As it has been a while since the last full explanation of the BBQ ranking system, we have many new subscribers who may not fully grasp the way it works. [Unfortunately there are many OLD subscribers who don't understand it either.] So here is a full explanation to help you out:

INTERNATIONAL MATCHES

Top scorer in the match (on either side)	11.0 RP
Down to the lowest scorer	0.5 RP
Each leg	0.5 RP

COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Player with top average throughout the event	15.0 RP
Down to 15 th best average	1.0 RP
(must play minimum of 2 games to qualify, but players in 2 nd division lose 2 RP)	
Number of matches WON above the number of matches LOST	1.0 RP

TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

Player with top average throughout the event	11.0 RP
Down to 11 th best average	1.0 RP
(must play minimum of 2 games to qualify)	
Number of matches WON above the number of matches LOST	1.0 RP

SCORE BONUSES

IN ALL RANKING EVENTS, INCLUDING PLATE COMPETITIONS, PLAYERS WILL RECEIVE 0.1 RP FOR EVERY 8,000 SCORED IN A LEG, 0.2 FOR 11,000, 0.3 FOR 14,000, 0.4 FOR 17,000, 0.5 FOR 20,000 ETC. ETC.

IN JERSEY EVENTS, THE 0.1 RP STARTS AT 5,000. ALL THRESHOLDS ARE REDUCED BY 3,000.

IN THE ALTERNATIVE RULES, THE 0.1 RP STARTS AT 2,000 and ADDITIONAL 0.1 RP ADDED EVERY 500.

UP-DATING FACTOR

Points gained in any calendar year are erased at the end of the second year. For example, those gained in 2004 will be deleted at the end of 2006. This keeps the system relevant to a maximum of three years' achievements.

LADIES RANKINGS

RP gained by Ladies in OPEN events are included in the Rankings, and are also halved in the Ladies Rankings before being added to those gained in Ladies Only events.

Ladies Internationals, Ladies County Championships and Ladies All-England attract similar RP as above, but score bonuses start at 5,000.

POWERFUL ENGLAND SIDE STEAMROLLER THE JERSEY BOYS

NORMAL SERVICE HAS BEEN RESUMED!

The England Men's team has finally turned the clock back to the good old times when beating Jersey at home was simply a formality.

1998 was the last time they had a comfortable victory (17-5), and for the time being, Jersey will have to live on their golden memories of the last two trips to the mainland when they were "delighted" with an 11-11 draw (in 2000) and totally "delirious" with a 12-10 VICTORY (in 2002).

The England selectors finally got the team right, the tables right, and most of all the team mentality and spirit right to do what simply had to be done this time. Everyone knew what was at stake this year, given the mediocre performances of the last two home-soil International matches.

Many players must have been aware that this was their last chance to perform at this lofty level, but the determination was evident from the start with only new sponsor Paul Wing losing the first leg of the match before England took complete control and zoomed into an 8-1 lead. Granted that some of the victories were less than totally impressive (e.g. Steve Mariner, Mark Turner and Paul Sainsbury failed to reach 3,000 although the latter's score would have been greater if he had not lost a 7,000 break).

The big scorers in the engine room of the side were Tony (call be Anthony) Walsh, Jim Millward, John Burrows, Mark James and obviously Kevin Tunstall. Their scores ranged from 7,350 from Tony (which included a break of 7,250) to a superb 13,370 from John who has been so welcomed back into the England fold that he may well start subscribing to this magazine if hell ever does actually freeze over.

Unfortunately for the two most experienced England players (after KT that is) things did not go according to plan. Bernie McCluskey had a nightmare, scoring only 330 and totally unable to pot two balls in a row. Pete Farrelly was only slightly more fortunate, scoring 2,290, but allowing near namesake Peter Fann far too many chances. In his defence, Farrelly found himself in near identical positions on each of his first three visits to the table. Fann had missed straight 50 shots on each occasion and left two balls covering each other close to the left hand 50. On the third occasion, a pot was successful but the cue ball ran behind the 10-hole. "Que sera, sera" as the song said.

With (almost disgracefully) only bar-snacks at the players' disposal, there was little need for such a long interval before the 2nd legs of each game started, but it did allow plenty of time for gathering thoughts. It was felt that, at 8-3, the result was a foregone conclusion, but it had been agreed that an aggregate point would be awarded in each game meaning that 22 points were still up for grabs.

