KENT CLASSIC 6th JULY 2003: PAUL WING BECOMES HAMPSHIRE'S FIRST EVER OPEN WINNER

Hampshire have finally been rewarded for the support they have given to All-England and Open events in recent years by their undoubted No.1 player PAUL WING winning the Kent Classic, to move up FOUR places in the rankings to a career-best No.5.

Some events in recent years would have been very poorly attended if it was not for Hants, but no one has given more than Paul himself. His company has donated cash for the highest break in THIS event, for last year's Grand Prix finals, for next year's International and, most recently, towards the escalating costs of the BBQ, and so this editor will give nothing but praise to the latest player to join the ranks of tournament winners.

Not that these points have any connection with each other, you understand, but perhaps Kevin and Keith should bear this in mind when they win their next event if they don't want the BBQ to take too much mickey. It is obvious that I can be bribed!

This Kent Classic lived up to its name, which incidentally was suggested by this BBQ editor when it was originally planned, way back in 1993. (That year a 50-year-old local insurance man called Mick Nichol somehow made his way through to beat Mark Woods, son of Annie Green, in the final, and where are THEY now?)

The headline used here is not STRICTLY true as Keith SALT won the first Wessex Open, before it became a true Open event. This was a real classic event, if that is not too much of a "condiment", sorry COMPLIMENT.

THE FINAL

When Paul Sainsbury lost the toss in the final, he fully expected to be inserted, as anyone could see from the expression on his face, but Wingy (sorry Mr Wing, sir, that donation really pays off) does not like chasing big breaks and opted to go for it himself.

As he stepped forward for the opening shot, Mr Wing was surprised to find that the evening sun was glaring through a high window, over his cue and on to the balls for the break off. The window could not be covered and so your brave vertigo-suffering BBQ editor manfully stood on a chair for nearly 15 minutes until Dennis Claydon finally told him that the sun had moved off his back. Those who had previously said that he should stay there for a little longer were thanked for their humour.

Anyway, Mr Wing surged on, not knowing who had come to his aid. He had made 15,960 before inexplicably missing the white ball on the break shot. Mr Sainsbury (sorry, it's a disease) wished he had done so much earlier. He could only make 110 and 320 in his two visits, with Mr Wing making another 100 in between.

However, it seemed that the time taken up by these final exchanges would work in Sainsbury's favour. It was a long bar, and the latter now had nearly 18.5 minutes to make less than 16,000 for the title.

But, unfortunately for him, he missed his first split shot and only opened with 640. Everyone thought that it was all over, and when Mr Wing immediately retrieved the break back, IT WAS. He made 4,470 before he gave his opponent consolation of another go, but his 11,140 break was far too late.

PAUL WING'S PROGRESS

Paul could hardly have had a more difficult start to his day. He played Mark Brewster in the third series, making a 10,930 break in the 1st leg. He struggled at the start of the 2nd round match with Alan Farra (Kent) but came back with an 11,720 break at the death. It did not get any easier in the next against Sussex secretary Alan Messor, but another big 2nd round score of 11,850 gave him a place in the last 16.

Virtually playing out the 1st leg with 15,390 gave Ernie Jordan little chance, but it boosted Paul's confidence for his next two big games. He just held on to a 5,000 1st leg lead against the dangerous Irishman Mark James.

and then faced an even more dangerous Englishman Tony Walsh, but only dangerous if he sits on you.

Tony had just been lucky enough to beat Pete Farrelly in the previous round. Farrelly had opened with 8,920 and did not get another shot until Tony had made 4,770 and another 10,700. The quarterfinal was so similar in as much as Paul started with 9,520, and Tony made 4,280 in reply. It then differed dramatically when Walshy had a "kick" at 3,540 and allowed Paul the chance of another 9,820. HOW UNFAIR THIS GAME IS!

