nd leg 8,560 down

But what about Jim Millward*. He lost in the first to Thomas Ellis-Rees. All three of him played better than Jim.

Unusually, only two players in the draw failed to turn up, so only two from the reserve list actually got a game. Mark James has already started an entry list for next year's event, to be staged on June 6.

And finally, in which other sport would you see Rey Jenkins playing Roy Wood? They met in the Plate here, and the politician (?) came off best, going on to reach the final, even though he is dead!!!
