LADIES OPEN PROBLEMS

A few problems cropped up during this event in Redhill, firstly notified to me by telephone on the day and then e-mailed to me the next day. It showed how unhappy some of the Oxfordshire ladies were at certain aspects of the organisation, and given recent developments, it is only fair that these complaints are aired in the BBQ.

Firstly, here are the main points of their complaint:

In Jenny Abbott's 1st round match, Jean Over potted the 100 to draw, and they
were told to replay both legs on a different table. Jenny lost the replay, but was
refused entry into the Plate.

Enid Wain lost her first round match but was not entered into the Plate in error. When approached over this, Simon applogised and returned her entry fee of £5.

There was no draw sheet displayed so nobody knew who they were playing next or on which table. Arrangements were being made and changed almost immediately.

The Oxon ladies do not wish to travel 80 miles to be treated in this "very unfair" way, and will probably not be entering next year.

In an attempt to be **totally impartial**, I have now obtained comments via Glenn's website from Simon Tinto and others present. Here is a selection of those

JEAN: I asked for a ruling before I chose to go for the 100. If there was any query, they should have raised it before, rather than moaning about it afterwards.

HEATHER: I was there and Jean definitely asked before going for the 100. It did not occur to me that the draw was not on display. I hope nobody stops coming because it is such a good day. (the last comment was reiterated by many others)

NIGEL: Only the Sussex Open declares what to do in the event of a tie, but Jersey

always calls for a replay. All-England need to clarify this.

CAROLINE: Ditto to Heather's comments, but there were errors as Gina's game was switched to three different tables within about 30 seconds. If they had left me out of the Plate, I would have kicked someone in their shins.

STEVE M: Well done Pauline but it's not like Simon to run a disorderly event, but

you always get complaints no matter how hard you try.

JOSIE: Denise and Simon always do a sterling job and mistakes are made by the

best of people. These problems should not put a black mark on this event.

SIMON: There is no rule to cover ties because it has never happened before. Jean had won her 1st match but Jenny had had a bye and she was told before the replay that it would be too late to play in the Plate if she lost, and she had not "lost" her first match anyway, she had drawn it. It was much later in the day that Enid asked about her game and I apologised privately and publicly, insisting on returning her fee. If there had been a wall-chart, my error would have surely been noticed and lessons will be learned.

governed by the AE, so I feel that it is totally up to the organisers of the event how a tie is dealt with, but it should be notified beforehand. In total coincidence, I pointed out to Mary & Brian Daniels recently that this should be so when preparing for the Mermaid Open. A 2- 3- or 5-minute timed break (toss for choice of 1st or 2nd) is better than a replay, in that it does not delay the day's proceedings so much, and brings just about everybody else around that table to watch the shoot-out. The players are often under so much pressure that it does not take too long to resolve. The AE could possibly impose a rule to cover these eventualities, but only IF THE ORGANISERS DO NOT DECLARE OTHERWISE.

However, I do not believe this was the real problem here. It was the fact that the loser felt hard-done-by for not being allowed to play in the Plate, and being told this would be the case prior to her replayed game may have even had a bearing on how she played in that game.

With only 32 entries playing on 6 tables, it should be very simple to arrange a schedule for tables before the day up to and including the quarterfinals. I believe

problems arose when some entrants failed to appear, but that always happens and, in my humble opinion, should NOT lead to switching around the draw as that can look like a "bit of fiddling". Walkovers are not ideal but they are often better than trying to re-jig the whole event. I understand there were tables left unused at times throughout the day anyway which only lengthens the day, and probably shows that not enough plans were made before the day.

I firmly believe the draw should be made available to all and, in this case, would have made it obvious that someone had been left out of the Plate in error.

If assurances are made that these problems are corrected next year, I sincerely hope and believe that the honourable "Ladies of Oxon" will change their minds, or the event will be undeniably irrevocably devalued.