AT HOME WITH THE SAINSBURYS

Paul had a good day. A bye to the 2nd round, and then a walkover, so he did not raise a cue in anger until 2.30. But then showed his form was good by making a 15,060 break against Alan Chaloner. He then found himself 16,400 down against the one and only Keith Sheard, but paced his reply immaculately with a 16,600 break, which was ultimately the highest of day.

The quarterfinal against Chris Saville was not so hot, but Paul held on to his 5,000 1st leg lead. The semi-final against Kevin Tunstall should have been videoed so that everyone playing Katie in the future could be shown it to give them confidence. Kevin whipped his first one-up shot and found himself nearly 11,000 down by the end of the 1st leg. Paul touched up when he made 8,000 in the 2nd.

Brother Pete was just as successful, even though it was all in the Plate Competition. It was amazing to see both brothers playing in the two finals at the same time, but Pete was also beaten as he was trying to watch Paul at the same time.

After Pete had only started with 350, big Andy Haines made a lovely 5,920 before Pete came back for another 3,060. Andy finally secured victory with an opening 5,170 in the 2nd leg, but not without a couple of panicky moments which made the Barney Rubble look-alike sweat even more profusely than usual.

But it was a low-scoring event, with only six scores over 8,000, two by Lorin Clough and two by Ray Sturgess.

FIRST ROUND HIGHLIGHT

The biggest clash saw two of Kent's finest players battle it out. Both former finalists in the Under-22 Individual Championship, the Kevin Clark v Curt Driver encounter was played at 10.00 before most of the competitors had even arrived. Kevin, after missing out with his 1st visit, made a 12,960 break to lead by 13,540. Curt reached 13,000 but needed some 200 shots after the bar to win, and felled the black pin.

SECOND ROUND

Kent new-boy Vinny Mitchell will get a lot of confidence from his performances here. He had come from nearly 6,000 behind in the first round to beat Doug Phillips, but his late 5,790 break to beat Rick Dewdney (Sussex) by around 3,000 in the 2nd showed his potential. He was awarded the honour of "Tunbridge Wells Player of the Tournament" for this performance, even though he was well beaten by Ernie Jordan in the next.

Mark James came from 8,700 down to beat Nigel Senior with an 11,530 break, and went on to beat the senior Senior (Mark) in the third round.

Geoff Jukes went out in a tight encounter to Alan Messer, and Pauline Withey made the best ladies' break (5,460) to put out Sussex starlet Glenn Chubb.

THIRD ROUND

Steve Mariner's 15,740 ended Kevin Clark's run, and Tony Walsh's 15,220 put out Pauline Withey. But the best match was (not) Pete Farrelly's 10k and 9k against Dino Clark who had made a 12,000 break in the first round himself.

Perhaps there is life in the old dog yet!
WUFF WUFF!

THE LAST 16

Sue Leach had made remarkable progress to the fourth round but her last ranking event appearance before changing her name to Atkins was against old bully Farrelly.

Steve Mariner failed to chase the 13,730 set by Mark James, Richard Wooton (another Sussex starlet: "Where do they keep getting them from?") was blasted out of the tournament by Walsh's two-leg total of 26,000.

Chris Saville, who had already beaten Barry Holt, ended the hopes of Dennis Claydon.

Here endeth the amazing venture of Greg Dennis. He spent most of the day on the desk, helping Pete Sainsbury, and what a benefit he was. But he also found time to reach the last 16. He ousted Diana Welburn and Richard Harris before failing to register a point against Mark Turner after losing his opening break of 6,000, much to the relief of Mr Turner, no doubt.

QUARTERFINALS

Turner then suffered a similarly "pointless" match against Katie.

SUMMARY

Revitalising the event after a gap of four years has been Pete Sainsbury's aim for a year or so, and many congratulations should be extended to him and his committee. I have it on good authority that next year's programme may contain rather a lot of facts about the history of the Kent Classic.

Finally, can anyone see any difference between today's Chas Jones and the last time we saw him? No, nor me!

