Jersey's run of home successes in this biennial fixture has now continued for over 20 years. But a 5-1 scoreline does not necessarily tell the full story. Bob Chapple fluffed his first one-up and Bob King took full advantage. Matt Ogier suffered a "kick" when on course to level the match so it was 2-0 before Trevor Gallienne played out the table for exactly 15,000 to get Guernsey back into the game. A scrappy 4th leg was decided when Terry Kenny lost a match-winning 3,650 break with less than a minute left by missing a simple ball between the 20 and the 30 by going too close to the 50. This pivotal moment was followed by Nigel Ryall making two useful breaks to clinch yet another home victory. Graham Bisson was then able to concentrate on getting in some practice for the following Individual Championship, once Jill Barbet had emptied the buffet table, allegedly.

Graham was asked to take first break but, at 5,520, he pegged his attempt to hit a ball near the 10. Although he was back at the table quite quickly, for another 7,670, he knew it was likely to cost him dearly. Trevor calmly and slowly reached 12,180 before "touching up" with a minute to go to clinch his 6th CI Individual Championship. Trevor had qualified for this match by winning his 14th Guernsey title (and 5<sup>th</sup> in a row) against Paul Dyer (runner-up 6 times and 3<sup>rd</sup> in succession). Dyer felt that his 12,530 first leg score was under par and Trevor made 14,270 in reply.

Our Guernsey correspondent says that there may be a "Jimmy White" entrant in the World Championship in Jersey this year.

## KEVIN'S 4<sup>th</sup> SUSSEX OPEN, (so now that is 48 titles he has won)

The one and only Kevin Tunstall (and we are all so truly thankful that there is only the one) won his fourth Sussex Open title on a sultry day at Worthing's Inland Revenue Club, but it must be pointed out that he was not even playing when the fire alarm went off, so widespread rumours that he starts them off remotely if he is (ever) losing are so unfair, and only a figment of the BBQ editor's imagination, even though it is entertaining to consider

So how many titles has Katie now won? This is his THIRTY SECOND major individual title. Add to these FIVE Open pairs titles, TWO Mixed Pairs and ONE "Wolfie Storch", plus EIGHT team titles and it is nearing the half-century. Bernie McCluskey is second in the list with a "paltry" 21!

Unfortunately for all those who stayed behind to watch the final, the match was incredibly one-sided, even after Kevin had broken down at just 650 in the first leg. Team-mate, soul-mate, friend and long time pairs partner Tony Martin [although they have never actually slept together; this statement is subject to confirmation from either partner] provided the opposition, but Tony could not take advantage of Kevin's unexpected lapse and made only 150 before the champion returned for another scintillating 13,810 break. Tony slipped up at 1,300 in reply and conceded defeat after Kevin made a meaningless but title-clinching 3,190.

One amazing statistic of this event was that there were only TWELVE breaks of over 10,000 recorded in the day. Whereas your BBQ reporter is used to over 200 five-figure scores in a day in his new occupation as a reader of electric meters. Players will have to pull their fingers out at the next event!!!

Kevin only lost TWO legs in the 14 he played on the day. He lost the first leg of the first round match with Keith Wilkinson 2,350 – 1,950 but then made a 16,740 score to follow. His next real struggle was against No 2 ranked Paul Sainsbury in the 4<sup>th</sup> round. Both players slugged it out and Paul's 2,390 – 2,210 lead was overturned with a "meagre" but hard fought score of 8,240 in the 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Apart from these minor misdemeanours, Kevin's form was exemplary, given the difficulty of the majority of the tables. A 16k break sent Dorset "chumpion" Eric Hill packing, followed by a workmanlike victory over highly promising Gareth Lloyd in round 3. One of Kevin's old (?) adversaries followed in round 5, the quarterfinals. Pete Farrelly has a very fair record against Kevin over the years, although most victories over the No 1 were in their "youth", such a long, long time ago. Sadly. [Although PF did beat KT in an important Inter-Area match on Kevin's own table a few weeks later.]

Fazza lost the toss (for the 4<sup>th</sup> time in four matches, I'll have you know, although he had built up a big enough lead on his break each time and then held on well, including a 4<sup>th</sup> round win over Richard

Wooton on the table Richard had loaned to the organisers for the day) and quickly realised this was probably the best table in the row of ten. Just what you want against Kevin, eh! One slip up on the split at 6,440 allowed Kevin to the table and he did not get back to the table until it was too late, i.e. after Kevin made breaks of 8,580 and about 9,000. Lucky chugger!

The semi-final line-up included a new name to most, that of Neale Chamberlain (all future organisers of Opens please note the spelling of "NEALE"). He had done well to reach this stage (see later in this report) but had no power left to beat our Katie.