INTERNATIONAL: JERSEY v ENGLAND

At the HOTEL DE NORMANDIE, JERSEY on SATURDAY, 5th FEBRUARY 2005

It may have been the newly-agreed permanent format (i.e. a point per leg and a bonus point for the aggregate), but the match was easily the most exciting England success in recent years, with them fighting back in the final session to capture their 5th International victory on Jersey soil, and their 15th win in the series of 24 matches (with one match tied in 2000 when Jersey retained the trophy as holders).

All other tight finishes since 1997 have been won by Jersey, but it was Steve Mariner who held his nerve better this time to clinch not only his leg, but also the vital aggregate point to start the

celebrations of the visiting side as the clocks approached the bewitching hour.

When the final series of the 2nd legs began, the overall score was 19-18 to England, but it soon became obvious that Bernie McCluskey and Dennis Atkins were likely to maintain their poor England career records with 3-0 defeats. Meanwhile Jim Millward was having no trouble accumulating the best two-leg score of the night (21,640) to leave all eyes locked on to table 4.

Steve did not instil too much confidence when he lost a break of around 3,000 but Fred Jeanne allowed him back in to make a match-clinching 6,000 effort to the utmost relief of his teammates.

New Jersey captain Nick Barnett, who admitted that he thought "they had made a mistake" when he received a call asking him to do the job, lost the toss and Kevin Tunstall opted to have his team take the initial breaks in the "even" games.

It was always likely to be a tense match with recent internal controversies about the selection of **BOTH** teams. The Jersey side had, allegedly, been chosen on rankings/averages of the current season which would appear to have prevented top-rated players like Dennis Helleur, Peter Noel and Graeme Le Monnier from taking part.

England took an early 2-1 lead with Chris Saville and Nigel Senior catching both Mick Eouzan and Harry Barbet below par, but Paul Wing (coincidentally being drawn No.1 for the third successive year) was caught out on a tough table 1 against Brendan Mahon, making a surprise International debut.

England narrowly stayed ahead with low-scoring wins for Graham Bisson and Keith Vibert, but Kevin Tunstall and new star Dave Reeves levelled up the series.

But suddenly Jersey fought back to go 6-5 ahead through Alan Le Blond, Nigel Ryall and James Jeanne. The latter is destined for a long run in future Internationals, even though he only beat luckless Mark Turner 2090 – 2060 to climb the rankings from 212 to 82. Table manager Nigel Ryall was totally in control of his match, making an initial break of 8110. England's only success was through a superb break of 8,890 by Geoff Jukes to allow skipper Barnett to gaze around the room at his team's progress elsewhere.

After the next series, the home contingent was even happier with Bob King, Steve Ahier and Fred Jeanne scoring points and only Jim Millward replying, even though it was with the aid of a tremendous 11,910 break, the best of the match, and it was 9-6 to Jersey.

After a splendid refreshment break which put last year's effort at Gatwick to absolute shame, England came back so strong that they won all three legs AND all three aggregate points to go 12-9 ahead. Paul Wing finally worked out table 1 with a break of 5,160, Chris Saville took maximum advantage of an off-key and hatless Eouzan while Nigel Senior made it a memorable debut with a 7,290 break to totally outplay the vastly more experienced Harry Barbet.

Things got even better for England when they won 6 of the next 8 points available, via 3-0 completions by Kevin Tunstall (inc a 6,530 break) and Dave Reeves, and a fine comeback from Tony Walsh. Only Graham Bisson's 3-0 cheered Jersey up, but it was 18-11

Then England nerves started to jangle as Jersey took 7 of the next 8 points available to get it back to 19-18. Nigel Ryall exploded into a mean and magnificent mood when Pete Farrelly, who

had already announced his retirement from the England set up, fluffed his opening break at just 770 and then watched his International career go irrevocably "down the plughole" as Nigel played out time with an 11,200 break.

Meanwhile, James Jeanne completed his 3-0 win over Mark Turner, Nick Barnett had an 11,400 break to pip Geoff Jukes on aggregate, and Alan Le Blond lost his 2nd leg against Paul Sainsbury but held on to the aggregate point by just 770.