Match sponsor Paul Wing, although not properly thanked on the evening or on the hastily prepared programme, did manage to get something out of the match, scoring 3,730 for an aggregate win over Nigel Ryall. Steve Mariner narrowly lost the 2nd leg to Graeme Le Monnier but hung on to the aggregate point by his fingertips and England's confirmed lead was now 11-4.

Mark Turner completed a low-scoring 3-0 win over Alan le Blond but Jersey veteran Peter Noel managed to snatch the 2nd leg off Tony Walsh.....14-5.

The powerful line up of Jim Millward (13,350) and John Burrows (8,800, inc a break of 8,460) were next up and England's success was assured at 18-5.

Graham Binson kept Paul Sainsbury in his place and won the aggregate while Steve Ahier beat Mark James but FAILED to win the aggregate bonus.....19-8. The skipper was at his best which goes without saying and it was now 21-8.

While Bernie again inexplicably struggled, totalling only 860 over his two legs against the indestructible Dennis Helleur, Farrelly was on an adjacent table. After a solid start which made him hot favourite for the leg, he allowed Fann to make a comeback. The Jerseyman's inexperience (ranked at 245 before the match) was possibly the cause for him to allow your woeful BBQ editor a late chance, but about 700 were still needed with the last few balls.

Woe, woe and thrice woe, despite a great in-off 200 and a contrived clear up, he still needed the 200 to TIE on aggregate. It suddenly crossed an old-timer's mind that he needed to win the leg AND the aggregate to make his (published?) prediction of a 23-10 result come true.

He missed it...and Fann potted the 100 first time.

After the poor England performances in the last two home matches, this went a long way towards putting the record straight and they will surely be looking towards retaining the trophy in a much more keenly fought battle in Jersey next year.

ENGLAND PLAYER PROFILES by "KATIE SKIPPER"

KEVIN TUNSTALL (CAPT, OXON) Inspirational captain who led the team back to winning ways last year, taking both legs in Jersey. Not so inspirational in the County Championships 2003 because he wasn't there! Jan had booked a holiday with friends [yes he does have some...PF] without checking dates etc. Not a happy Katie, I can tell you. Fortunately, the team didn't miss him and still won the title. Will he get back in the side? [depends who picks it...PF]. England record W 18 L 4

JIM MILLWARD (SUSSEX) Upset Katie in the World Championships by becoming the first to win three times. Ever present in the England side now and a notoriously hard man to beat off the spot. Won both legs last year against Dennis Helleur. England record W 7 L 3

MARK JAMES (SUSSEX) Berkshire Open champion and runner-up in the Grand Prix cementing Mark's position in the team and in the rankings. Another England and Sussex regular who finds the centre of the "D" game naturally. England record W 2 L 0

STEVE MARINER (SUSSEX) Returned to the side last year with a dominant performance. These Sussex players certainly love their Alternative Rules (but not the triangle). Pity Steve's family commitments stop him from playing in more home soil competitions to help him climb back into the top ten. England record W 5 L 2

PAUL WING (HANTS) Since his England debut, he has looked every inch the finished article. Another commanding performance last year defeating Bob King on aggregate. Won his first Open in Kent (not before time) beating Paul Sainsbury in the final. Now travelling up to Wallingford on Mondays. He likes the tables so far, with a 22k, a 23k and two 18k's to boot. England record W 3 L 1

JOHN BURROWS (BUCKS) It was great to see John back last year after so many years absence. A crushing 2-0 win over Peter Noel shows just how much he was missed. I don't want to raise Jersey hopes by letting them know about John's recent operation, but he may "elbow" his opponent out of the way tonight. A recent warm up match shows no ill effects. England record W 11 L 2

BERNIE McCLUSKEY (BERKS) Absolutely thrashed poor Fred Jeanne by 28k last year but has not always performed well in England colours. Bounced back from a short spell in the reserves and was Berkshire's only representative last year. Won his 4th National Pairs title last March, his first with Paul Sainsbury. England record W 8 L 7

PETE FARRELLY (OXON) "Less consistent" performance last year, losing both legs to old pal Harry Barbet (probably felt sorry for him). After many years elsewhere, made his County debut for Oxford in September and has a 100% record after starting on the bench. Has not yet thanked Jan Tunstall for booking that holiday and stopping Katie from playing. [expletive deleted, and further expletives deleted also...PF] England record W 10 L 5

PAUL SAINSBURY (BERKS) Recent England performances probably robbed Paul of a place last year but has been very consistent since then. Pairs winner, runner-up in Kent and still travels miles to play for Reading & Berks. Loyalty a speciality, [and a big expense account...PF]. England record W 8 L 7

MARK TURNER RETURNS TO TOP FORM TO BEAT KATIE WITH A FANTASTIC 20,370 BREAK IN THE 12th OXFORDSHIRE OPEN

Who would have given Mark Turner a chance after Kevin Tunstall had started the Oxfordshire Open final with a break of 20,110? Mark scored what could have been a vital 110 points with the last few balls in the 1st leg and then played out the 2nd with a tremendous and emotionally stirring 20,370 reply to win Kevin's own event by just 390 points overall.

