OBITUARY: The BBQ was sad to hear (via a Sussex BB website) of the death, after a long illness, of Surrey stalwart DAVE GRAY, winner over Pauline Withey in the Plate Final at the Oxford Open in 1996. I intended to edit this very moving tribute which was written by Simon Tinto and submitted to the BBQ by Geoff Jukes, but simply could not find anything that could be left out.

It has occasionally been my duty to write an obituary for a great friend. This duty is both sad and happy - sad because of the prematurity of his passing, but happy because it allows me to recall the fun and laughter I shared with him. Many who read this will have similar recollections. It is also a privilege because my life was enriched by Dave's humour and companionship and uplifted by his extraordinary courage. He died on July 4th at the tragically early age of 44 - a victim of the cancer he battled so bravely and for so long.

If you want a definition of the word 'courage' you can look it up in a dictionary and find various synonyms. But if you want to truly understand the meaning of the word, then I suggest you reflect on the way Dave Gray lived the last 14 years of his life. A fine all-round sportsman, his initial exposure to bone cancer came in 1990 when a nasty twinge in his knee first appeared and he lost his left leg above the knee.

With the self-deprecating wit so typical of the man he made light of this appalling disadvantage and would occasionally pepper his conversation with delightful phrases, such as 'In the good old days when I was still a biped . . .', but, above all, he took the 'dis' out of 'disabled' for me. That was the vital point. He never made you feel sorry for him (he would have hated that), but instead encouraged you to laugh with him at some of his misfortunes. For example, Dave's Frenches Club team-mates howl at their memory of the time his artificial leg broke at the knee during a Bar Billiards match. He crumpled on his side, but insisted that Sally Mortimer should carry on playing, although Sal, who's as good a sport as you'll find, refused. As it happens Dave already had the game won, but that didn't prevent Woody from gasping through his mirth; 'What Happened Next?!' His team-mates and opponents helped for the rest of the evening, fetching and carrying for him, but understandably drew the line when he said he wanted to go to the loo! And all evening Dave was laughing just as much as the others at the ridiculousness of it.

Within a few minutes you no longer really noticed his artificial leg and pronounced limp and you soon stopped marvelling at the way he overcame the problems they posed. What you did notice, however, was his impish sense of humour, bright intelligence, fierce determination, the warmth of his companionship and the gentleness of his nature. Dave spoke with disarming candour about his health. I recall the time he first told me that the cancer, which by this time had been on his lungs for about five years, was no longer operable and that it had reached a life-threatening stage. The courage shone out of his eyes as he explained graphically what was going on, sparing me no details and making it absolutely crystal clear that he intended to enjoy himself for whatever time remained. New laser and microwave technology, followed by chemotherapy and surgery, all bravely borne, prolonged his life and he made the most of early retirement.

Sports - many sports - were a great love in Dave's life. His numerous friends at Nutfield CC will testify to his cricketing prowess with both bat and ball, while I will always personally recall a defiant Man-of-the-Match innings of 67 on a blazing afternoon in 1996 for the Captain's XI and a stunning catch at slip when he played his final game in 1999. Dave was also a fine footballer, county class darts player, a skilled fisherman and forced his way into the Surrey Bar Billiards team for many seasons.

But his greatest sporting achievement came on the golf course. You have to remember that this is by far the most difficult game yet devised by mankind, that it requires timing and balance just to be able to hit the ball half-decently and that doing this attached to an artificial leg calls for precisely the stubborn determination so typical of Dave Gray. Nevertheless, he learned to strike the ball long distances and infuriatingly straight most of the time, although a nasty hook would make an occasional appearance. He did need a buggy and it was shortly after he invested in a single-seater that I was partnering Dave and Codge at Sweetwoods Park and as we negotiated the hill to the 17th green Dave built up a bit of speed to get him up the steep slope - too steep, as it turned out, because he came to a halt two-thirds of the way up and man and buggy performed a perfect slow-motion backward flip, landing at my feet. Codge had completely lost it by this time, whereas I was worried in case Dave had injured himself, but his tears of laughter allayed my fears.

The buggy was the only concession he made to his disadvantage. I had the annual task of phoning various golf courses in southern France prior to our trip to the Dordogne and explaining in my effluent French that I had to reserve at least one buggy because one of my friends only had one leg. The surprise this caused was highly amusing until I explained that he also had two artificial legs (one to wear and one spare), which temporarily confused matters even further. Dave always laughed with

undiluted joy at the thought that these wonderfully polite French ladies briefly had harrowing visions of him hopping round the golf course with a bag of clubs on his shoulder.