So setting the scene for that final series of games.

The win was celebrated most in Sussex where their five players captured 11 of their 12 points, only Steve Mariner dropping his 1st leg, easily excused after he fought back so well at the death.

Not so impressive were the six Oxfordshire players, with only Kevin Tunstall (3) and Paul Wing (2) making any contribution. Is there talk of Kevin moving to Brighton?

If the match had been played under the original format, England would have won 8-7 although it is accepted that priorities may have been different during the game. If it had been on legs only, the result would have been 15-15, so you would expect that England would have retained the trophy as holders, just as Jersey did in that famous match of the year 2000.

It may also be that Jersey are rueing their agreement to play an extra 4 players a side, as it is fair to say that the England additions probably did better overall than those added to the Jersey side.

One final comment: will rumours of the 2006 match being switched to Brighton come to fruition?

THE OXFORDSHIRE OPEN 2005

At DIDCOT TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB on SATURDAY, 19th FEBRUARY 2005

It may have escaped your notice, but Pete Farrelly had been under a little pressure recently, having expressed his thoughts a little too loudly for some, resigned his committee position, and announced his England career to be over, even <u>before</u> assuring that he would never be chosen again anyway after his 3rd successive poor International performance.

Those readers who do not access the various bar billiards websites on offer may not know the criticism which has been aimed at him, and they will definitely not know the amount of support he has received at all other levels. However, that matter should now be CLOSED.

Lesser mortals could have disappeared without trace (like Ken Foster did a few years ago, as the older readers of the BBQ may remember) but your editor knows Mr Farrelly very well and be assured that this chap is made of stronger stuff!

He was determined not to be involved in taking notes and scores for the purposes of producing this publication until he had been knocked out of this first Open since the revolution. Even though there was a break of nearly four hours between his first and second round games, he relaxed just like anyone else taking part. Although not quite spending as much time at the bar as some of the senior Wallingford players, obviously.

Four hours was, incidentally, nothing compared to Kevin Godfrey's seven hour gap between his first two games.

The scores had to be taken down from the score-sheets during the team event held at the same venue the next day (see *Despatches* in this issue), which allowed the winner of the £250 cheque to convince himself that it had not all been a dream.

If it was, it was a very nice dream. But can Viagra affect you fingers? It seems so, because two of them were still very stiff many days later.

The BBQ will not allow the winner to gloat any further, but can, for a change, benefit from being able to give a first-hand account of the seven games won during the 13-hour event.

ROUND 1: Despite losing an 11,000 break in the 1st leg, a 13,460 effort in the 2nd leg saw off big Merv "the Swerve" Yearwood. ROUND 2: After a very tight 1st leg against Chris Newson, he finally settled into a good rhythm to win the 2nd leg by over 5,000. ROUND 3: The first of two very difficult matches against under-rated opponents. A very good table was used for his match with Paul Caistor but Farrelly only won each leg by 2,000. ROUND 4: A much tougher table with Farrelly winning the 1st leg by 880 and then hanging in better than Stuart Florey to get into the last eight. ROUND 5: Steven Sheard had just smashed 32,000 points past John Burrows (twice Oxford

Open Champion) in the previous round, but found himself requiring to do it once again after Farrelly had scored 16,180 in the 1st leg. When he slipped up at 6,670, he did not get another shot. It is not true that Farrelly has offered to BUY this table and carry it around with him!

The semi-finals did not start until about 9.30; when you are playing at that time of day you are normally the champion, but it was only the last four and it brought together those two great rivals: Kevin Tunstall and Pete Farrelly. Kevin had been running around since the crack of dawn where Pete had been noticeably taking it easy, and this factor may have been an important factor.