BERKS OPEN 17th AUGUST 2003:

MARK JAMES LEAVES LEON BEER A BIT "FLAT" IN HIS FIRST FINAL

MARK JAMES has jumped into the top four of the rankings with a fantastic all-round performance in the Berkshire Open, easily beating debutant finalist Leon Beer for the £100 first prize in Reading.

The Genial Irishman has taken giant strides up the rankings since winning the All-England title in 2001, and must now be regarded as a contender in every tournament he enters. He would never usually be regarded as ruthless, but his play certainly was as he opened the 1st leg of the final with a 12,590 break in 13.5 minutes.

Beer's mentor Kevin Tunstall was not the only observer who expected him to pull it off, but, after reaching 5,000 in comfortable fashion, Leon missed a fairly basic shot off the cushion at a ball between the 30 and 20 holes.

Mark had already secured the title, but still made a 8,930 break before "somebody" announced that the Plate final was over and he could come off and let us all go home. He did as he was told.

MARK'S PROGRESS

He beat Oxford's Billy Howard in the first round with the aid of a 10,290 break, but then faced Bernie McCluskey in the next round. He was 5,390 down on the 1st leg, but won overall by just 1,320. What would any player wish for after beating Bernie? Yes, a match against Katie.

It was a big match for Kevin as, because Paul Sainsbury and Keith Sheard were already out, he would have been in the tremendous position of having more ranking points than the total gained by the two players behind in the ranking list for the first time. I am sure that crossed his mind as he played (?).

But it was Mark who came out on top. When Katie slipped up at 4,770, Mark responded with 10,550 and then made another 8,670 in the 2nd.

Mark would not have expected to face PETE Sainsbury in the semi-final, and would probably not have expected to beat him so narrowly. From only 4,680 ahead after the 1st leg, Mark just held on by 1,750. This performance has finally secured the Sainsbury family TWO places in the top 100 of the ranking list for a while. Pete is now up from 93 to 61.

THE MILD-MANNERED BEER DISHES OUT A BITTER PILL TO SOME STOUT-HEARTED PLAYERS

At 10.00 in the morning, very few in the room, but Leon ditched Keith Sheard with ease.

He then produced two 14,000 scores to beat Tony Willis, and then romped past Dick Dewdney into the last 16, where he met Bill Trinder. Bill conceded in the 2nd leg. Chris Saville had already beaten Brian Dawkins, Paul Sainsbury, Mark Brewster and Geoff Pitt but ran out of steam against Beer.

Stuart Mepham was another new face in the semi-final line-up and led Beer by 7,600 after the 1st leg. Leon fought back to win by just 430, but could not do it again in the final. The day lifted him from 76 to 39 in the rankings, and may persuade the Oxfordshire selectors to give him a place in the team for the County Championships, an event which Kevin Tunstall will miss due to a badly arranged holiday.

THE FIRST ROUND

As well as that fight between Beer and Milko, Paul Sainsbury and Mark Brewster produced the best first round breaks, Mark making a 17,030 against Richard Wooton and Paul making an 11,050 against Andy Burns.

THE SECOND ROUND

Ray Sturgess put out team-mate Steven Sheard, but later fell to Geoff Jukes. John Burrows started the day well with breaks of 11,240 and 14,020 against Jed Long. A repeat of the 2002 All-England Indiv final saw Phil Hawkins make amends with victory over Nigel Senior. Chris Saville was only 350 ahead of Paul Sainsbury after the 1st leg and just held on to win by 590.

The best break of the day came at 1.45 when Mark Brewster, already over 6,000 ahead of Tony Martin, made a magnificent 20,900 break in the 2nd leg.

THE THIRD ROUND

Jenny Parsons set the target for the best Ladies Break with a 4,690 in a very narrow defeat against Bill Trinder. Diana Welburn was making a 4,460 break at exactly the same time, but she beat Chris Newson as consolation. Jane Wood finally got a game, and lost to Stuart Mepham.