To his credit, Mark is one of the players who does not get overawed when playing his team captain, in fact he is probably inspired by playing him.

As your reporter was busy scoring the Plate Final at the time, the only other thing to say about it is "VERY WELL DONE MARK, YOU DESERVE IT!"

He had not had a totally consistent day. He had beaten Fran Unwin, Pete Phillips (now playing in Kent after moving from Oxford, so he may get into the County team now????) and Stuart Giles fairly comfortably according to the published scores, but he struggled in the second round against Richard Wooton who had just beaten Pauline Withey with the aid of a 10,420 break.

The promising Sussex youngster has recently stood in for Chris Saville in the England practice match against Surrey (and did extremely well, despite his partner) and only lost 11,230 to 9,070 to Mark overall.

Chris, the old git himself, had remembered to turn up this time, and had done really well with a couple of 13,000 breaks before really not getting into his stride in his quarter-final against Mark.

When the semi-final line-ups were known, Mark modestly or tactically suggested that the last four were three of the best players ever and him, and then proceeded to so outplay Keith Sheard (who had earlier scored over 32,000 against Dave Constable including the 2nd best break of the day) that the match was conceded half-way through the 2nd leg.

The other semi-final was even more one-sided, with Kevin playing out the 1st leg for 21,320 before John Burrows conceded when he had only made 2,730 in reply.

OTHER NOTABLE MATCHES

Mark Brewster had already made breaks of 18,540 and 15,430 in the first two rounds before losing the toss against Steve Biggs in round 3. A 21,620 break gave him a "nominal" lead of 21,750 and then, when Steve failed at 4,610, he followed it up with another 16,140.....some stuffing, eh?

Tony Ewen ("Murdoch" to the entire Wallingford League) had made two 13,000 breaks before staging a tremendous comeback from 13,090 down to beat Geoff Pitt by 210 in round 3 (Geoff won the prize for Highest Losing Score here), and followed up with another break of 12,920 to beat Tony Walsh before going out to Mr Sheard in the last eight.

Paul Sainsbury made a fine start to the day but was stunned to lose in round two to Mr Sheard JUNIOR. Steven made over 24,000 as Paul scored only 10% of that.

Dennis Atkins had no idea of what was to come the next day [you will need to see the averages in the Inter-Area Championships at the back of this edition of the BBQ to fully put this statement into context] as he made his way through two good matches before losing out to Stuart Giles.

The fellow Wallingfordian had a great day. Stuart scored breaks of 14,330 and 12,500 to beat Terry Cook in round 2 after the Witney ace had scored over 31,000 himself in round 1.

Tony Martin had plenty of success, ousting Gary Johnson, Colin Robbins and Eric Hill before finding his partner Katie a bit too powerful.

Paul Wing lost in round two to Pete "SUMO" Burton (can't think why he is called that!).

Mark James looked in good trim until the last eight, including a win over Rick Dewdney who had greatly impressed with over 24,000 in round 1, 25,000 in round 2 and 20,000 in round 3 against fringe England candidate Nigel Senior, the latter having averaged over 14,000 in four legs up to that point.

Others who reached the last 16 but have not been mentioned yet were Paul Wood and Leon Beer.

Paul won through two rounds before finding himself with a walkover in round 3 when Brian Dawkins had to make an emergency exit. Leon made two 12,000 breaks but could only make a 5,440 against Sheardy.

LADIES CORNER

Michelle Baden, who still vividly remembers the day she beat Farrelly in Jersey, although Farrelly has forgotten all about it (eh?), beat him in round one, although, in his defence, he was suffering (very badly actually) with a bad backache and virtually gave up by the time the 2nd leg started. The Sussex hierarchy will obviously make more of this, as per usual, but a doctor's certificate may have to be produced. Farrelly's day was complete when he decided, against his better judgement, to play Bob Allsworth in the Plate Comp later.....and lost that one also.