Kevin picked a very tricky table, and that was also a major factor. He started the 1st leg with a slow 1,000 or so but the left hand cushion tended to shoot and speed up if the split was played a fraction too thick. Kevin left the white ball touching the left pin from this shot and totally in front of it. He weighed up that he could only play it off the back cushion, and he played it well but failed to score. Farrelly also took plenty of time to work out that the one-up needed to be kept way back from the 50 hole, and managed to take a 1,700 advantage into the 2nd leg with his break to come. He started with a solid effort but was caught out by that cushion again and stepped back expecting the undisputed No.1 to take a grip of the match.

Everyone watching, especially Farrelly, was shocked when Kevin managed to leave the split once again touching the pin in exactly the same position. This time, his shot off the back cushion

knocked down the pin and Farrelly confidently finished the game off.

Somehow, this report has gone so far without even mentioning RICHARD WOOTON, but that is OK because it is obvious that he will get many, many mentions in future editions, probably with many headlines.

Richard Wooton, who admits to being 26 but is surely much, much younger, firstly came to real prominence when he stepped into the England team playing Surrey in the practice match for the International last year when Chris Saville failed to remember the date of the match. Richard partnered Farrelly (in total coincidence) to victory in the Pairs and also played supremely well to win his singles match aswell.

Richard had played superbly all day, starting with a 10,980 break in the 1st round against Jason Cattermole. But his best performance was in the 3rd round against Paul Sainsbury. Paul had simply not missed a shot in his games but found himself on the way home. Paul's breaks up to that point were 15,160 and 19,940 against Mark Brewster, and then made 17,790 against Richard, who held himself together, despite admitting severe nerves in the final few shots, to make 18,860.

Richard then made a score of 12,900 to come from nearly 8,000 down against Tony Woolvin before seeing off Tony Martin in the quarterfinal. He was also over 4,000 down in the last four but made a break of 12,550 in the 2nd, not an easy task against one of your best mates.

So, it is surely safe to say that Richard was clear favourite to win his first title, especially when he realised he was facing old-codger Farrelly, rather than ace Kevin. The two met in the Plate final of the Alternative Rules last year, and Farrelly's comprehensive win then may have been a factor.

Determination and bloody-mindedness was another.

Certainly the main factor was experience. Farrelly has played for 31 years and won the All-England title, three previous Opens (although the last was nearly 5 years ago), plus three British Open Pairs and four team titles over the years, whereas Richard has all that experience ahead of him. Definitely.

Richard, cheered on by 100% of the remaining crowd, understandably seemed nervous at the start and quickly allowed Farrelly to take charge with an 11,000 break, but the difference was only 8,720 after the 1st leg. Farrelly took a quick visit to the bar for a Bacardi & coke where the only non-Sussex players left in the room were busy stock-taking. He returned with the quick calculation that a 4,500 start to the 2nd leg would clinch it.

That was accomplished with no problem but a sudden rush of blood made him think he could really go out in style by playing it out. As he reached 5,000, he had a sudden pang of exhaustion. Well it was a long day for an old 'un! Due to the thoughts of tiredness, the split shot

was immediately played too hard and the 100 popped out and knocked down the pin, giving Richard an unexpected golden chance of making 9,000 in well over 10 minutes.

It was probably still inexperience that caused Richard to fluff both his chances, playing the same thick split shot twice. The oncoming extreme tiredness again took control of the old codger in between. On his third chance, Richard started piling on the score but was always running out of time and was, at the death, still about 1,000 short.

With 114 players in the field, there were always likely to be some early casualties, none more surprising than the simultaneous defeats of Bernie McCluskey to Dennis Claydon and Keith Sheard to Jon Bamsey. The two victors then faced each other, with Claydon battling through, only to lose the next round to Tony Martin.

Mark Turner was another star of the day, making a break of over 18,000 at the start of the day and should have beaten Kevin in the quarterfinal but lost a 17,000 break in the 1st leg before

missing opportunities in the second.

Jim Millward seemed to be on schedule for big ranking and grand prix points after taking advantage of some huge mistakes from Terry Cook and Pete Burton. Terry lost a five-figure break in the 2nd round and Pete held a lead of nearly 9,000 with his break to come in the 4th round before allowing Jim to make a massive comeback.