The game of the round was John Burrows making 19,440 in response to Dave Alder's 17,900.

Mark Brewster had already made breaks of 17,030 and 20,900 but misguidedly called his opponent Chris Saville "Grandad" and was then made to eat his words as Chris beat him easily.

THE LAST 16

Diana Welburn had been on good form and EQUALLED the best break by a lady but just lost to Phil Hawkins. Dino Clark applied pressure to John Burrows, winning the 1st leg by 5,000, but John eased through by 3,000.

THE QUARTERFINALS

John's struggle continued when his 9,130 opener against Geoff Jukes was dwarfed as the Surrey man made a 6,070 and then another 10,500 to seal victory.

THE PLATE

With Sheardy losing out so early, he was always going to be favourite for the Plate. In fact, he was favourite to face his son in the final, but Steven lost to Dave May in the quarterfinals. Keith was, however, always likely to

make amends in the final against Dave. Even Dave knew that. When Keith made 14,660 in the 1st leg he had totalled 69,160 in his six legs in the Plate. He also had his break to come in the 2nd leg. Amazingly, he pegged it, but Dave only made 4,800 and conceded.

SUMMARY

It was very disappointing that so many players entered this event and then, possibly due to the hot weather, did not turn up. I exclude Dennis and Sue Atkins from this complaint as they were obviously fairly busy on their honeymoon, but they were only two of FOURTEEN. These included some of the top players including Gary Johnson, Mark Turner, Ernie Jordan, Gareth Lloyd, Paul Yeo, Lorin Clough and remarkably Paul Wing, the winner of the Kent Classic. Six players were found to step in but the gaps in the draw led to many tables being left unused at various stages in the tournament, and may have led to some eliminated players not stopping for the Plate as they may have thought the table plan had been badly arranged.

More importantly, it sent FIVE players into round three without playing, some not raising a cue in anger till after 4.00 pm. It also so decimated the Plate that Janet Burns was given walkovers into the last eight. That was not a benefit of doing the admin desk, it was due to all the rest in her section of the Plate going home early.

On a lighter note, has anyone lost a red ball? An EXTRA one was found during the THIRD series on table 5. Where did it come from, nobody knows, and why wasn't it found by Myra and Kady in the second series?

Well done Dave Alder, Janet Burns and Phil Hawkins. Tremendously well organised, shame about all those who stayed at home.

BUCKS OPEN 14th SEPTEMBER 2003: KEVIN SPOILS THE ATKINS' EXTENDED HONEYMOON PERIOD

The young and up-and-coming Kevin Tunstall easily walloped the newly married Dennis Atkins in the Bucks Open final after he had LOST in the final for the last TWO years.

In fact, this was the only tournament open to him that he had not previously won. Shame! He was once heard to promise that he would retire when he had won every event.....so let's hope Cambridgeshire stage an Open next year and the generator again fails if he looks like losing.

(Anyone who was NOT at the Marina when it previously happened should be allowed to guess the outcome... and then there was the occasion when the fire alarm went off at Harwell at a very vital moment. Just joking Katie!)

Dennis, who had missed the Berkshire Open for the ridiculous reason of still being on his honeymoon, somehow found the strength to battle through to the final.

Strangely though, he had a day of "ups and downs" (AND THE NEXT LINE WAS EDITED OUT BECAUSE KIDS READ THIS PUBLICATION).

He started the day by scoring over 26,000 against Nottingham-based former Oxford player Phil Griffin, including a 13,700 break, followed it by struggling through against new Kent starlet Vinny Mitchell, felt a bit nervous in the last 16 when Terry Cook (chasing a deficit of 15,630) messed up at 14,250, and then again struggled to get past old Wycombe stalwart Brian Ray in the last eight.

But he returned to cracking form for the big clash with Mark James in the semi-final, opening the match with a 16,570 break, chivalrously gaining revenge for his new wife who had lost to Mark in the Fourth Round despite making a good 4,100 break.