Tony Martin had faced only one top class player on his route to the final. The records show a 740 – 20 1<sup>st</sup> leg win over Mark James in the semi-final, although the reason for this is unclear, but it was followed by a 10k by Tony in the 2<sup>nd</sup>. Other than this, Tony was the first to admit that his draw was amazingly easy. His opponents did not exactly read like a "Who's Who" of the game: Kev Simmons, Sheila O'Brien (both of whom found themselves chasing Tony's 13,000 opening breaks), Chris (slightly slimmer brother of Paul) Wing (who claimed his first ever Ranking Point) and Colin Robbins.

But you can only beat those who you play against, and he did reach the final very easily, amazingly his first National Individual final since the 1991 Wessex Open (when a 17,220 break was not enough to see off a very youthful Pete Farrelly). On the subject of age, Tony claimed the prize for the "Best Senior".

The big surprise of the day was the success of Neale Chamberlain. The little known Kent man raised a few eyebrows when he beat Dino Clark in round four, but nothing compared to the reaction he had when he easily beat Keith Sheard in the quarter-finals. However, Keith has made it back up to No.3 in the rankings.

It is Mark James, though, who is now on that rung of the ladder in the provisional list, a career high. Paul Sainsbury retains his No.2 position despite falling in the last 16.

The closest game of the day saw Ken Wilkinson beat Dick Dewdney in the 2<sup>nd</sup> round by just 20.

Kevin had made the best break of the day (16,670 against poor Eric Hill), and the Ladies' prizes were shared between Michelle Baden (who reached the third round, including victory in a quiet first round match with Nikki Oakley), Bella Stoner (who made a break of 7,160) and Sheila O'Brien (who made a break of 4,900 on her way to beating Steven Sheard in round one).

Pete Sainsbury continued his reputation for performing only in Plate Competitions when he had a string of good scores to beat Barry Holt in the subsidiary event, although it was someone by the name of Keith Sheard who knocked him out of the main tournament.

Possibly the light-hearted highlight of the Plate Competition was a draw between Brian Dawkins and Ray Sturgess at 1,950 each. The flustered organisers decided on a three-minute timed-break penalty shoot-out. Needlessly, as it turned out, as Brian missed the break at the first attempt and Ray only needed to get the break and keep the score.

Shame Su Galleymore failed to turn up to play her ex-, Jim Millward. Instead Chris Tupper stood in for her. Tony Ewen could not make it either, shame after recently knocking Keith Sheard out of the Oxfordshire County singles recently. Also crying off were Harry and Jill Barbet, Jersey's complete entry list, after Harry suffered a foot injury the previous day. *Although whether he cried or not is not known, and whether it was even a foot is debatable, more like 4 inches according to Jill.*

**BERNIE WINS A REAL KENT "CLASSIC" FINAL**

Tournament Organiser Pete Sainsbury correctly called this 8<sup>th</sup> Kent Classic Final a "Real Classic" at the Presentation Ceremony and who could argue.

There had already been 19 breaks of over 10,000 recorded before the final started, compared to only twelve in the entire Sussex Open a month earlier, and that was increased to 21 by the end of the day as firstly Tony Woolvin and then Bernie McCluskey played out their break games in this superb final, sadly watched by less than a dozen people.



*[ A small moment of moan from your BBQ editor here. Now that most Opens are formatted so that the final is scheduled for around 7.30 p.m., wouldn't it be nice to see more players stay behind to support those who battle their way through. Every player enters, hoping they get through and are prepared to stay till the end, so why should it be any different if they are eliminated. OK, early losers may have better things to do, but those who lose in the last 16 onwards are being a little discourteous by not staying to be given their trophies and even prize money at a presentation ceremony, especially if there are sponsors on hand to hand these over ]*

Back to this great final.

Tony Woolvin, in his first major final, surprised Bernie by choosing to take first break and then proceeded to make a fantastic break of 13,620. That may not seem a massive score in 16 mins and 20 secs but the table did not seem too easy to play a speedy game, and Bernie could not have been completely confident as he stepped forward.

He started playing at 2,000 every 2mins 30secs, so seemed to have it within target schedule, but made the fourth 2,000 a little quicker, and the fifth and sixth 2,000's were made in only 2 minutes each.

The 51-year-old Building Services Engineer from Reading looked quite pleased when the bar dropped as he reached 14,000 and there was a slight punch of the air at the end.

This was followed by Pete Sainsbury "opening the closing ceremony" with thanks to David Beckham for missing the penalty which enabled the event to go ahead without mass withdrawals by those who may have preferred to stay away and watch the European Championship Final in Portugal.

He should have thanked Tim Henman for missing out at Wimbledon too, surely.