But Jim came up against an inspired Nigel Senior in the last eight. Nigel had decided to try to eliminate the entire Sussex squad, making the best break of the day (20,450) against Alan Messer, and beating Stuart Mepham before Jim.

The closest game of the day saw Tony Woolvin lose the 1st leg of the match against Mark

James by 10, and then win the 2nd by 30.

Ladies prizes went to Dawn Jordan for "Furthest Lady" on count back, with Michelle Baden taking the highest break prize, despite first round elimination. The size of the break was not recorded.

The Plate Competition was totally dominated by Dave France who beat Tony Webster in the final. There was also a fine run by Sue Atkins who reached the semi-finals. But poor Kady Claydon, beaten by "uncle" Alan Chaloner. Shame on him!

The BBQ will be in big trouble if no mention is made of Glenn Chubb, webmaster extraordinaire, who battled magnificently through a walkover in the first round, only to lose to Stuart Giles in the 2nd.

The editor has finally bowed to continual pressure from others and will, from now on, award an extra 2.0 RP to the winner of the Plate at ranking events and 1.0 RP to the runner-up.

THE BRITISH OPEN PAIRS 2005

At the Queens Hotel, Bournemouth on SATURDAY/SUNDAY, 12th/13th MARCH 2005

Some or all of the following report should give everyone hope when they consider whether to bother to enter (and even try to win) the British Open Pairs in future years.

On one hand you have two players, one of which has been at every one of the previous 22 championships, been in the final with FOUR of his FIVE chosen partners, but NEVER won it despite countless 20,000 breaks, and his partner who will openly admit to having come through a fairly indifferent two-year spell since making his England debut in 2003.

On the other hand, you have two total outsiders without any previous ranking points to their name who fought their way through the obviously weaker part of the draw, and only made one score over 8,000 in 15 legs of bar billiards.

Yet both pairs reached the final of the 23rd British Open Pairs.

The congratulations have to go to Mr Keith Sheard who many would have bet on the fact that he seemed destined never to win the Pairs. He had previously lost four finals with Dave Plumstead, Pete Spencer, Ian Moquet and Ray Sturgess backing him up, but Ray was given another chance after last year's disappointment and he came up trumps, even arguably outplaying Keith in the "big break stakes" when the chips were down in the latter stages.

Keith dug deep on tricky tables 3 and 2 in the early rounds. Firstly against Karen Cross and Sandra Storch, he made a gutsy 2nd leg break after struggling badly in the 1st leg. Jon Bamsey, who had beaten Keith in the Oxfordshire Open a few weeks earlier, gave him and his regular partner Tony Willis a great chance of going through but, again, another hard-fought 2nd leg break brought

the eventual champions back from about 7,000 down.

First thing Sunday morning, Keith had to face his "Nemesis" in two of those previous finals, Steve Biggs and Pete Farrelly. A vital lost toss caused Steve to take first break, but a "thick" break got him out of position and Ray took up vital time with over 3,000. Although Pete played to the bar with a 10,340 break, the perfection of table 8 enabled Keith to make a superb winning effort of 15,210 in the 2nd leg.

Keith only looked like messing up once, but the ball popped out the 20 into the 10 and he was back in prime position. Pete made a fast 2,500 and then hoped no-one noticed when he pulled

the bar again at the end. But they did!

The winners of this match were expected to play multi-champions Kevin Tunstall and Tony Martin in the last eight, but Geoff Jukes had amazingly virtually played out the awkward table 2 with a 14,000 break (watched in awe by partner Dennis Atkins) to give even Kevin too much to do in the 2nd leg.

He could not repeat the feat straight afterwards, and started the quarter-final clash with just 100, missing the white ball off his first shot. And it was Ray who stepped in for a 12,970 break to

take the pressure off Keith for the 2nd leg.

From that point, their opponents scored a total of 4,800 in SIX legs (an average of just 800) as they won the semi-final and final 3-0 with a minimum of effort. Keith Lewendon and Paul Yeo were stunned by breaks of 8,340 and 10,240 by Ray and then an 8,620 clincher from Keith.