Meanwhile, our poor little Katie was making a big score in EVERY round; a 13,310 in the first against Merv "The Swerve" Yearwood, a 15,890 in the second against Steve Huntley (from 8,000 down), a dual display of 10,820 and 12,400 in the third against Glenn Chubb (remember the name of this Brighton DJ), a 14k SCORE.

against Charlie Cooper without a recorded break, and then another ball-breaking win over rival Keith Sheard in the semi-final.

Kevin made less than 5,000 with his first visit but Keith failed to take advantage, allowing KT to romp home with another 14,600 to set a target of 19,350. Keith messed up at 11,390. Bye-bye.

THE FINAL

Dennis won the toss and KT did not seem totally at home in the early stages of the match. It was still a shock when the ball whipped out of the 50 hole on the split shot at 4,500. Just over 1,000 points later, another whip out of the 100 caused his initial break to halt at 5,690. But Dennis could only make 250, missing a close straight 50 shot. Katie only made 290 when he was caught out by a shot near the 30, but again Dennis failed to take heart. Both players then had similar trouble with balls whipping out before Katie finally settled into his usual rhythm, and made 8,100 in just over 7 minutes to give him a 14,260 - 510 lead.

Tragically, or possibly due to feeling slightly shattered (?), Dennis left his first one-up short by a millimetre. KT made just 390, as did Dennis, and it was nearly four minutes into the game before KT retrieved the balls for a 4,300 break. It was a big surprise when he "touched up" as he was obviously desperate for ranking points.

The game was conceded soon after.

FIRST ROUND HIGHLIGHTS

Bernie McCluskey set an early target for highest break with a 15,150 break against Cliff Slade.
Dave Alder thought he had done so when he played out the first leg at 10.00 with a 14,650 break against Steve Buckle.

20 minutes later Keith Sheard wiped it out with a 17,130 break in the 2nd leg against Dawn Flattery.

Tony Martin started his wonderful run by beating Gary Johnson, later beating Eric Hill and Paul Sainsbury on his way to the quarterfinals.

Pauline Withey went out despite making a 3,690 break against Ray Hussey.

SECOND ROUND HIGHLIGHTS

Keith Sheard gained revenge on behalf of Pauline by slamming home a 21,000 break (the highest of the day) to beat Ray Hussey. Ray was more sedate in the 2nd leg, making 14,140.

Sue Atkins made a two-leg total of over 10,000 including a 3,660 break against Dave France.

Diana Welburn made a 3,080 break to beat Gordon Riley (and later made another 5,180 in the 2nd round against John Miller).

Nigel Senior made a 16,010 break against poor old Charlie Gildersleve as his mother never told him he should be kind to senior citizens.

Charlie Cooper sent Paul Wing into the Plate with a fine comeback.

Pete Sainsbury avoided the Plate by making a 10,100 break whilst beating Ray Sturgess.

But the clash of the round was expected to be No.6 John Burrows against No.8 Mark Turner, and it almost lived up to the billing. John played it out for 19,250 and Mark had made 9,520 when he slipped up. Even that was not good enough to win the leg as John came back with a 9,590 break.

Terry Isard nearly did the same against Chris Saville. Chasing 17,010, Terry got to within 1,500.....(and Chris went on to beat Burrows in a tight third round clash).

Despite being such a brilliant player, Pete Farrelly just failed to beat Paul Sainsbury. From 8,540 down on the first leg, Fazza was coasting at 5,520 when he slipped up with a *soft one-up*, if you pardon the expression. Lucky old Paul!!!

THIRD ROUND HIGHLIGHTS

Bernie McCluskey applied the pressure with a 13,500 break, but was not quick enough as Keith replied with 14,170.

THE LAST SIXTEEN

Chris Saville beat Gareth Lloyd by just 360 in the toughest match of the round.

THE PLATE

Paul Wing made up for losing in the first round by winning the Plate. But he had to beat County team-mate Chris Newson in the final.