On one occasion, on the fiendishly difficult course at Planchetorte, which we all agreed was designed by a sadist and played by masochists, the top of Dave's artificial leg had worn his trousers dangerously thin and, sure enough, they split. He made some emergency repairs with the sticking plaster he always kept in his golf-bag, but that didn't stop our Chief Snitch, Pete Forrest, fining him 10 Francs for a dress-code violation, or 'wearing rags on the course' as Pete succinctly put it.

We never played for large amounts of money, but Dave used to win his share of the cash and in 1999 Alva Gaskin and I were witnesses to a defining moment in his golf career. We were in France on the breathtaking course at Coiroux, up in the hills beyond Brive, and Dave was my partner against Alva and Joe Bickett - a riotous and splendidly rude American we'd kidnapped the previous evening. Having lost the first two holes, Dave and I took it in turns to reel off five consecutive wins and go three holes into the lead. On the 7th green he lagged an impossibly difficult, curling, 50-foot putt right up to the hole which felt like heavenly joy to me and a knife between the shoulder-blades to our opponents. Joe said in his deep Virginia drawl; 'Dave, if you're a 27-handicapper I'll kiss your ass in the middle of Main Street and give you an hour to draw a crowd.' We all laughed, but it was the perfect insult and one that Dave enjoyed hugely. For the record, and just in case you should ask, Joe unsurprisingly never did get to kiss Dave's backside, although the bribes on offer were mountainous.

I have written at some length about Dave's golfing achievements because they contain a simple but essential truth that mattered to him enormously and which he explained to me a very carefully over a beer or two in France some years ago. It was that, at last, he'd found an outdoor sport at which he could compete on equal terms with his friends. That it should turn out to be the most difficult of all games somehow seems to capture perfectly Dave's astonishing courage and determination. And he was everybody's favourite playing partner which, in more than just golfing terms, is the best sign of all.

There will be standing room only when we gather to pay our last respects and say farewell to Dave Gray. We will miss him and mourn him for the simple reason that we loved him, but do not be ashamed to shed your tears publicly for Dave and don't forget celebrate a truly extraordinary man. He was absolutely the best friend we could have had and I'll remember everything I ever knew about him.

#### A final message from the BBQ:

# OXFORDSHIRE WIN A RECORD 22 LEGS FOR THEIR 7th COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE IN THE LAST 8 YEARS

The all-conquering Oxfordshire team equalled their own record number of legs by winning their 7th County Championship title in the last eight years, and eighth in all.

BBQ No.27 page 11 in 1997 says "Oxfordshire have won only their 2"d County Championship title, and first since 1983". Since then their only slip up was in 1999 when Kent pipped them.

With the influx of players like Mark Turner from Berkshire a few years ago, Pete Farrelly who made his debut as a reserve last year and now Paul Wing from Hampshire, they seem to have become the supremely powerful team that captain Kevin Tunstall has always dreamed of.

Of these, only Mark dropped a leg this year. And, let's face it, any team that can afford to have Keith Sheard sitting out two of the matches MUST be pretty strong.

It turned out to be an inspired mutual decision as Gary Johnson came in and won both his games, finishing 5<sup>th</sup> in the averages. Kevin (7<sup>th</sup>), Pete (10<sup>th</sup>), Mark (11<sup>th</sup>), Paul (12<sup>th</sup>) and "old codger" Dennis Atkins (15<sup>th</sup>) were all well placed in the averages also.

With two 6-1 wins and two 5-2 wins, the 22 pts they attained equals the record they set in 2001, and the margin of victory of 8 points also equals the record they set in 2002.

The day started with a 6-1 demolition of the previously all-conquering Berkshire team, an incredible result considering the same result in 2003 was considered a bit of a fluke. A 5-2 win over the Sussex team (which included five England and fringe players) was probably even more remarkable. This result stretched Oxford's string of wins over Sussex far beyond the date BBQ archive records began in 1991.

They had virtually secured the title by the time they completed a 6-1 victory over Hampshire, another team awaiting any success at all over Oxfordshire being recorded in the BBQ. That placed them 7 pts ahead of Sussex who also only had one match to play, and 10 ahead of Kent who had two to play.

Kent were, in fact, Oxfordshire's final opponents, so when Gary, Kevin and Pete secured the first three points of the match, the celebrations could have begun. But the professionalism of the team prevented that happening until new steward Colin Williams made the presentations over two hours later.