Sussex pair Lauren Beales and Dave Hampton provided surprise opposition in the final, but they seemed happy with just reaching the final when Lauren lost his opening break in the 1st leg after they had lost the toss. Dave also fluffed his effort at the start of the 3rd leg when he made only 1,350. By that stage, they were already 2-0 down so, when the Oxford boys made a 3,420 reply, it was time to concede so they could watch the majority of the Plate final.

Sorry, guys, but there seems little else to say about the final, except that it brought the

Sussex players from nowhere up to joint No.81 in the rankings.

It is not attempting to take anything away from the outsiders' achievement of reaching the final, but they did not have to produce a high standard of play in any of their first three matches, beating Kevin Roberts & Zena Witney, Tony Hearne & John Smith and Alan Chaloner & Dave Rowley but they probably found some confidence by beating Nigel Senior and Richard Wooton in round four. It was on that renowned table 2 again, and Nigel and Richard were looking good after beating fancied pair Gary Johnson and Leon Beer in the previous round. Only 100 split the pairs after the first leg and Beales & Hampton turned the screws for a creditable 6,840 – 1,520 2nd leg win.

Their semi-final clash with another surprisingly successful pairing Merv Yearwood and Syl Murphy from High Wycombe turned a corner after they lost the 1st leg. Dave and Lauren then achieved their best three scores of the weekend in the 2nd, 3rd and 4th legs to stun the Sussex ring of

supporters into an absolute frenzy.

The real story of the weekend, apart from the EGM that is, was the sensational match between Kevin Tunstall & Tony Martin and Pete Phillips & Steven Sheard. Many who witnessed the game were totally enthralled. The same teams had met coincidentally at the same third round stage last year, but then Steven successfully chased an 11,030 target with a break of 15,270. This year, Kevin set an imposing 21,300 target (on that superb table 8 again) without missing a split shot (allegedly) and Steven took time to settle into rhythm but apparently quickened after 10 minutes to reach a familiar "Sheard-type" speed and was within sight of Kevin's score at the bar, but unluckily felled the black pin going for a sensational finish.

Will he soon be the best in the family, or even the best in Oxford?

There was, however, a bit of a dearth of high breaks during the early part of the weekend. There were none recorded in the 16 first round games, and only Chris Reeves, Geoff Jukes and Tony Ewen reached five figures in the second round.

Chris, the reigning Under-22 champion, confirmed his emergence with breaks of 12,350 and 11,620 in the first round, and then also doing the bulk of the scoring (allegedly) when he and somebody named Glenn Chubb beat Paul Sainsbury and Bernie McCluskey on table 2 in the third

round. The Berkshire boys were going for their third successive title.

Modesty will not prevent your hard-working editor reporting on his great comeback in the third round. Terry Isard had played out the 1st leg for a steady 13,520 break. Farrelly missed his 2nd split shot and left one in the middle of the table (near the 10 hole). He failed to hit the ball straight up and lost his 1,200 break. It all seemed over, but Ernie Jordan missed off the cushion and Steve Biggs made 2,420 before letting Terry in to try to clinch it. After Terry missed, Farrelly had nothing to lose but to go for it. Perfect timing allowed him to make 11,460 to clinch it by 360.

In his last match before taking up the unenviable position of Tournament Director later that

night, Nigel Senior made a break of 18,970 to oust Jane and Paul Wood.

Rick Dewdney also impressed many with some great games, none more so than in Round 4 when he made a 16,340 break, but he and partner Dave France lost by just 270 in a tight quarterfinal with Keith Lewendon and Paul Yeo.

The prizes were presented by Neil Lewis, Operations Manager of the Queens Hotel, and the date of next year's event was announced as March 11/12th at a cost of £96.50, although in view of some moans about the size of some of the appointed rooms, it may be time to again consider a price differential for those not bothered about too much comfort.