More to the point, those who helped set things up (including a blast from the past Ken Foster) were thanked for all the hard work which made the tournament such a rip-roaring success. The standard of the tables were amazing, especially as these were TARRATT TABLES, i.e. exactly the same selection as those used in Worthing a month earlier when the scores and breaks were so much lower in general.

The report on the event cannot start with any other match but the first round clash of the giants between Mr Kevin Tunstall in the blue corner and Keith Sheard in the red corner. These colours are chosen on purpose as KT's colour illustrates his exploits at a certain Chinese restaurant when in Worthing (according to Stuart Mephram and a few others, for more info ask Katie) and Milko's colour simply illustrates the look on his face when the bar dropped about 45-50 secs early in the 2<sup>nd</sup> leg. You have to feel sorry for Keith; he was well on target to overhaul Kevin's 18,400 (according to scorer Mark Turner, now to be Christened "MT" or even "Empty" to his family and his real mates, it was a "perfect" run of consecutive breaks, one-ups and split shots). The early bar surely robbed Speedy Sheardy who finished just 600 short, but given a "moral" victory by this BBQ editor, but NO EXTRA RANKING POINTS.

When that draw came out of the bag when it was staged so publicly just outside the Worthing venue, it slightly overshadowed another crack draw which had already been made. It was the one between Mark Brewster and Pete Farrelly. The latter opened his important day (on his way to forcing the selectors to keep him in the England team, HOPEFULLY) with only 7,000 but luckily Mark failed to measure up on an "averagely good" table and allowed Farrelly to take a handy 9,000 lead into the 2<sup>nd</sup> leg. Mark also failed early in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and went down with a whimper.

The eventual champion's march to the final was not without problems.

A two-leg total of around 16k gave Bernie a first round win over Craig Carlson, but Alan Chaloner (easy to forget that Alan now plays for Hampshire) provided a sterner task and won the first leg with a 9,450 break. Bernie had to summon up all his battling qualities to make a 9,830 break in the 2<sup>nd</sup> leg. He again seemed in trouble in the next against Doug Phillips, coming back from over 4,500 behind.

He thought he would be playing one Kevin Tunstall in the next match but Katie had surprisingly fallen to one of his mentors Ernie Jordan in the previous round. Newly hitched Ernie (BBQ foregoes the chance of saying he was up at the crack of dawn this morning) played out a difficult table for 12,750 and then was still shocked to see Kevin lose his initial break of 600.

But Ernie had done his stuff and could not reproduce the form against Bernie. ("Ernie and Bernie" sounds like a new children's TV double act). Bernie then made a 14,600 break to beat Mark James in the semi-finals to barge his way through the loaded top half of the draw which included players ranked at 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, and 7, leaving No.10 Paul Wing the top-ranked man in the bottom half.

Although Paul, who won his first major at this event last year, thrashed Kady Claydon in the 1<sup>st</sup> round, Chris Saville put him out in the second and thus became the highest ranked player himself, but after solid victories over Chris Newson and Dennis Claydon, even HE went out to Ian Street.

Despite his age, Ian comes from Eastbourne and made his journey worthwhile with big breaks in each of his first three games before struggling slightly in the last 16 against back-to-form Ray Sturgess.

Ian has now jumped into the top 30, but he was surprisingly beaten by Portsmouth stalwart Tony Woolvin in the semi-final. Tony's play is uncomplicated but slightly inconsistent, but is always difficult to beat when on form. He had produced a 15k break against Stuart Mephram, and then only beat Richard Wooton by 410, before going on to make another 14,600 break against Pauline Withey. More solid play ousted Farrelly in the quarters.

One more great first round game saw Alan Farra come back from 11,180 down to Alec Hastings, only to lose on the last ball by 110.

There was also a slightly controversial early game when Gary Johnson was a few minutes late arriving at the venue for the match with Pete Phillips (ex Oxford and Eynsham player, now that love has forced a move to Tunbridge Wells). Gary then proceeded to score over 30,000 in two legs.

Pauline won the "Furthest Lady" prize for winning two matches, including a 5,050 break, whilst Diana Welburn was awarded the "Ladies High Break" cheque for her 3,010 break in defeat against Pete Sainsbury.

Continuing on from Neale Chamberlain beating Keith Sheard in Worthing, the Kent man can now justifiably claim to have KS as his "bunny" after beating him AGAIN here, even though it was in the semi-finals of the Plate. Neale had his supporters on the edge of their seats as he came back from over 6000 down and then crazily proceeded to "roll-up" when only 300 ahead after the bar dropped. It gave Keith a bit of a chance but he missed a 200 cut and Neale's rent-a-crowd supporters breathed a very large sigh of relief.

But Neale could not cope with Mark Brewster in the two-leg final as Mark made breaks of 9,000 and 6,000, both in the 2<sup>nd</sup> leg.