When the BBQ editor told skipper Tunstall that he had recorded 48 major titles a few months ago, he suggested that Katie should try to win either the Bucks Open or the Berks Open so that HE could be the one to win the all-important leg in the County Championship to give him his 50th title. The prophecy was almost perfect, apart from Katie failing to win one of those Opens, possibly only due to the fact that both were cancelled.

Despite Berkshire getting their act together with three 4-3 victories, Sussex held on for the runners-up spot by beating Hampshire 4-3, coming back from 3-1 down.

The highest break award went to Tony Walsh who made a 17,660 break against Chris Newson, the next best being Barry Radford's 13,990 against Steve Mariner.

Tony Woolvin was the surprising leader in the averages, and he was unlucky to lose one of his four games when a certain Mr Farrelly opened up with 9,820. It did not prevent Tony storming home a 7,130 reply.

### BUCKS WIN BACK THEIR RIGHTFUL PLACE IN DIVISION ONE

From the outset, there seemed only one team likely to win promotion from Division Two. Although there were a few worried Wycombe wannabes (it could have been a different "w", but I would never say that, ed.) when John Burrows was not present by the start of the tournament.

Dawn Jordan stood in, much to the relief of Keith MacDonald, perhaps. Bucks still beat Cambs 4-3, and followed up with 5-2 successes over Surrey and Northants.

Steve Ellis was their star of the day, making the best break (10,040) and finishing 6<sup>th</sup> in the overall averages, two behind John, and moving into the top 50 of the rankings for the first time. John Burrows moves up to 2<sup>nd</sup> in the rankings, and Steve Ellis is now 42<sup>nd</sup>.

Surrey will have to wait another year to get back into the top flight, but narrowly finished as runnersup with 4-3 wins over whipping boys Northants and Cambridge.

Kent's Diana Welburn took part in her first ever major final but came off 2nd best, consoled with the fact that she has moved up to no.4 in the latest ranking list.

In the final, Pauline only started with 600 and pinned her 2<sup>nd</sup> visit, but Di had only made 880 in reply. Pauline made herself favourite by making a 3,920 break and another 1,080 and 2,830 on her next two visits. Di was only making token scores in between and had fallen well over 7,000 down at the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> leg.

Di made a solid 2,590 to open the 2<sup>nd</sup> leg, but then lost over 1,000 on her next chance after leaving one ball in the middle of the table. It was slipping away by the time she pinned her next shot and then only made another 130 after that.

Pauline won the 2<sup>nd</sup> leg by over 1,000 to win the title again comfortably, the first lady to retain the title since Kent's Gay Austin in 1989, apart from Jan Taylor's run of three, 1996-1998.

She also recorded the five highest breaks in the event.

She had been a little fortunate to get through her group, only making it on aggregate after Denise Wills and Michelle Baden had finished level on points with her.

But her powerful breaks of 5,950 and 6,170 in her game with Denise easily saw her qualify by nearly 12,000 aggregate difference.

Diana Welburn made it through more comfortably, only dropping one leg in the 1" against Marilyn Izzard. Former champion Myra Hawkins came closest but made it difficult for herself by losing both legs to Di.

### OXFORDSHIRE MAKE IT A "BI-SEXUAL" DOUBLE in 7 days

The County of Oxfordshire is enjoying a very purple patch with their Ladies side following the men's success just one week earlier, and captain Withey's personal success the same day.

However, Pauline was not at her best in this event, winning just one of her three matches and finishing in 21th position in the averages. She was also a victim of revenge at the hands of Kent's Diana Welburn who had lost to her in the Individual final a week earlier. Di won on this occasion 3,790 – 1,350. But Pauline's team saw her through with three 3-2 victories.

It was only the 4th time Oxford ladies had won the event, but the others were way back in 1982, 1985 and 1987, so few can remember the circumstances.

Sussex A, who missed the chance of two early legs when penalised for arriving late for the 2<sup>nd</sup> successive year, also managed 9 pts but had only recorded two victories.

Berkshire was narrowly relegated by virtue of the same rule. They were level with Kent on six points, but Berks lost all three matches.

Jean Over turned back the clock to finish way above everyone else in the averages, and captured the highest break prize for her 4,970 against Sue Atkins.

After they hadn't fielded a team last year, Surrey A easily earned promotion with three convincing 4-1 wins, with Sheila King making the best break of 4,280.