It was a good event for the ladies with Jenny Parsons making a break of 8,410 in round 2 against Tony Webster, and Di Welburn reaching the last 16 with three wins, courtesy of breaks of 3,590 and 4,650.

John Burrows ended Di's run and the BBQ would like to reiterate other people's thoughts that it is great to see him back in such good form. After beating Dave Tooke in round 1, he made four successive big breaks against Pete Sainsbury and Jon Bamsey. WE WOULD LIKE TO BUT WE WILL NOT BECAUSE HE REFUSES TO SUBSCRIBE, THE ONLY CURRENT ENGLAND PLAYER WHO DOES NOT. NOT THAT WE BEAR ANY GRUDGE, YOU UNDERSTAND!

THE PLATE

Gary Johnson's scores in the Plate certainly warranted him winning the event. Just check them out below, culminating in him making a break of 18,050 in the final against Ray Sturgess. This was made AFTER Ray had lost an early break of 1,000, so Gary had the break to come in the 2nd leg.

Ray had made a 14,300 break in the semi-final, Steve Ellis had made three good breaks on his way to the semi-final, and Pauline Withey made a good 6,820 break in round 3 against Andy Haines.

Dennis Claydon made a brave effort to defend his daughter's honour. Paul Lawson beat Kady in the first round and then also defeated "dad" 9,310 - 6,460.

And, finally, I will not be popular if this person does not get a mention in the report, so here it is.....

BERNIE & PAUL RETAIN THEIR DYNAMIC DUO STATUS AND KEITH LOSES IN THE FINAL AGAIN

An eventful 22nd staging of the British Open Pairs resulted in Bernie McCluskey and Paul Sainsbury retaining their title, and Keith Sheard losing his FOURTH final.

Bernie & Paul would confirm that their form over the weekend would not have led everyone to believe them to be favourites, but made it through every round while all other potential champions were falling by the wayside.

There were, by BBQ calculation, seven potential winning combinations in the top half of the draw, but there was only ONE break of over 10,000 before Sainsbury made a break of 10,690 in the semi-final. In contrast, the TEN potential champions in the bottom half produced TEN such breaks.

The Reading pair lost the toss for the 4-leg final and Paul only opened up leg 1 with 1,700 before leaving the one-up short. Ray Sturgess, Keith's FIFTH partner in the 2 years of the event, retrieved the break back after four minutes and then missed it first time. He ploughed on for a while but then played a poor one-up, and a straight shot into the 100 saw him off.

Bernie seemed slightly nervy and clipped the white pin whilst going up the table to a ball between the 20 and 30 holes. So would Keith's first visit make an immediate impact?

Just under ten minutes left when he got the balls back into the break position, but seemed to find plenty of problems including leaving the split shot short of the 100 and spinning out of the 50 on the break at 7,500, but the 9,630 break to the bar gave the first leg to the Oxfordshire pair.

Keith had the break in leg 2 and started well, but rimmed the 100 of his 4th split. He kept the 2,700 but Bernie and Ray failed to make an impact and Paul was back for a break of 1,620. Keith made two good shots at the 100 but it was Bernie who got the break back after 8 minutes and scorched a superb 9,440 break.

It was 1-1, both legs won against the break, but Bernie and Paul were 910 down overall.

Bernie was far more settled now and reached his old perfection. Real perfection. It was his 23rd split shot before he made any sort of error. That is 16,000 worth of perfection. It only just slipped by the 100 hole but he quickly retrieved the situation and went on to 17,480 before allowing Keith to finish off the last few balls.

So Ray needed a target of 16,450 for his first BIG title, but he never looked good and had the white ball whip out the 50 several times on the break shot before failing at only 1,770 when the one-up whipped out. Paul got the break back immediately, made a break of 5,290 and the match was conceded.

THE SEMI-FINALS

Both semi-finals were 3-0 victories, Gary Johnson and Leon Beer failing to produce resistance against the eventual winners, and the Sheard/Sturgess partnership were "surprised" let's say, to face Wallingford stalwarts Sam Goddard and Derek Payne in the other semi-final. With, allegedly, a combined age of 212, Sam (never ranked) and Derek had been a revelation with wins over Myra Hawkins/Penny Burch, Ernie Jordan/John Burrows and Lorin Clough/Ian Street on their way to the semi-final.

But they over scored 6,000 in three legs when they played over 4 legs for the first time.