Gary Johnson missed out on bonus ranking points when he failed to return a scorecard for his win over Marilyn Izzard. Let that be a lesson to all.

COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS 28th SEPTEMBER 2003: **OXFORDSHIRE RETAIN THE COUNTY TITLE, even without KATIE**

Despite skipper Kevin Tunstall inexplicably (and inexcusably) booking a holiday (for which he obviously blames his wife), his beloved Oxfordshire retained the County Championship and MAY be struggling to get back into the team next year (?) according to stand-in captain Dennis Atkins.

After losing their first match to a mainly inexperienced Kent side 4-3, they stormed to three consecutive victories against the other first division sides, starting with 5-2 against Surrey and ending with a 4-3 against Hampshire.

The middle match of the three was, however, the most impressive. No team beats Berkshire 6-1, do they? Oxford did though, including ALL the four legs against the break. Unbelievable! Leon Beer beat Paul Sainsbury, Mark Turner beat Keith Lewendon, Keith Sheard narrowly beat Bill Trinder, and, most impressive of all, Gary Johnson beat Bernie McCluskey with 13,870.

Tony Martin and Ray Sturges completed the massive victory, with only Phil Hawkins stopping the whitewash.

Going into the final matches, Oxon had a one point lead over Kent, who were still unbeaten at that point.

The final throw of the dice by Oxon was to bring in that superb super-sub Pete Farrelly for the final game after he had been chomping at the bit all day. While Mark Turner was comprehensively beating Hants danger-man Paul Wing, Farrelly was making a winning debut in the Oxon team with a 14,940 score (in two breaks) against Tony Webster on the adjacent table.

Meanwhile, Kent's first man Vinny Mitchell was losing to Paul Sainsbury to give Oxon a two point lead. It looked slightly better for Kent when they won one of their next two games (through PETE Sainsbury) and Leon Beer lost to Dennis Claydon. But Tony Martin and Keith Sheard put Oxon 4-1 ahead in the next series while Kent lost both their games to go 4-1 down to take them out of contention.

It was to get worse for Kent.... They needed one of the final two games to see off Berkshire for the runners-up spot, but could do nothing about it and lost 6-1. Berkshire's team score was 79,690, the best of the event.

The highest break award went to Tony Walsh who made 17,570 against Chris Newson and then bettered it by scoring 18,690 against Tim Hayes. Walsh also refereed Bernie McCluskey's last game as he made 18,660. There were rumours that Tony may have miscounted by 40. NOT!

Keith Sheard was the only unbeaten player in the division, IF you dis-count that poor super-sub Farrelly who, although topping the averages, cannot claim the usual 15 ranking points as he only played one game.

Surrey were the unlucky team to be relegated from this powerful Division One after losing all four matches.

SUSSEX POWER TO SECOND DIVISION TITLE

The all-powerful Sussex team coasted to the Second Division title and could create havoc in the top flight next year if they retain a similar line-up next year.

The team averaged 8,346 in the tournament, as opposed to Oxon's 7,299 and Berks' 8,148 in the first division. They were not really tested, and three of their team (Jim Millward, Mark James and Nigel Senior) won all their matches and the rest of the side only dropped one game each.

After a 7-0 win against Cambs and a 6-1 win against Bucks, they eased up and only beat Northants 4-3, with Barry Holt making a 14,960 break against Martin Atwill. That narrowly missed out on qualifying for the highest break award as John Burrows had, just a few minutes earlier, made a 17,240.

The only other unbeaten player in the division was Terry Isard.

NATIONAL UNDER-22 CHAMPIONSHIP 28th SEPTEMBER 2003: STEVEN SHEARD REGAINS THE JUNIOR TITLE

Young Mr Sheard has won the National Under-22 title for the second time after losing out to Dominic Kuligowicz last year.

"Dom" failed to turn up to defend his title and the only serious contender for the title came from Chris Reeves from Sussex.