# ALL-ENGLAND INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIP

SUNDAY 3rd OCT 2004 at the Post Office Club, Reading

WALSHY WINS THE BIGGEST EVENT OF THE YEAR (so far)

Tony Walsh had won the 1995 British Isles Open (although he will remember being VERY lucky in the semi-final) and two other Opens, plus 6 team events and the 1989 Under-22 title but his 11<sup>th</sup> major was won in his home town Reading at his own organisation's Social Club, that is virtually in his own front room.

He has won his first All-England Individual title by beating Surrey's Geoff Jukes in a tight final. Tony won the toss and saw Geoff open with only 1,160. He had not looked too comfortable from the start, seeing one ball whip out of the 100 hole, and then playing the split shot too thick and missing both balls.

In comparison, Tony slotted into top form straight away and made 6,340 before also playing the split shot too thick also. "Some people never learn" was the cry when Geoff amazingly did the same again. However, on this occasion he potted a good 100 before failing to get going again, but at least he had made an important 4,400 break by then.

Tony missed two brief opportunities with Geoff making another 950, and then potting the 100 to go just 270 ahead.

The mark of a great player is shown by whether you take your opportunities, and Tony certainly did this at the start of the 2<sup>nd</sup> leg. He was slow, but virtually perfect, as he amassed a break of 9,900 in about 11.5 minutes and walked away from the table with an almost visible "Ready Brek" glow around his ears. Geoff made a creditable 5,260 break to no avail.

Tony had stormed through his group, only dropping one point in his first three games, and that being only on the last ball by just 260 to Leon Beer. Up to that point, Tony had made breaks of 15,130 (the best of the day), 10,010, 8,890, 9,230 and 8,900. He needed just one leg in his final game against Simon Coleman to be certain of qualifying for the final; he won the first and rested on his ample laurels.

Leon, representing Oxford for the first time, just managed to finish group runner-up for the extra ranking points by virtue of aggregate scores. Ray Hussey started the day well by beating Leon in the first leg but ran out of steam quickly after that.

The random draw, by total coincidence, separated "northern" county representatives from their "southern" counterparts for the first time in living memory, perhaps.

Geoff's "southern" group was much tighter, whichever criteria you use: the even standard or ranking of the players, the initial (just a bit of fun) odds or the eventual points tally. Chris Saville started with a 14k break against Barry Radford but fell away with only one more leg. Mark James was the favourite in the group but lost 3-0 in his first game to Geoff and, despite two good wins over the other players, had to rely on Barry beating Geoff 3-0 in the final game and then beating Chris 3-0 and catching up an enormous aggregate to boot.

Barry made a 13k break to give himself a bit of a chance of qualifying, but Geoff held on by just over 4,000 overall.

This was possibly the most open All-England Championship for years. There was no Kevin, Keith, Bernie, John, Paul (or even George or Ringo for that matter), so it was intriguing to pick a favourite, and almost impossible to pick a winner.

The British Open Pairs Champions in 2003 and again in 2004, Paul Sainsbury and Bernie McCluskey, both remained unbeaten throughout the day as the Caversham WMC team from Reading became Berkshire's 4th winners of the National Team Championships.

And they did not even need the services of anchorman Bernie in the final as they walloped the Swan from Worthing 4-0.

They were also the players who recorded two of only three recorded breaks of over 10,000 throughout the day. Paul's was in the final, Bernie's in an unbelievable first match victory over favourites Chequers, and the only other player to reach five figures during the day was somebody named "Kevin". He had lost the chance of another 100% day when Sainsbury started off with over 9,000 against him.

Katie was understandably disappointed not to be taking his own 50<sup>th</sup> major bar billiards title, but consoled himself to a lesser degree with easily the highest break of the day, 18,200, made against ex-Blobby Keith MacDonald. So it's back to Six Mile Bottom for Keith where he has been put on Haemorrhoid Watch.

The Caversham team were the same side who won the title in 2001, except with Dave Alder taking the place of Bryan Lansdell, who could not stand the strain of Keith Lewendon sitting on him any longer and has moved down to Cornwall, but still reads this publication, so it is nice to be able to give him a mention now and again.

Even probably virtually the same players as when the Sun won it in 1994 and the Stocks in 1988.

Caversham actually won their group by seven points, but the other group was very tight. The Swan had to beat a weak Northants team 5-0 and hope Kent's Rose & Crown lost 3-2 to Portsmouth's British Queen. And so it was....

Apart from those two already mentioned, the only other unbeaten players during the day were Clive Thompson (Surrey) and Pete Phillips, the former Oxford and Eynsham League player who has now moved to Kent, and threatens to move to Sussex soon.