TOP HALF

By far the toughest task Bernie and Paul faced before the final was against Steve Biggs and another guy whose name I cannot recall. The Biggs-Farrelly partnership have won the event three times themselves and lost in the final on two other occasions. Bernie has won it THREE times and Paul ONCE as well winning it together for the first time last year, so the foursome had a total of TWELVE pairs titles between them.

Biggs and Farrelly are also convinced that they are the ONLY PAIR who have played together in every one of the 22 Open pairs events and this seemed to be the best chance for some years for them to improve on their second-to-none record, but old Fazza missed two golden opportunities to beat the holders into submission.

Bernie only opened with 150 before under-biting his 2nd break shot, later blaming scorer Dave Alder fiddling to turn off his mobile phone [promise it was not the BBQ editor ringing him]. Steve and Paul quickly went on and off and, suddenly, Pete had it all in his grasp. But only 3,000 was his effort and they quickly found themselves nearly 5,500 behind. Pete had just about closed the gap at the start of the 2nd leg when he had one

whip out the 100, touched the pin and then wept as the pin looked like a "weeble wobbling" and then toppled in the opposite direction.

Apart from the two 9,000 scores in this game, and one 7,000 in an earlier round, the eventual winners failed to score 5,000 in any game before the four-leg match format was introduced in the semi-finals.

Other potential winners in this half of the draw fell in round 1: Jersey pairing Graham Bisson and Harry Barbet, Nigel Senior and Richard Wooton, Phil Hawkins and Eric Hill, and Ray Hussey and Terry Isard all went into the Plate, while Keith Lewendon and Paul Yoo tried to join them but went out in round 2 instead.

Instead, the beneficiaries were father and son Northants pair Jim and Matthew Thomson and husband and wife pair Kevin and Bella Stoner. The latter must have thought they were playing in a Mixed pairs event as they had to play Charlie Cooper and Gina Sherratt, John Burch and Dave Neilan (work it out, which one??) and Michelle Baden and Doug Dawson.

BOTTOM HALF

The bottom half seemed stronger but Rick Dewdney and Gareth Lloyd, Bill Trinder and Mark Sawyer, Tony Walsh and Paul Wing, Tony Willis and Jon Bamsey, Geoff Jukes and Dennis Atkins had all disappeared by the end of round three, plus one other notable pairing: Kevin Tunstall and Tony Martin.

They are always the ones to beat, as Mick Lingham and Tony Walsh found last year, and it took Steven Sheard to do it this year. Kevin and Tony were over 11,000 up after the first leg but then had to stand by and watch young Steven make a break of 15,270 to give the multi-champions no chance.

Steven may even be making a move on becoming Dad's 6th partner next year, or perhaps he would rather give himself a better chance of winning it by staying with Pete Phillips, a player who, incidentally, is now apparently playing with Pete Sainsbury (allegedly) in Kent.

The pairs who reached the last eight from this half were Lorin Clough (now living in Solihull, not Perth) and Ian Street (who still lives in Eastbourne, sadly for him), and the old Green/Saville partnership. It is no big "Deal" where Chris lives but Les came all the way from Greece to play **AND HE STAYED ALL WEEKEND**. They ousted Witney's Bamsey and Willis and also finally ended the hopes of young Sheard.

That defeat stopped Steven getting into the top 50 of the rankings for the first time.

THE PLATE

Old codgers Hill and Hawkins somehow talked all their opponents out of their way and won the Plate Competition, beating the might of Ron and Eileen Britton on the way to the final where they played last year's semi-finalists Dewdney and Lloyd.

There had been one controversial moment during the early rounds. Keith MacDonald and Phil Buckle were over 3,000 down after the first leg of their match with Alan Oliver and Ian Moss, but then Keith accidentally went out of turn in the 2nd leg and made a "match-winning" 6,000 break. The only way to settle this was to have the 2nd leg replayed, and the Oxford boys managed to hold on for victory by less than 900 overall.

A very special merit award should have been presented to Glenn Chubb (yes he gets another mention) for enjoying a "drinking" game in the bar one night. He wanted a Baileys and Tabasco. The poor Oriental barmaid obliged, but most drinks are mixed 50-50 aren't they. She added about as much Tabasco as Baileys. It solidified very quickly and Glenn had to "eat" the Tabasco, before realising it was not such a good idea. I do not think he was charged much for downing the contents of the ICE BUCKET, and was still steaming the next morning.