With only five entrants, it was decided that all should play one leg against the other four to eliminate the weakest link, and the final league table would then be used seed the four players for the semi-finals.

Steven started strongly, making a break of 8,600 to beat Lee Radford from Portsmouth. The next match pitted brothers Joseph and Christopher Storch against each other. The younger model (Chris) was obviously delighted to sink the last ball 100 to beat a deflated big brother by 200.

Joe was struggling after he had also lost to Steven in the next, but Chris Reeves, making his debut in the tournament, showed his intentions with a 6,300 score-line against Christopher Storch.

Steven marked out his territory by beating Reeves in the next game, and the league positions seemed set in stone. Reeves recorded two more big scores, 8,900 against Lee and 7,360 against Joseph, which assured him of the No.2 seeded position.

In the semi's, Steven easily overcame the very eager Christopher Storch with a two-leg total of 24,530 (including a break of 7,540), while Chris came from 1,250 behind on the 1st leg to beat Lee by over 5,000. But the final was a one-sided affair once Steven had made a break of 10,610 in the 1st leg.

LADIES COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS 5th OCTOBER 2003: SUSSEX RETAIN THEIR TITLE, after breaking down *en route* and BERKSHIRE ARE BACK WHERE THEY BELONG next year.

It was an odd start to the day for the Sussex Ladies teams, their minibus breaking down somewhere near the M3 (allegedly). Part of the squad, mostly the "B" team, grabbed a lift with the breakdown service so that the day's proceedings could start, even though it was 35 minutes late. The A team arrived even later.

It all ended happily however, with the A team retaining the Ladies title and the B team finishing runners-up in the Second Division.

Sussex were never in any real danger, winning their first three matches 4-1 and then taking a 3-0 lead in their last match before Sue Mariner and Michelle Baden somehow contrived to lose both their last legs.

The major interest fell on which team would finish last and be in danger of relegation [dependent on how the divisions are formulated next year, especially if Surrey are able to field a side]. Kent A went into the last match

This left it all dependent on the match between arguably the biggest names in the ladies' game today. Pauline Withey, with the break, made an impressive 4,700, but she missed out on a 100% record for the day against Jan Taylor who had won only one game up to that point. Jan made 7,150 and left Oxford at the foot of the table, *hoping that Surrey can field a team next year.*

Kim Beeching and Bella Stoner were the only unbeaten players in the division, but Pauline Withey was well clear of the rest in the averages.

IN DIVISION TWO, Berkshire were hot favourites to make a swift return to the top flight but were stunned to lose their first match to Sussex B who were NOT put off by their eventful trip from the South Coast. Jan Bithell won the deciding leg against Eileen Britton.

But, from that point, Berkshire won all five of their remaining games including a retaliation against Sussex B, and finally won the title by SIX clear points, with Sue Rodmond making the best break (5,520) in their 5-0 demolition of Kent B.

Myra Hawkins was almost back to her best, the only player to win all six of her matches.

ALTERNATIVE RULES CHAMPIONSHIP 12th OCTOBER 2003: KATIE WINS THE "FUNNY" RULES COMPETITION

Only Kevin Tunstall and Keith Sheard of the top-ranked players decided to enter, and they were the two left when the final was played at the end of the day, but it was Kevin who came from behind to win this event for the third time since it was changed to the "triangle style" six years ago.

The change of rule was partially instigated to open it up for the players who were not likely to register big breaks under the old "Off-the-Spot" rules. So what happened?

Kevin beat Alan Le Saux, Ron Cox, Tony Webster, Geoff Jukes and Barry Holt on the way to the final.

There were only SIX breaks over 1,000 recorded in the entire event, none of which were made by Katie. Runner-up Keith Sheard made three of them, but the best of the day was 2,100 by "newcomer" Pete Farrelly.

Alan Chaloner won the Plate after beating surprise finalist Jane Carless.
